I. Introduction

A. The Nature of U.S. National Security Strategy

- o Is based on clear understanding of U.S. values and worldwide interests.
- o Has been consistent in post-war period; core interests and objectives have changed little since World War II (and will change only slowly in future).
- o Seeks to relate ends (national security objectives) to means (three elements of power -- economic, diplomatic, military) applied in an integrated manner, both globally and regionally.

B. The Challenges for 1990's

- o Soviet Union is the enduring military threat, but showing to be one-dimensional superpower (military).
- o Relative economic power shifting: U.S. down, Japan and NIC up, Western Europe up (implies changing capabilities to bear burdens of Western security arrangements of 1990's); massive debt problems persist in developing world.
- o Continuing diffusion of military technology and military capabilities in many regions -- moving to multipolar world, particularly within regions.
- o Changing conflict environment -- greatly increased importance of space; high tech and long range conventional weapons.

C. Questions that must be addressed

- o Will the ends of U.S. National Security Strategy change significantly in future? What are our national interests and security objectives for the 1990's? (role of U.S. in 1990's)
- o Will the means to further U.S. interests change in the future? (not if we rebuild consensus on U.S. role)
- o How should we employ means at hand?

SUBJECT: Request to Sign Copy of National Security Strategy of United States, "Little Blue Book," to Chairman of Multinational Corporation

This past January you approved while in draft form a second annual report to Congress on U.S National Security Strategy (Tab B). Now, a commercial firm, Pergamon-Brassey's, which is an American subsidiary of Maxwell Communications of London, is marketing a commercial reprint (Tab A) in an effort to increase public use of the report and awareness of our strategy. This effort should be particularly helpful in the educational field where Pergamon-Brassey's marketing is particularly effective.

The Chairman of Maxwell Communications is Mr. Robert Maxwell, whom you met previously at a luncheon arranged by Charles Wick. Mr. Maxwell was highly decorated during World War II and later served as a Member of Parliament before building Maxwell Communications into one of the world's leading firms in publishing defense, scientific, and technical information. The head of Pergamon-Brassey's, Frank Margiotta, and the Chairman of the Board, former Senator John Tower, have asked that you sign the "Little Blue Book" at Tab A to Mr. Maxwell with a note indicating appreciation for his company's help in spreading an understanding of U.S. National Security Strategy.



Dear General Powell:

Enclosed are five copies of our publication of President Reagan's National Security Strategy of the United States. I will tell you more about that book and other plans to assist the White House, but first, some personal business. My daughter Maggie tells me that the College of William & Mary is very excited to have you as their graduation speaker. My family, too, looks forward to hearing your words, since we will celebrate Maggie's graduation.

As you may remember, your son Mike was instrumental in convincing Maggie of the merits of attending William & Mary. He would be proud of the way things turned out; Maggie was chosen for many of the same leadership positions that Mike occupied and has gained nice recognition from the administration and honor societies. We hope that Mike will be at graduation and that he will get in touch with Maggie. She lives at 102 Chi Omega, Sorority Court. Her phone number is (804) 253-7782. She and some of Mike's Burke Centre friends tried several times to visit him at Walter Reed but he was not able to accept visitors. Finally, when they got their act together again, he had been released. We were distressed at his serious injuries, but hope to see him in Williamsburg. Perhaps he could join us for a meal during that weekend.

On a professional note, we hope that our publication of the President's message is useful. We have carried it to an academic conference, have mailed a flier, and managed at the last minute to get it into our new catalog (enclosed). The "Little Blue Book" is being carried in a few Washington bookstores; Kramers ordered 100 copies and Trover's on Capitol Hill and the Pentagon are stocking it. I normally send each Military Dean at the academies and the PMEs a copy of each of our books for faculty review. We have just sent two copies of the "Little Blue Book" to them for possible Fall course adoption. General Paul Gorman (a member of our Board of Directors) has been mentioning it to selected groups of Army planners who have not been able to find copies. I think we may serve a very useful purpose with this commercial publication.



A recent letter to you from Frank Marqiotta (Tab II) forwarded several copies of Pergamon-Brassey's reprint of the 1988 National Security Strategy Report (Tab A). Frank also requested that you arrange for the President to personally sign a copy of this "Little Blue Book" to Mr. Robert Maxwell, the Chairman of the parent multinational corporation, Maxwell Communications (London).

Mr. Maxwell is a colorful figure, serving as head of one of the ten mega-corporations in the world of communications. He is the largest publisher of scientific and technical literature in the world through such subsidiaries as Brassey's Defense Publishers (London) and Pergamon-Brassy's International Defense Publishers (U.S.). He recently acquired Armed Forces Journal, International installing John Tower as chairman of its board. Mr. Maxwell is also a former soldier, commissioned in the field during the Battle of Normandy and subsequently awarded the Military Cross by Montgomery, and a former member of Parliament. He has met the President on at least one previous occasion at a luncheon arranged by Charles Wick which brought together various international opinion and communications leaders.

Even though Mr. Maxwell is far removed from the "Little Blue Book," the attempt by his stateside subsidiary to market it commercially is helpful from our perspective. It can only increase the availability and use of the document, and thus contribute to public understanding and consensus building. Whether or not it will be a profitable venture for Pergamon-Brassey's is yet to be seen. But, we should encourage the effort and forward a copy of the reprint for the President to sign and forward to Mr. Maxwell.



Writer-expert on Holocaust Des Pres dies

HAMILTON, N.Y. (UPI) — Terrence Des Pres, an award-winning author whose haunting interviews with concentration camp survivors brought him national acclaim, died of undetermined cause Monday at his home in upstate New York. He was 47.

"His loss to the world of American letters will be immense," said Charles Trout, provost and dean of faculty at Colgate University, where Des Pres was a professor of English.

A noted reviewer, essayist and college lecturer, Des Pres was best known for his book, "The Survivor: An Anatomy of Life in the Death Camps," a collection of interviews with Holocaust survivors published in 1976.

President Jimmy Carter appointed Des Pres to the United States Holocaust Memorial Council in 1980 in recognition of his work.




