- 1. PRO-GOVERNMENT BERITA BUANA COMMENTS: "U.S. DEFENSE SECRETARY CASPAR WEINBERGER SAID DURING A STOPOVER IN TOKYO THAT THE SOVIET UNION IS A PARANOID COUNTRY AS EVIDENT FROM THE KAL INCIDENT. THIS REMARK WAS PROBABLY A POLITICAL WARM-UP EFFORT THAT HE FELT HE MUST MAKE BEFORE REACHING BEIJING. ALTHOUGH THE PRC CRITICIZED THE SOVIET UNION (FOR THE KAL INCIDENT), ITS CRITICISM HAS NOT BEEN AS STRONG AS THAT BY AMERICA OR BY WESTERN EUROPE. EVEN SO, IN LIGHT OF THE SILENCE OF OTHER COMMUNIST COUNTRIES ABOUT THE SHOOTING DOWN OF A KOREAN AIRLINER BY SOVIET MILITARY AIRCRAFT. THE PRC'S CRITICISM OF THE SOVIET UNION IS NOTEWORTHY. WHETHER WEINBERGER WILL BE ABLE TO REACH A MEETING OF THE MIND WITH PRC LEADERS REMAINS TO BE SEEN, THOUGH. PRESUMABLY THAT IS A COMMON AIM OF THE TWO SIDES, PARTICULARLY CONSIDERING THAT THE POSSIBILITY FOR A VISIT TO BEIJING BY PRESIDENT REAGAN IS STILL OPEN. IN ANY CASE, OCCURRING AT A TIME WHEN THE SOVIET UNION IS FEELING ITSELF ISOLATED BY THE WEST BECAUSE OF THE KAL TRAGEDY, WEINBERGER'S VISIT TO BEIJING CAN BE REGARDED AS ANOTHER BLOW FOR MOSCOW. "
- 2. IN NATIONALISTIC MEROEKA AND ITS ENGLISH-LANGUAGE SISTER PUBLICATION INDONESIAN OBSERVER, COLUMNIST MANAI SOPHIAAN COMMENTS ON "THE U.S. INVOLVEMENT IN THE LEBANESE WAR." HE CONTENDS: "THE FIGHTING IN LEBANON BETWEEN U.S. FORCES AND GROUPS OF THE LEBANESE COMMUNITY IS NOT A COMMENDABLE THING AND HAS BEEN CRITICISED BY VARIOUS QUARTERS. - 1. FOLLOWING IN PARAS THREE TO SIX IS PRESS GUIDANCE ON THE EXCHANGES OF VISITS BY PREMIER ZHAO AND PRESIDENT REAGAN, ON MILITARY TECHNOLOGY, ON TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER, AND ON MILITARY EXCHANGES. THEY HAVE BEEN CLEARED BY RICH ARMITAGE FOR DEFENSE AND BY PAUL WOLFOWITZ.
- 2. THE FINAL QUESTION AND ANSWER WERE PREPARED AT THE EMBASSY AFTER THE PARTY LEFT BEIJING, AND AFTER THE WEINBERGER PRESS CONFERENCE IN WHICH THE NEED FOR AN EXCHANGE OF LETTERS ON TECH TRANSFER WAS CONFIRMED.
- 3. PRESIDENT'S AND PREMIER'S VISITS.
- Q. WHAT MORE CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT THE VISITS BY PREMIER ZHAO TO THE UNITED STATES AND BY PRESIDENT REAGAN TO
- A. PREMIER ZHAO WILL VISIT THE U.S. IN JANUARY OF 1984. THIS VISIT HAS BEEN UNDER DISCUSSION FOR SOME TIME AND WILL CONTINUE THE DIALOGUE BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES ON A

AND INTERNATIONAL TOPICS. SPECIFIC DATES ARE NOW BEING WORKED OUT.

