Dear Mr. *Regan*:

I am writing with regard to the United States Army School of the Americas which is presently located at Fort Benning, Georgia.

As you are no doubt aware, when the School of the Americas was forced to leave Panama last year, Fort Benning was chosen as a temporary home for the school because adequate facilities were available on post and because the local community could support the additional housing needs.

I understand that the Army is presently reviewing potential sites for a permanent location for the School of the Americas. I further understand that approximately 41 sites are being considered in the initial evaluation with a smaller list of sites to be determined in September followed by detailed analysis of the proposed sites, including an environmental study effort.

I want to express my strong support of the Fort Benning location for the School of the Americas. It is my opinion that the Fort Benning site makes good sense because of its location, facilities and community support. The School of the Americas was able to move onto Fort Benning with only minor inconvenience to the existing units. A further move of the school would increase costs associated with travel and transportation which can be avoided by establishing the school permanently at Fort Benning.

I urge that you take the facts I have mentioned into consideration during the initial and final determination on a site for the School of the Americas. The Fort Benning community continues to welcome new units which are vital to national security interests. Fort Benning is the logical answer in the search for a permanent home for the School of the Americas.

Your attention to this matter will be appreciated.
