

S.J.Res. 365 reaffirms the support of the United States for the struggle of the Afghan people and welcomes the delegation of the Islamic Unity of Afghan Mujahideen led by Spokesman Burhanuddin Rabbani on the occasion of his first official visit to the United States.

Spokesman Burhanuddin Rabbani, with whom you met during the week of June 15, 1986, and his delegation, have already departed from the United States.

I met this morning with leaders of the Afghan resistance Alliance: Professor Burhanuddin Rabbani, who is the current spokesman of the Alliance, and his colleagues. They speak for the many citizens of Afghanistan who are battling Soviet forces in the name of national liberation.

My message to the resistance delegation was simple. In your struggle to regain your nation's independence, the American people stand with you. This policy has broad and deep bi-partisan support. It is an unshakeable commitment. Your goal is our goal: the freedom of Afghanistan. We will not let you down.

Like the Afghan people, we hope for a negotiated end to this war. Year after year, U.N. resolutions have called for a total and rapid withdrawal of Soviet troops, and for self-determination for the Afghan people.