- PRESIDENT REAGAN HAS ACCEPTED PREMIER ZHAO'S INVITATION TO VISIT CHINA IN APRIL OF 1984. AGAIN, THE SPECIFIC DATES ARE UNDER DISCUSSION.
- PREMIER ZHAO'S VISIT WILL BE THE FIRST SUCH VISIT BY A CHINESE PREMIER TO THE U.S. PRESIDENT REAGAN'S VISIT TO CHINA WILL BE THE FIRST BY A U.S. PRESIDENT SINCE US-PRC RELATIONS WERE NORMALIZED FIVE YEARS AGO. THE LAST PRESIDENT TO VISIT CHINA WHILE IN OFFICE WAS GERALD FORD (IN 1975)
- 4. TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER.
- Q. DID SECRETARY WEINBERGER TALK ABOUT HIGH TECHNOLOGY EXPORTS? WHAT IS THE CHINESE REACTION TO OUR NEW POLICY? A. SECRETARY WEINBERGER EXPLAINED U.S. TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER POLICIES, INCLUDING THE NEW REGULATIONS ON DUAL-USE TECHNOLOGIES WHICH ARE DUE TO BE ANNOUNCED SHORTLY. HE INDICATED THAT THE UNITED STATES IS CONFIDENT THESE POLICIES WILL RESULT IN SIGNIFICANTLY HIGHER TRANSFERS OF HIGH TECHNOLOGY, PRODUCTS" AOD EQUIPMENT BETWEEN U.S. FIRMS AND CHINESE INDUSTRY, AND WOULD HELP SUPPORT CHINA'S

MODERNIZATION GOALS. THE CHINESE SIDE EXPRESSED APPRECIA-TION FOR THE NEW STEPS AND INDICATED THAT CHINA ALSO HOPED THAT TRANSFERS OF TECHNOLOGY AT HIGHER TECHNICAL LEVELS WOULD RESULT.

- 5. MILITARY EXCHANGES.
- WHAT ABOUT EXCHANGES OF VISITS BY MILITARY PERSONNEL?
- A. THERE WAS A THOROUGH DISCUSSION OF A VARIETY OF PRO-POSALS FOR THE EXCHANGE OF VISITS IN 1984 BY MILITARY PERSONNEL IN AREAS SUCH AS TRAINING AND EDUCATION. WE BELIEVE SUCH EXCHANGES WILL DEVELOP FURTHER THE FRIENDSHIP AND (#)

MIGHT BE MADE AVAILABLE IN ORDER TO PERMIT CHINA TO STRENGTHEN ITS DEFENSIVE CAPABILITIES. SUBSTANTIAL PROGRESS HAS BEEN MADE AND WE WILL BE DISCUSSING AND FORMULATING SPECIFIC AREAS FOR COOPERATION AFTER WE RETURN TO WASHINGTON. WE ANTICIPATE THAT THIS WILL LEAD TO EXPAN-DED COOPERATION IN THIS AREA.

REQUIRE THAT THOSE WHO BUY U.S. TECHNOLOGY AND EQUIPMENT UNDER EXPORT LICENSES NOT RE-EXPORT THE ITEMS WITHOUT SPECIFIC PRIOR AUTHORIZATION. THE CHINESE CLEARLY UNDER-STAND THIS REQUIREMENT AND OUR POSITION THAT TECHNOLOGY EXPORTED TO CHINA OR ANY OTHER COUNTRY SHOULD BE CAREFULLY PROTECTED FROM UNAUTHORIZED RETRANSFERS. I BELIEVE CHINA RECOGNIZES THE SECURITY GOALS THESE RESTRICTIONS ARE INTENDED TO ACCOMPLISH. WE HAVE DISCUSSED OUR NEW DUAL-USE EXPORT POLICIES, INCLUDING OUR DESIRE FOR PROTECTION O U.S. HIGH TECHNOLOGIES, WITH THE CHINESE AND HAVE COME TO AN ESSENTIAL AGREEMENT OF VIEWS ON THE MATTER OF RETRANS-FER.
