MR. PRESIDENT AND DEAR FRIEND: ON THE EVE OF THE SUMMIT
CONFERENCE OF THE CHIEFS OF STATE AND HEADS OF GOVERNMENT
OF THE SEVEN MAJOR WESTERN INDUSTRIAL POWERS, IT IS MY DUTY
AND PLEASURE TO CALL YOUR ATTENTION AGAIN TO THE
DIFFICULTIES THAT THE AFRICAN CONTINENT IS EXPERIENCING.

I GREATLY APPRECIATE YOUR THOUGHTFULNESS IN WRITING TO ME
ABOUT AFRICA'S ECONOMIC AND SECURITY CONCERNS PRIOR TO MY
ATTENDANCE AT THE VENICE ECONOMIC SUMMIT. AS YOU KNOW, THE
SEARCH FOR SOLUTIONS TO THE PROBLEMS WHICH AFRICA FACES HAS
BEEN AND WILL CONTINUE TO BE A HIGH PRIORITY OF MY
ADMINISTRATION.

INDEED, AS YOU KNOW, FOR MORE THAN A DECADE AFRICA HAS BEEN
CONFRONTED WITH CONFLICTS OF ALL KINDS THAT MOBILIZE ITS
SCARCE RESOURCES AND DISSIPATE ITS ENERGIES.

AT THE SUMMIT MY COLLEAGUES AND I DEVOTED A GREAT DEAL OF
TIME AND ATTENTION TO THE CRUCIAL ECONOMIC ISSUES WHICH YOU
RAISED IN YOUR MESSAGE. WE DETERMINED THAT THE COUNTRIES
WHICH WE REPRESENT SHOULD MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO ACHIEVE
STRONGER, SUSTAINED GLOBAL GROWTH. IT IS JUST SUCH GROWTH
IN THE WORLD ECONOMY WHICH OFFERS THE GREATEST HOPE FOR
AFRICA'S ECONOMIC RECOVERY.

THESE CONFLICTS, FUELED BY POWERS THAT WISH TO IMPOSE THEIR
IDEOLOGY ON OUR COUNTRIES, WHICH HAVE CHOSEN THE WAY OF
LIBERALISM, SERIOUSLY ENCHUMBER THE DEVELOPMENT, PROGRESS,

AND HAPPINESS TO WHICH OUR HARD-WORKING PEOPLE ASPIRE.

WE ALSO DISCUSSED THE HEAVY ECONOMIC BURDENS WHICH FOREIGN
DEBT IMPOSES ON MANY DEVELOPING COUNTRIES, PARTICULARLY
THOSE WHOSE ECONOMIES ARE BASED ON THE EXPORT OF RAW
MATERIALS, THE PRICES OF WHICH HAVE BEEN PERSISTENTLY
DEPRESSED. IN THE VENICE ECONOMIC SUMMIT DECLARATION, WE
URGED THAT THE FUNCTIONING OF COMMODITY MARKETS SHOULD BE
IMPROVED AND THAT THE INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS
SHOULD HELP COUNTRIES DEPENDENT ON THE EXPORT OF PRIMARY
PRODUCTS TO DIVERSIFY THEIR ECONOMIES.

AS A SPOKESMAN FOR THE THIRD WORLD WHO IS FULLY INFORMED OF
OUR PROBLEMS, YOU HAVE ALREADY TAKEN POSITIONS ON BEHALF OF
OUR CONTINENT THAT HONOR YOUR COUNTRY BEFORE INTERNATIONAL
BODIES AND HAVE RECOMMENDED MEASURES TO PRESERVE PEACE,
SECURITY, AND ECONOMIC RECOVERY IN OUR NATIONS.

THIS CONFERENCE IS A NEW OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO REQUEST YOUR
COOPERATION AGAIN, SO THAT YOU MAY MAKE YOUR WESTERN
COUNTERPARTS MORE AWARE OF THE NEED TO REORDER THE WORLD
ECONOMY SO THAT WE MAY RECEIVE FAIRER AND MORE EQUITABLE
REMUNERATION FOR OUR RAW MATERIALS AND HAVE EXPORT
RESOURCES THAT WILL ALLOW OUR ECONOMIES TO RECOVER, FOR
THEY ARE STIFLED UNDER THE WEIGHT OF FOREIGN DEBT AND
DETERIORATING TERMS OF TRADE.

