





SUBJECT: Letter to Chairman of Pan Am

Counsel's office has reviewed the above-referenced letter to C. Edward Acker, Chairman, Pan American Corporation, and recommends that the reference to the ALERT program be deleted. This will avoid any inference that the President is endorsing the security capabilities of the program. Such an endorsement could be embarrassing if the system fails or Pan Am uses the endorsement for commercial advantage.

We believe the substance of the letter -- commending Pan Am for its efforts in protecting civil aviation from terrorism -- can be conveyed without the specific reference to the ALERT program. Therefore, we suggest the third paragraph be amended to read as follows (additions underscored, deletions bracketed):

Your support and that of the other members of the civil aviation industry is a key to success in this campaign. [as are your own efforts like the ALERT program.] I applaud [this initiative] your efforts.

We have consulted with Bob Pearson, Deputy Executive Secretary and Deputy General Counsel of the National Security Council, who has no objection to the above recommendation.



