SUBJECT: NAKASONE UNVEILS MARKET ACCESS PROGRAM

- 1. (CONFIDENTIAL) ENTIRE TEXT
- 2. PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE PLEDGED TO OPEN JAPAN'S DOMESTIC MARKET TO THE WORLD AT A JULY 30 PRESS CONFERENCE TO UNVEIL HIS GOVERNMENT'S MARKET ACCESS ACTION PROGRAM. THE NAKASONE PACKAGE INCLUDED REFORMS IN TARIFFS, STANDARDS AND CERTIFICATION PROCEDURES, FOREIGN ACCESS TO THE SERVICE SECTOR, AND GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT. NAKASONE STRESSED IN HIS REMARKS THAT THE PROGRAM WAS JAPAN'S BEST EFFORT AND SPECIFICALLY ASKED THE US CONGRESS TO REFRAIN FROM RETALIATORY ACTION TO GIVE THE PROPOSALS TIME TO WORK. THE BRIEFING SERVED TO UNDERSCORE NAKASONE'S INTENSE PERSONAL COMMITTMENT TO OPENING UP JAPAN'S MARKET, WHILE A QUESTION ON PRODUCT SAFETY RAISED BY JAPANESE REPORTERS HIGHLIGHTED THE DIFFICULTIES HE HAS FACED IN TRYING TO MANAGE THIS ISSUE.
- 3. AT A JULY 30 PRESS CONFERENCE TO INTRODUCE AN ACTION PLAN CRAFTED TO MEET FOREIGN DEMANDS FOR INCREASED ACCESS, PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE DECLARED HIS INTENTION TO OPEN JAPAN'S MARKETS TO THE WORLD AND CALLED 1985 "THE YEAR OF IMPORT EXPANSION." THE MARKET ACCESS ACTION PLAN PACKAGE UNVEILED BY NAKASONE INCLUDED TARIFF REDUCTIONS, REFORMS IN STANDARDS AND CERTIFICATION PROCEDURES, INCREASED FOREIGN ACCESS TO THE SERVICE SECTOR, AND LIBERALIZATION OF GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT PRACTICES.
- 4. NAKASONE STRESSED THAT THE ACTION PROGRAM WAS LARAN'S BEST EFFORT, AND THAT HE TOOK PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR ITS SUCCESS. HE ASKED FOR INTERNATIONAL UNDERSTANDING OF

JAPAN'S SINCERE INTENTION TO OPEN THE DOMESTIC MARKET AL. PLEDGED RESULTS. IN A REQUEST DIRECTED AT THE US CONGRESS. HE ASKED THAT THESE REFORMS BE GIVEN A CHANCE TO MOPH BEFORE RETALIATORY LEGISLATION WAS CONSIDERED

