Principals

USIA has sent you and Tom Griscom a calendar of proposed public appearances by senior Administration officials on the subject of the Summit (attached at Tab I). This calendar brings together suggestions that have been made by the White House and the NSC, the State Department, and USIA itself.

While we are not now in a position to give anything like a blanket go-ahead to this calendar, it does usefully bring together for review and discussion suggestions from a variety of sources. Further, USIA does need an NSC okay on some items here for which arrangements now must begin: e.g., a Kampelman WORDNET on December 2. Any arms control events additional to the ones listed here will need, of course, explicit NSC clearance. I believe that we need to address the list to see what we can approve now and what we cannot, and then inform USIA as soon as possible.

Fritz Ermarth and Steve Steiner concur.

RECOMMENDATION

That you authorize the public diplomacy working group under Marybel Batjer to address the first parts of the list to determine on which specifics USIA can be told to proceed now with planning.