MY COLLEAGUES AND I PAID PARTICULAR ATTENTION TO PROBLEMS
FACING THE COUNTRIES OF SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA, WHICH YOU SO
ELOQUENTLY SET FORTH IN YOUR MESSAGE TO ME. WE AGREED, AS
NOTED IN THE DECLARATION, THAT CONSIDERATION SHOULD BE
GIVEN "TO THE POSSIBILITY OF APPLYING LOWER INTEREST RATES
TO THEIR EXISTING DEBT" AND THAT AN AGREEMENT SHOULD BE
REACHED, ESPECIALLY IN THE PARIS CLUB, "ON LONGER REPAYMENT
AND GRACE PERIODS TO EASE THE DEBT SERVICE BURDEN.
FINALLY, WE AGREE THAT DISCUSSIONS ON VARIOUS NEW PROPOSALS
AIMED AT RELIEVING THE DEBT PROBLEMS OF SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA
WOULD BE CONCLUDED THIS YEAR."

THE WORLD ECONOMY CANNOT RECOVER UNLESS A PERMANENT
SOLUTION IS FOUND FOR THE DEBT PROBLEM, WHICH IS CURRENTLY

STRENGTHEN COOPERATION AGAINST THOSE WHO BELIEVE IN THE USE OF VIOLENCE AND BRUTE FORCE, THE VENICE SUMMIT GAVE RENEWED IMPETUS TO THE EXPANSION OF INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AGAINST TERRORISM. His Excellency Ronald Reagan
President of the United States of America

Mr. President and dear friend:

On the eve of the Summit Conference of the Chiefs of State and Heads of Government of the seven major Western industrial powers, it is my duty and pleasure to call your attention again to the difficulties that the African continent is experiencing.

Indeed, as you know, for more than a decade Africa has been confronted with conflicts of all kinds that mobilize its scarce resources and dissipate its energies.

These conflicts, fueled by powers that wish to impose their ideology on our countries, which have chosen the way of liberalism, seriously encumber the development, progress, and happiness to which our hard-working people aspire.

As a spokesman for the Third World who is fully informed of our problems, you have already taken positions on behalf of our continent that honor your country before international bodies and have recommended measures to preserve peace, security, and economic recovery in our nations.

This conference is a new opportunity for us to request your cooperation again, so that you may make your Western counterparts more aware of the need to reorder the world

economy so that we may receive fairer and more equitable remuneration for our raw materials and have export resources that will allow our economies to recover, for they are stifled under the weight of foreign debt and deteriorating terms of trade.

The world economy cannot recover unless a permanent solution is found for the debt problem, which is currently the real impediment to the upsurge of our economies.

Knowing the political philosophy that has always motivated your actions in this area, we are placing great hope in your interventions on this issue on behalf of the African continent.

The last point that concerns us and to which you have never been indifferent is, of course, the problem of security and peace.

On this issue, is it necessary to emphasize the need to strengthen cooperation between Africa and the free world in order to bar the way to all those who, armed by their beliefs in violence and brute force, have vowed to sow death and terror in our countries?

I know that this summit will not be like the others, because the stakes affect the lives of two-thirds of humankind and the security of our respective peoples.

Africa is expecting much from this conference, and in this hope I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to you my sincere personal friendship, my warmest wishes for success, and the assurances of my very high consideration.

You are scheduled for the following television appearances for the Venice Economic Summit. These logistical plans are tentative according to your schedule.

SUNDAY, JUNE 7: CNN NEWSMAKER INTERVIEW

CNN Newsmaker will be done at the Excelsior Hotel on Sunday. The Excelsior is on Lido Island and it is the location of the White House press corps for the summit. It is approximately a 20 to 25 minute boat ride from the Cipriani Hotel where you are staying. Taping can be done between 8:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. You will be interviewed by Charles Bierbauer and Frank Sesno. Topic will be the Venice Economic Summit.

MONDAY, JUNE 8: NBC'S TODAY SHOW

NBC's Today Show will be done at the Cipriani Hotel in an interview room we have selected. No other press will have access to the area. There are two options:
