The preparations for the Versailles and NATO Summits are now underway and proceeding along separate tracks in the bureaucracy We (along with Chuck Tyson) are coordinating closely to ensure that the developments in these two areas are brought together at this level. We sent you recently a lengthy memo on procedural matters relating to both the Versailles and NATO Summits. This memo treats the substantive interrelationship of the two Summits.

The memos at Tab I lay out a number of questions concerning this interrelationship and ask Secretaries Haig and Regan, along with Secretary Weinberger, to coordinate and produce a joint analysis of these issues. (McFarlane recommended that the Haig memo request coordination with Weinberger.) The memo asks for a paper that might be used for an NSC discussion of our overall strategy toward the Versailles and NATO Summits. The purpose of the paper is to force some hard thinking about what defines success in the case of the two Summits and what flexibility we may have between various foreign policy issues (e.g. defense and economic) and between foreign and domestic policy issues to achieve our objectives. We would envisage addressing the results of this exercise during a Senior White House Group meeting on or about April 2.

RECOMMENDATION: That you sign the memos at Tab I to Haig and Regan.

The Versailles and NATO Summits confront us with a four-fold challenge:

REGARDING: Versailles Summit

I have received three drafts of the energy paper for the Versailles Summit (latest attached). I commented on both earlier versions, and it is apparent that no note was taken of my comments, nor those of others who saw it from OMB or CEA.

My comments related primarily to the general autarchist tone of much of the writing, an overly great tendency to support diplomatic rather than market solutions, and a number of specific items which appear to be overly interventionist.

In particular, you might note:

- Page one, paragraph two "Government action" where "economic concerns are threatened."
- Page two, point I and II and page three, point (iii) -0 "Marginal economic costs" for electric pricing is a tricky issue we may hesitate to commit on here. Also, do we need yet another nuclear study.
- Page four, point (v) This still looks like greater subsidies for third world lending.
- Page four, point III (ii) Some would dispute the analysis of 1979. Loss of Iranian production had large and profound long-range consequences.
- Page five, same point as above Implication that "high 0 governmental level" meetings will solve energy situations.
- Page five, point IV, first "--" and third "--" Sounds like we should invest and develop regardless of price.
- Page six, eighth "--" World Bank changes again.
