You will recall I drafted a letter dated March 12 which you signed to Hugh Scott concerning his interest in Pakistan. He called me on the phone today to ask if we could get together next week to talk about his concerns. Not surprisingly, they relate to the type of issues that the NSC will be considering on Thursday. As you know, Senator Scott's law firm represents Pakistan in the United States. (C)

I need guidance from you as to what level of confidentiality I should discuss Pakistan with the Senator. In your judgment, how much ground should I cover? The general question the NSC is considering without mentioning figures? Or should I talk in more specific terms about what we hope our contribution to Pakistan will be? Or should I play it cool and talk in general terms about our belief in the strategic importance of Pakistan? (C)

In our conversation of last Saturday, you raised the possible value of the Vice President meeting with Foreign Minister Aga Shahi of Pakistan during the Vice President's visit to Europe. The purpose would be for the Vice President to discuss U.S. security assistance to Pakistan.

In the wake of Jim Buckley's visit, considerable analysis must be done on both the air and ground components of our assistance program as a basis for Presidential decisions with respect to the possible diversion of material from active U.S. Air Force and other service inventories. This should be completed so as to facilitate an NSC meeting near the end of the month but no sooner.

To the extent that a number of meetings have been held with the Pakistanis and their priorities clearly established, the next step is for the U.S. to reply. In that no reply will be possible until after the Vice President's trip, a meeting during that trip would appear to be premature.



We suggest the following language to announce the visit here:

The President has invited President Zia-ul-Haq of Pakistan to pay an official visit to the United States. President Zia has accepted and will meet with the President in Washington on December 7.

We recommend immediate issuance of the announcement. In light of Zia's unilateral statement, we do not believe it necessary to coordinate the timing of the announcement with the Pakistan Government.

Dear Mr. President:

At about this time last year, the United States and the Government of Pakistan entered into a dialogue concerning the changed strategic environment in South Asia and its implications for Pakistan which resulted from Soviet aggression against Afghanistan. It was with great satisfaction to me that our discussions were successful, leading to the Pakistan Government's statement of September 15, 1981. My administration is firmly committed to assisting you in helping your country stand up to Soviet pressures and to actions by its surrogate in Kabul. To this end, we will make every effort to win Congressional approval of our assistance requests for Pakistan and I am confident we shall be successful.

In view of our new relationship and the importance which the United States attaches to this relationship, I would like to extend to you and Begum Zia an invitation to visit with me and Nancy in Washington, if convenient, in the month of December. A visit would provide us with an opportunity not only to meet personally but to gain a better appreciation of one another's perceptions of bilateral matters as well as the larger issues which the world faces today.

Please let me know through Ambassador Spiers whether a visit as proposed would be agreeable to you so that we might begin to work out the details.

The Bhutto family have not been friends of mine at any time. But in the present circumstances, it seems cruel not to allow Mrs. Bhutto to go abroad for medical treatment.

There is strong feeling in India, especially amongst our women. Several organizations are approaching me to take up the issue. I have written to President Zia-ul-Haq requesting him to consider this matter on purely humanitarian grounds.


