Dear Mr. Baker:

Our Government is writing to you about the continued aggression against the Republic of Morac-Songhrati-Meads by the Republic of the Philippines, Communist Vietnam, Communist China and Taiwan. These countries have no right to occupy any part of the sacred territory of Morac-Songhrati-Meads.

Our country is one of the oldest in the world, having been formed in the 1860s and originally called the Territory of Captain James George Mead, later the Territory of Franklin M. Meads, then the Kingdom of Humanity and now the Republic of Morac-Songhrati-Meads. Captain James George Mead was British, Franklin M. Meads was American, and the latter's grandson is now the President and Chief of State.

Other countries frequently appear in the news and thus the average citizen learns much about various countries of the world. However, Communist China, Nationalist China, Philippines and Communist Vietnam suppress all news about the Republic of Morac-Songhrati-Meads because it gives rise immediately to questions about those countries' aggression and illegal military occupation of several of our sacred islands — and the U.S. State Department aids this suppression because it does not want to face the problems, for which it has no solution other than burying its head in the sand.

These aggressors were never interested in our territory, territorial shelf, and exclusive 300 mile economic zone until oil was found in our sovereign jurisdiction. These aggressors are nothing but oil thieves — especially since the Government of Morac-Songhrati-Meads has already leased all of its territory and territorial shelf and economic zone to American companies exclusively, two of which are the Flying Tigers Oil Co. Inc. and the Macarthur International Minerals Co. Inc.

Because of the hatred of the American people for vulturous aggressors, it is hoped that you will take all possible action to bring to an end the aforesaid aggression; open diplomatic relations with our country; and allow our Government to establish a military base in the United States.

You may not believe the latter possible — but Russia is making increasing geopolitical progress in the world and will soon be in a position to mount an attack in the Americas. If the occasion was appropriate, the armed forces of the Republic of Morac-Songhrati-Meads could act as proxy troops for the Free World in some place where Communist Russia, Vietnam and their allies are also using proxy troops. This would be possible at a much lower cost than that for American personnel.

Your State Department is too often sympathetic and cooperative with the aggressor nations cited in paragraph one — usually because it is bureaucratically safe to be so. The do-nothing position of your State Department will eventually result in the defeat of the Free World, and you should do everything possible to guard against the gradual sell-out of the American people and interests by the State Department.

For your better understanding and consideration several documents are enclosed. We appreciate the sympathy and support of many of your members and hope that one day it will be unanimous.

The Philippine has no legal or moral right to encroach on our exclusive sovereign territory. While it has often cried out against aggression in the past, it is not above taking advantage of a weaker neighbor. None of the statements of the Philippines can or should be believed, and it is wrongfully and illegally trying to

invoke the Philippine-USA mutual defense treaty to cover Philippine aggression. If this is allowed to happen, a precedent will be set making it utterly impossible for other nations to trust the United States in any matter at any time, or to negotiate mutual defense treaties — for fear that such partner will then engage in aggression and demand that the USA defend the new territory as part of the territory under the mutual defense agreement. This makes a fool of the American people. The Philippines, through its President, admitted that they have no right to be in or occupy any of the islands of Morac-Songhrati-Meads in Southeast Asia. That admission should be enough for any moderately educated member of the U.S. Congress.

You should not be misled by the propaganda of the Philippines about being the ally of the United States. Maybe a allyability but not an ally — except when the feed trough is full and open to the Philippines. An example is the Vietnam war. President Johnson asked the Philippines and its President (Marcos) to join with South Korea, Thailand, Australia, New Zealand and the United States to protect non-communist, South Vietnam. The Philippines and Marcos refused — but as usual they tried to create the appearance that it was a combat ally fully committed but actually only contributing a medical unit and non-combat engineers — while receiving millions in 'combat pay in dollars' from the United States. If you will check with your General Accounting Office, you will find that the lump sum check from the United States Government for many millions of dollars to cover the 'so-called combat differential' for Filipino soldiers which the U.S. undertook to pay even though the Filipino soldiers in Vietnam were non-combat was encashed by a high Philippine Government official and deposited outside the Philippines. The Filipino soldiers involved were never paid that 'overseas or so-called combat differential' provided by the U.S. Government. This is the allyability that you can expect from the Philippines. And now that it is cuddling up to Washington and U.S. Officialdom again — you can expect that she is seeking a big pay-off -- one that is in violation of United States laws and a menace to the American people.

One of the reasons that the Philippines has become more friendly in recent years is because the tremendous number of illegal Filipinos in the United States in the first place and the many Filipino dissidents seeking asylum in the U.S. in the second place. She needs the United States Government to control the Filipino dissidents in the U.S. on the one hand and to tolerate millions of illegal Filipino entrants to relieve the tremendous population pressure in the Philippines in the second place. Smuggling Filipinos into the United States is a better solution to the Philippines' great unemployment and excess population problem. It is a better solution than birth control, especially male sterilization considering developments in India. But this is not all that the Philippines wants, and she will be back in middle 1981 to reap even greater benefits — for the use of one naval and one air force base of the United States in the Philippines.

The continued existence of U.S. military bases in the Philippines should not worry the United States Government and its leaders — for they are very secure and safe from elimination by any Filipino politician. The reason is that there is already a strong and widespread movement in the Philippines to separate approximately ten provinces and a few western islands from the Central Government and declare their independence preparatory for requesting Statehood in the United States. This independent area includes the U.S. Naval, Air Force and Communications Stations or Bases. Thus the United States should not feel that it is vulnerable to Philippines blackmail to force the United States to approve and protect the aggression and territorial aggrandizement of the Philippines outside the territorial boundaries of the Philippines set by the Treaty of Paris of 1898 and subject of the U.S. Philippines Mutual Defense Treaty.

In view thereof, it is respectfully requested that you pass a resolution against the aforesaid aggression and urge the immediate withdrawal of the armed forces of the aggressor nations — and that you demand that your President apply and support such resolution of Congress. If you have any questions about our country, write to our Ambassador to the Philippines, Epifanio Villegas, P. O. Box 1094, Manila.

Marcos restates RP position on Spratley Islands

President Marcos stressed again yesterday that the Philippines was not laying any claim on the Spratley Islands.

The Chief Executive made the statement in the wake of Communist China's charge that the dispatch of Philippine troops to Nansha Island (Spratleys) was an "open violation of China's sovereignty by the Philippine government."

Red China said that the sending of Philippine troops to the island was "absolutely not to be tolerated by the Chinese government and people."

Red China's belligerent posture on the Spratleys underscores the threat to Philippine national security of the presence of Nationalist Chinese troops on Itu Aba, one of the bigger Spratley Islands.

The Philippines had already requested the Taipei government to pull its troops on Itu Aba as their presence there might invite hostile moves by other major powers claiming the islands.

Red China, for instance, considers all possessions of Nationalist China as its own, and thus might attempt to grab the Spratleys just to spite the Taipei government.

The Philippine government had admitted sending troops to Freedomland, which it claims is not part of the Spratleys. Freedomland, which Tomas Cloma claims having discovered and occupied, is some 40 miles away from the Spratleys.

It is only Freedomland which the Philippines is claiming by virtue of Cloma's claim to right of discovery.

In his statement yesterday, President Marcos also pointed out that Freedomland is not part of the Spratleys.

He also reiterated that the Philippine position on the Spratley was that these islands are trust territories, and should not be occupied by any country, including the Philippines, except with the approval of the other allied powers.

There are some jobs in which previous experience can be a serious handicap — kamikaze pilot, for instance — but running a superpower is not one of them. It is therefore not wholly irrelevant to point out that President Brezhnev has been running his country for 15 years now, while President Reagan is just past the 15-week mark.

No American president is ever elected primarily for his views or skills as a statesman, but the American system nevertheless puts the main responsibility for foreign policy firmly on the White House. This tends to make the foreign policy of any new US administration something of a surprise package. The most surprising thing about this particular surprise package, however, is that after 100 days it has still not been unwrapped.

It's true that Ronald Reagan's general convictions about the alleged decline of American power and the need to halt the process through instant and radical action were well known before his election. He came to office, as the Guardian of London rather crudely put it, "with a world-view which tells the Europeans to smarten up their uniforms, the military in El Salvador to stick more left-wing goggles, and the Gulf states to start laying the land mine strips."

