

- 1. Thu-Nga Tran, 16, a refugee from Vietnamese Communism has won the first annual "Why America is Still the Land of Opportunity" oratorical competition. The contest, sponsored by the Colorado Republican Party was a demonstration for possible national implementation.
- Thu-Nga arrived in the United States in 1981 unable to speak English. On Saturday, July 14, 1984 she was the clear winner over seven other regional contest winners.
- 3. Thu-Nga's eight minute speech to the full Colorado State Convention was a moving, dramatic experience which had delegates alternately laughing and crying. Part of Thu-Nga's effectiveness results from her history. One of three children smuggled out of Saigon by her parents, Thu-Nga joined about 70 people on a 16 foot escape boat. After enduring many privations, she emerged to begin forging a life in this country-life which, up to this point, stands as a classic example of self-help and the seizing of opportunity.
- 4. Against the tableau of negativism the speakers at the Democratic National Convention tried to create, Thu Nga's speech is an eloquent rebuttal to those who say the disadvantaged are being denied opportunity.
- 5. Five prominent citizens judged the contest, none was selected because of political beliefs.
- 6. Colorado Republican women have raised the money to send Thu-Nga to the Republican Convention as a page. Her foster mother will accompany her.


