BIOGRAPHY - Simon Insonere

Republic of Rwanda

Simon Insonere was born on September 21, 1948 in Bulinga Commune, Gitarama Prefecture, Rwanda. He attended the primary school of Mushishiro (Bulinga) and subsequently studied at the Junior Seminary Saint Leon at Kabgayi from 1961 to 1965 and the Junior Seminary Saint Paul at Kigali from 1965 to 1968 from which he received a certificate in General Humanities. From 1968 to 1971 he attended the National University of Rwanda, Faculty of Letters at Butare, graduating with a B.A. in English. He continued his studies in 1971 at the University of Abidjan (Ivory Coast), Faculty of Letters from which he received a "license" in English teaching and a certificate in African studies in 1973.

Ambassador Insonere began his professional career as a professor of English language and literature at the National Teachers' Institute at Butare in 1974. While at the Institute, he served as secretary of the teacher's council and in 1975 became coordinator of modern letters and editor in chief of "Rencontres", the Institute's review. In 1978 he was named Director General for Primary education and integrated rural and handicraft education at the Ministry of National Education, a post which he held until 1980 when he was nominated to his current position as Rwandan Ambassador to Egypt.

Aside from the period spent in Egypt, Ambassador Insonere visited Great Britain from 1973-74 where he studied English and French instruction. He also visited the United States in 1976 as a Fulbright Scholar at San Francisco State University. Ambassador Insonere holds a certificate in applied linguistics and English teaching from San Francisco State.

A thorough search of U.S. Government sources reveals no grounds for objection.

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

The president of Rwanda has expressed the enthusiastic desire to make an official visit to meet President Reagan. He made his wishes known to Ms. Maureen Reagan when she led a presidential delegation last July, and said the same thing to NSC Senior African Director Cohen who visited in November. Ms. Reagan endorsed the request when she returned to Washington. Her treatment in Rwanda had been outstanding.

You will recall that President Habyarimana was unable to accept an office call for February 22. We had recommended the event when we learned that he would be transiting Washington at that time enroute to Japan. When we made the offer, however, we learned that he had changed his itinerary. The Rwandan foreign minister told our charge d'affaires that the offer was deeply appreciated, and expressed the hope that another date would be possible.

On the diplomatic level, we are now engaged in a high priority effort to have Cuba condemned in the UN Commission on Human Rights which is currently meeting in Geneva. Rwanda is one of three African members of the commission. We are now asking Maureen Reagan to call several African chiefs of state, including the Rwandan, to lobby on this subject. Ms. Reagan and the NSC feel it would be very helpful if we could have a proposed official visit date in hand when she calls on the Cuban issue. As far as U.S./Rwandan bilateral relations are concerned, a possible official visit and the Cuban human rights questions are the most important issues on our respective screens.

As we indicated in our earlier request for an office call, Habyarimana is a good friend of the United States. He runs a market economy, is anti-Communist, and tends to vote with the United States at the UN. He deserves an official visit on his own merits apart from this particular issue for which he can be helpful.

We recommend that you settle on a date for an official working visit for the president of Rwanda in September or October, 1988. This date should be selected in time for Ms. Maureen Reagan to offer it to President Habyarimana during a telephone call on Tuesday, February 23, 1988.