This approach causes, and is still causing, considerable concern amongst America's allies and friends in Europe, Latin America and the Middle East, who believe that the problems of their particular regions are much too complicated and sensitive to be solved by such simplistic solutions. But it is much too early to start criticising Reagan's actual foreign policy performance, because he can hardly be said to have a foreign policy yet.

tion this problem is compounded by the fact that the one man who does have real international experience, Secretary of State Alexander Haig, is now severely, perhaps irreversibly crippled by his defeats in Washington's constant bureaucratic bat-

has met some 25 foreign ministers and 20 heads of government, but it's hard to think of any decisions or consequences that resulted from the meetings. A handful of military advisers have been sent to El Salvador. Various junior members of the administration have blurted out embarrassing statements about neutron bombs, the death of detente, and US military bases in the Middle East. But nothing resembling a grand design has emerged.

In late February, for example, President Brezhnev suggested a summit meeting with Reagan, stated that the Soviet Union is willing to renegotiate the SALT II agreement, as Washington demands, and hinted that "we do not object to questions connected with Afghanistan being discussed together with questions of Gulf security". So far these feelers have elicited no visible response whatever from Washington.

Obviously Brezhnev would pursue his own goals in any Soviet-American negotiations, but no solutions at all can be achieved without contacts. Brezhnev knows this, because he has been in charge of the foreign policy of a superpower for 15 years. He has become very good at it, not least because the great power game is one of those fields in which experience helps.

The American political system, on the other hand, tends to produce national leaders who are less skilled, and often less interested, in foreign policy, and then replaces them just as they have gained some experience. Not only that, but it also replicates everybody else in charge of foreign policy-making, down to quite junior levels in the State Department, every time the administration changes.

In President Reagan's administra-

tion, Haig's wounds are mostly self-inflicted. His huge and unconcealed ambition — "Al Haig wants to be President of the World" as one of his aides remarked to me — and his instinct to grab any bureaucra-

ness, although he will probably soldier on in the job.

This leaves nobody in the Reagan administration who can combine a genuine interest in foreign affairs with the necessary experience and power in order to shape a coherent US foreign policy. Without long-

term objectives and clearly defined means of achieving them, foreign policy tends to become a matter of drift punctuated by interludes of panic-stricken crisis management. That is the pattern now emerging in Washington, and it does not inspire confidence for the future.

THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION HAS MET SOME 25 FOREIGN MINISTERS AND 20 HEADS OF GOVERNMENT, BUT IT'S HARD TO THINK OF ANY DECISIONS OR CONSEQUENCES THAT RESULTED FROM THE MEETINGS.

IN LATE FEBRUARY, FOR EXAMPLE, PRESIDENT BREZHNEV SUGGESTED A SUMMIT MEETING WITH REAGAN, STATED THAT THE SOVIET UNION IS WILLING TO RENEGOTIATE THE SALT II AGREEMENT, AS WASHINGTON DEMANDS, AND HINTED THAT "WE DO NOT OBJECT TO QUESTIONS CONNECTED WITH AFGHANISTAN BEING DISCUSSED TOGETHER WITH QUESTIONS OF GULF SECURITY".

OBVIOUSLY BREZHNEV WOULD PURSUE HIS OWN GOALS IN ANY SOVIET-AMERICAN NEGOTIATIONS, BUT NO SOLUTIONS AT ALL CAN BE ACHIEVED WITHOUT CONTACTS. BREZHNEV KNOWS THIS, BECAUSE HE HAS BEEN IN CHARGE OF THE FOREIGN POLICY OF A SUPERPOWER FOR 15 YEARS.

THE AMERICAN POLITICAL SYSTEM, ON THE OTHER HAND, TENDS TO PRODUCE NATIONAL LEADERS WHO ARE LESS SKILLED, AND OFTEN LESS INTERESTED, IN FOREIGN POLICY, AND THEN REPLACES THEM JUST AS THEY HAVE GAINED SOME EXPERIENCE.

IN PRESIDENT REAGAN'S ADMINISTRATION, HAIG'S WOUNDS ARE MOSTLY SELF-INFLICTED. HIS HUGE AND UNCONCEALED AMBITION — "AL HAIG WANTS TO BE PRESIDENT OF THE WORLD" AS ONE OF HIS AIDES REMARKED TO ME — AND HIS INSTINCT TO GRAB ANY BUREAUCRATIC

territory that is not nailed down have united very powerful forces in the Reagan administration against him. The rebuffs and open rebukes he has consequently suffered have gravely undermined his effective-