- 5. IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE ACTION PACKAGE, NAKASONE ALSO PROMISEO EFFORTS TO EXPAND THE DOMESTIC ECONOMY. HE LEFT THE DETAILS OF THESE EFFORTS TO THE ECONOMIC PLANNING AGENCY AND LDP PARTY COUNCILS, BUT SUGGESTED THAT DEREGULATION PROPOSALS, A TAX CUT AND PRIVATE FINANCING OF PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS WERE ITEMS UNDER CONSIDERATION.
- 6. NAKASONE ACKNOWLEDGED IN RESPONSE TO A REPORTER'S QUESTION JAPANESE PUBLIC CONCERN THAT SAFETY STANDARDS MIGHT BE LOWERED IN THE INTEREST OF INCREASED FOREIGN ACCESS TO THE MARKET. HE TOUCHED ON THE RECENT AUSTRIAN WINE SCANDAL (WHEREIN SOME PRODUCERS SWEETENED A POOR CROP WITH A POTENTIALLY POISONOUS ADDITIVE), WHICH HAS RECEIVED SUBSTANTIAL PLAY IN THE JAPANESE MEDIA, BUT OFFERED ASSURANCES THAT ALL PROPOSED REFORMS WERE CONSISTENT WITH PUBLIC SAFETY.
- 7. NAKASONE TOOK PAINS TO POINT OUT THE POSITIVE ROLE THAT JAPANESE EXPORTS PLAY IN THE US ECONOMY, CLAIMING THAT NEARLY ONE-THIRD OF JAPANESE PRODUCTS SOLD IN THE US WERE ITEMS THAT WERE NOT MANUFACTURED THERE. HE NOTED THAT THESE EXPORTS PROVIDED JOBS FOR AMERICANS AND CONTRIBUTED TO OUR PROSPERITY.
- 8. NAKASONE ADMITTED THAT FOLLOW-UP TO THE ACTION PROGRAM WAS CRITICAL. HE ANNOUNCED THE APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES TO MONITOR PROGRESS WITHIN EACH MINISTRY AND EXPRESSED HIS WILLINGNESS TO CONTINUE THE DIALOG WITH JAPAN'S TRADING PARTNERS.
- 9. NAKASONE STRESSED THAT THERE WAS NO CONNECTION BETWEEN PRESSURES IN THE TRADE AREA AND PLANS FOR INCREASED DEFENSE SPENDING. HE EMPHASIZED THAT JAPANESE DEFENSE SPENDING IS BASED SOLELY ON AN ASSESSMENT OF JAPANESE SECURITY NEEDS.
- 1Ø. (COMMENT) NAKASONE'S REMARKS AT THE PRESS CONFERENCE DEPARTED SUBSTANTIALLY FROM THOSE PROVIDED US EARLIER BY THE FOREIGN MINISTRY. THROUGHOUT THEY SHOWED HIS INTENSE PERSONAL COMMITTMENT TO OPENING JAPAN'S MARKET AND DESIRE THAT FOREIGN OBSERVERS (ESPECIALLY THE US CONGRESS) GIVE THE PROGRAM AN OPPORTUNITY TO WORK.
- 11. THE QUESTION ON PRODUCT SAFETY ADDRESSED TO NAKASONE BY A JAPANESE REPORTER HIGHLIGHTED THE DIFFICULTIES HE HAS FACED IN TRYING TO MANAGE THE ISSUE OF INCREASED ACCESS FOR FOREIGN GOODS. INDUSTRY AND BUREAUCRATIC INTERESTS HAVE BEEN QUICK TO CLAIM THAT THE PUBLIC INTEREST IN SAFE AND RELIABLE GOODS IS THREATENED BY FOREIGN DEMANDS FOR SELF-CERTIFICATION. (END COMMENT) MANSFIELD RT

- ENTIRE TEXT.

2. JAPAN'S MARKET-OPENING APPROACH OUTLINED ON NATIONAL TELEVISION BY PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE TODAY IS A COMPREHENSIVE ADVANCE IN JAPAN'S CONTINUING EFFORT, PLEDGED BY PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE IN HIS APRIL 9 STATEMENT, TO DEAL WITH ITS WORLDWIDE BURGEONING TRADE SURPLUS BY REDUCING GOVERNMENT REGULATION OF THE ECONOMY AND BY WORKING TOWARD DOMESTIC-LED GROWTH. THE OVERALL APPROACH, STRUCTURAL AND PERVASIVE IN SCOPE, INCLUDES THE ACTION PROGRAM AND ENVISAGES FURTHER MOVES BASED ON THE APRIL 9 OKITA ADVISORY COMMISSION'S REPORT. THE APPROACH RECOGNIZES THAT THE POST-WAR FREE TRADE SYSTEM IS PROBABLY IN MORE DANGER NOW FROM RESURGENT PROTECTIONISM THAN EVER BEFORE, THAT JAPAN HAS BEEN A MAJOR BENEFICIARY OF THIS SYSTEM, AND THAT MAJOR RESPONSIBILITY NOW FALLS TO JAPAN TO PRESERVE THAT SYSTEM BY WORKING TOWARD INTERNATIONALIZATION AND LIBERALIZATION OF ITS ECONOMY AND SOCIETY AND, AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE, A NEW ROUND OF MIN INCORPORATING BOTH SERVICES TRADE AND AGRICULTURE.

3. THE ACTION PROGRAM ITSELF INCORPORATES THE CONCEPTS OF "FREEDOM IN PRINCIPLE AND REGULATION AS AN EXCEPTION" AND "TRANSPARENCY," WHICH ARE

FOREIGN TO JAPAN BUT WHICH WE HAVE PROMOTED THROUGH TELECOMMUNICATIONS NEGOTIATIONS AND SUBSEQUENTLY THROUGH THE ENTIRE MOSS NEGOTIATING SPACESS THE GOJ HAS MODELLED THE ACTION PROGEN HE TELECOMPUNICATIONS SECTOR THAT. THE "RIPPLE EFFECT" WE SOUGHT IS THUS OCCURRING.

- 4. THE ACTION PROGRAM SPECIFICALLY INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING SIX COMPONENTS:
- -- TARIFFS: THE PROGRAM REITERATES JAPAN'S PLEDGE TO WORK TOWARD AN EARLY START OF THE NEW MTN ROUND AND THAT SHE WILL REDUCE OR ELIMINATE TARIFFS ON SOME 1800 ITEMS AS PROMISED JUNE 25. ITEMS OF INTEREST TO THE U.S. ON WHICH TARIFFS WILL BE REDUCED INCLUDE: WINE, WALNUTS AND PECANS; THOSE ON WHICH THE TARIFF WILL BE CUT TO ZERO INCLUDE TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND RADIO EQUIPMENT, POLISHED ALUMINUM SKIN AND LEAD-ACID BATTERIES. THE SECTION DOES CONTAIN NEW COMMITMENTS TO REDUCE TARIFFS ON SOFTWOOD AND HARDWOOD PLYWOODS AND OTHER PANEL PRODUCTS AS OF APRIL 1987 AND TO GIVE PRIORITY TO NEGOTIATIONS ON COMPUTER PARTS AND PERIPHERALS.
- -- IMPORT QUOTAS: CONTINUED WORK THROUGH THE GATT COMMITTEE ON TRADE IN AGRICULTURE: FURTHER NEGOTIATIONS ON BEEF, CITRUS, AND THE 13 ITEMS OF INTEREST TO THE U.S. WILL TAKE PLACE IN ACCORDANCE WITH EXISTING AGREEMENTS.
- -- STANDARDS AND CERTIFICATION: THE NUMBER OF ITEMS COVERED BY STANDARDS WILL BE REDUCED; INCREASED ACCEPTANCE OF FOREIGN TEST DATA; FOREIGNERS WILL BE PROVIDED ACCESS TO ALL TWENTY-TWO STANDARDS-SETTING DELIBERATION COUNCILS (TRANSPARENCY).
- -- GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT: GATT CODE COVERAGE WILL BE ENLARGED TO ENCOMPASS 16 MORE GOVERNMENT-RELATED ENTITIES: A SINGLE QUALIFICATION SYSTEM WILL BE APPLIED TO ALL WOULD-BE SUPPLIERS. BIDDING PERIODS EXTENDED FROM 3Ø TO 4Ø DAYS.
- -- FINANCIAL AND CAPITAL MARKETS: AS EXPLAINED TO TREASURY DURING JUNE 1985 YEN/DOLLAR FOLLOW-UP MEETING, MOVES TO OPEN JAPAN'S DOMESTIC MARKET; BT

FOLLOW-ON STEPS TO MAY 1984 YEN/DOLLAR AGREEMENT.

-- SERVICES AND IMPORT PROMOTION MEASURES: A CATCH-ALL. UNCERTAIN MOVEMENT ON THE LAWYERS ISSUES: EXPANSION OF EXPORT-IMPORT BANK'S PROMOTION ACTIVITIES; A PLEDGE TO STUDY JAPAN'S DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM TO TRY TO IDENTIFY BARRIERS TO TRADE.

THE PRIME MINISTER HIMSELF, BACKED BY THE CHIEF CABINET SECRETARY, IS TO OVERSEE THE PROCESS THROUGH A COMMITTEE OF ALL RELEVANT VICE MINISTERS.

5. WHILE THE ACTION PROGRAM ITSELF CENTERS AROUND MEASURES TO FURTHER IMPROVE MARKET ACCESS. THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT ALSO INTENDS TO PROCEED WITH THE REMAINING FIVE PROPOSALS TO INTERNATIONALIZE THE JAPANESE ECONOMY CALLED FOR IN THE APRIL 9 OKITA ADVISORY COMMISSION REPORT. THESE ARE SUST ?. NED GROWTH, EXPANDED INVESTMENT AND INDUSTRIAL COOPERATION, PROMOTION OF THE (GATT) NEW ROUND; RESPONSE TOWARD DEVELOPING COUNTRIES (IN HIS WRITTEN STATEMENT TODAY, PM NAKASONE ANNOUNCED HIS CONTINUED INTENTION TO DOUBLE JAPAN'S ODA WITHIN THE MEDIUM TERM; I.E., SEVEN-TEN YEARS. THE FACT THAT MOFA OBTAINED A 10 PERCENT ODA INCREASE IN THE FY86 BUDGET OUTLINE AGREED TO JULY 26 SHOULD MAKE THIS POSSIBLE.) AND EFFORTS TO AVOID FRICTION.

6. FURTHER TO THE SECOND PROPOSAL, A TASK FORGE WILL BE SET UP SHORTLY TO EXAMINE SUCH ISSUES

CSN: EHA233 AS DOMESTIC GROWTH THROUGH FURTHER DEREGULATION THE HOUSING/CONSTRUCTION SECTOR, GREATER USE OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR TO CARRY OUT PUBLIC WORKS, UND THE REFORM THE GOJ EXPENTS THAT AS JAPA" THE U.S. WOULD, FOR ITS PART, FOLLOW POLICIES WHICH WOULD LEAD TO BUDGET DEFICIT REDUCTIONS, LOWER INTEREST RATES, AND A BETTER ALIGNMENT OF EXCHANGE RATES.

> 7. THE ACTION PROGRAM IS A "DYNAMIC PROCESS" TO BE CARRIED OUT OVER A THREE-YEAR PERIOD. IT WILL NOT PRODUCE A RAPID SHIFT IN THE TRADE BALANCE, BUT IT SETS THE COURSE FOR CONTINUING AND STEADY IMPROVEMENT IN ACCESS TO THE JAPANESE MARKET BY INCORPORATING THE PRINCIPLES OF TRANSPARENCY AND REDUCED REGULATION. IT ALSO ESTABLISHES MECHANISMS FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND FOLLOW-UP. GREATER PRODUCT CHOICE WILL EVENTUALLY FALL TO THE CONSUMER. THIS IS THE DIRECTION IN WHICH WE HAVE BEEN TRYING TO GET JAPAN TO GO.

8. THE BUREAUCRACY IS NOT UNITED ON SUPPORT FOR THE ACTION PROGRAM; POWERFUL AGRICULTURAL INTERESTS STILL DOMINATE MUCH OF THE LDP, AND MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY, AND FISHERIES HAS HARDLY BUDGED. BUT POWERFUL ALLIES -- THE PRIME MINISTER, THE FOREIGN MINISTRY, PARTS OF MITI, AND INCREASINGLY THE ECONOMIC PLANNING AGENCY -- HAVE FORCED THROUGH MAJOR CHANGES IN BOTH THE BREADTH AND THE PACE OF LIBERALIZATION. KEY LIBERAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY AND BUSINESS LEADERS HAVE BEEN ACTIVE ALLIES IN THE PROCESS AND RECOGNIZE THE DIRECTION IN WHICH

JAPAN MUST GO. THE RESISTANCE (IN THE BUREAUCRACY, IN INDUSTRY, AND TO AN EXTENT IN THE PUBLIC) TO CHANGING THE SYSTEM WHICH HAS WORKED SO WELL FOR JAPAN FOR SO MANY YEARS IS STILL CLOSE TO THE SURFACE. MOREOVER, SHOULD WE FAIL TO ENCOURAGE THE GOVERNMENT, AT THIS JUNCTURE, IN ITS EFFORTS TOWARD PROMOTING GREATER ACCESS AND DEREGULATION, THE HAND OF THOSE WHO WOULD FAVOR THE "TRIED AND TRUE" METHOD OF EXPORT RESTRAINT -- MANAGED TRADE -- AS BT

THE ANSWER, WOULD BE STRENGTHENED, AT GREAT COST TO YEARS OF EFFORT TO OPEN JAPAN'S MARKETS AND SYSTEM.

THE PROGRAM IS COMPREHENSIVE BUT REALISTIC; IT IS ONGOING. IT WILL REQUIRE FOLLOW-UP BOTH WITHIN THE GOJ AND FROM US. THE ACTION PROGRAM ITSELF IS ALSO THE MOST THAT JAPAN'S OWN POLITICAL SYSTEM COULD PROBABLY PRODUCE BY THIS POINT IN TIME. THE PRIME MINISTER AND HIS COLLEAGUES ARE WORKING FOR . MORE OPENNESS IN THE SYSTEM. THE DECISIONS PRESENTED TODAY BY JAPAN MERIT OUR SUPPORT AND ENCOURAGEMENT SO THAT JAPAN'S LEADERS, PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE AND OTHERS, AND THE PROCESS THEY ARE DRIVING, CAN MOVE AHEAD. MANSFIELD BT
