Yaqub will be in Washington for consultations the week of May 18. He has meetings with Secretaries Shultz and Weinberger on May 18. The GOP has requested that he meet with the President to deliver a letter either from President Zia or Prime Minister Junejo. He also wants to meet with you to discuss a variety of topics including Afghanistan, AEW systems for Pakistan, and the nuclear issue.

Yaqub's visit to Washington follows meetings in Islamabad with Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Vorontsov. The Soviets remain focused on national reconciliation as the main item of concern before any further discussion of timetables of troop withdrawal can take place. The UN mediated talks are slated for May although all sides are pessimistic about the prospects.

State recommends a meeting with the President for Yaqub (Levitsky/Carlucci memo at TAB I). We understand that the President's schedule is extremely crowded. Therefore, a longer meeting with you is all the more desirable.

Dear Mr. Baber:

I am replying on behalf of the President to your cabled letter supporting the sale to Pakistan of equipment intended to improve Pakistan's early warning capabilities against intruding aircraft attacks from Afghanistan.

We agree that in order to respond effectively and in a timely manner to the increasing tempo of communist air attacks on its soil, Pakistan must improve its capability for early warning and detection of aircraft attacking from across the Afghanistan border. For this purpose, we have discussed with Pakistani authorities several different airborne early warning (AEW) systems, including aerostat radars, E-2C Hawkeye, and E-3A Sentinel. No decision has as yet been made between systems; hence there has been no sale.

U.S. security assistance to Pakistan is governed by bilateral agreements going back to the 1950's, which specify that the assistance is intended to help Pakistan preserve "its national independence and integrity." Since the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan in 1979, there has been a rising number of cross-border attacks by communist aircraft on Pakistan. Communist air violations of Pakistani territory averaged more than two per day in 1986, resulting in 44 killed and 77 wounded, a 300% increase over 1985. Air violations for just the first three months of 1987 saw this tempo rise again, with 330 intrusions, nearly 1000 casualties, and more than 250 civilians killed.

You note concerns expressed on behalf of the Government of India regarding the possible change in the balance of power in South Asia should Pakistan acquire an AEW system. We are familiar with these concerns and will, of course, take both the Indian point of view and our interest in good relations with India into account, as we move forward with decisions to improve Pakistan's ability to defend itself from the threats it faces. We agree that India continues to have substantial military superiority over Pakistan; nothing proposed in our program for Pakistan, past or present, will change that. We strongly support the independence and territorial integrity of the nations of South Asia. Our aim is to promote rather than impede Indo-Pakistan normalization, which is the key to peace

and security in the region. An AEW system, in any event, is wholly defensive in nature, intended to give Pakistan the ability to protect its own airspace from intruding aircraft.

As you know, our security assistance to Pakistan has enabled it to undertake a limited modernization of its aging military equipment. We believe this limited modernization, by tangibly demonstrating our support and adding to Pakistan's confidence to stand up to Soviet intimidation, serves to enhance Pakistan's general sense of security and thus contributes to the political stability of the South Asian region as a whole.



DEAR PRESIDENT REAGAN:

I STRONGLY URGE YOU TO IGNORE THE BASELESS AND MALICIOUS PROPOGANDA OF THE INDIAN AND SOVIET LOBBIES TO PROVIDE THE "AWACS" TO PAKISTAN.

INDIA IS ALREADY A NUCLEAR POWER AND HAS BEEN BEEN TRAINING ITS FORCES IN FLIP-TONS DELIVERY, A TECHNIQUE NORMALLY ASSOCIATED WITH THE DELIVERY OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS. INDIA'S WAR MATERIALS EVEN EXCEED THAT OF CHINA IN SOPHISTICATION AND MODERNIZATION.

PAKISTAN IS A PEACEFUL COUNTRY AND HAS OFFERED REFUGE TO MILLIONS OF AFGHAN REFUGEES AFTER THE SOVIET INVASION OF THEIR COUNTRY. IT DESERVES THE SUPPORT OF ALL FREEDOM-LOVING PEOPLE OF THIS WORLD IN GENERAL AND THE UNITED STATES IN PARTICULAR.

Dear Mr. Minister:

My return to the government at the request of the President enables me to renew my contact with old friends, such as yourself. I recall our past association as we worked to strengthen the relationship between our countries.

The last six years have been critical ones for Pakistan's security. Together, we have helped ensure that Pakistan remains strong as it faces the challenges stemming from the Soviet Union's brutal occupation of Afghanistan. As the President has repeatedly said, Pakistan's security and its territorial integrity are important to the United States. Our recognition that the commitment must be long-term is reflected in the renewed security assistance program which begins next year.

As you know, Bob Oakley of my staff will be going to Pakistan with Mike Armacost in mid-January. They will be discussing the Afghanistan issue in detail with you. However, I did want to use this opportunity to share some thoughts with you on the subject of Afghanistan.

In recent weeks, the Soviets have appeared to quicken the pace of discussions on a settlement in Afghanistan. They and Najibullah have recently made a series of statements and proposals that appear enticing at first glance. However, as you recognize better than anyone else, there is nothing which indicates that the Soviets have yet come to the conclusion that they must find a formula for withdrawal which does not leave in place what would amount to a puppet government. The primary objectives of the recent proposals seem to be sowing doubt and dissension among the resistance and their supporters both inside and outside the country and impressing both Soviet and international audiences with an ostensibly sincere desire for a peaceful settlement.

The reaction of both the Government of Pakistan and the resistance in not being taken in by this gambit has been salutary and has won great admiration in this country. One must expect more maneuvers of this sort. It is our conviction that the Soviets are much more aware of the magnitude of the Afghanistan-related problems than ever before. Therefore, a continued firm



and realistic posture on the political front combined with increased military pressure by the resistance will in time oblige them to recognize that a genuine withdrawal and transfer of power to true representatives of the Afghanistan people is their only alternative.

In closing, let me add that the Geneva negotiations have been skillfully handled by Pakistan. Regular consultations between our officials have ensured that there have been no misunderstandings between our two governments on this process. I look forward to further exchanges on Afghanistan in the months ahead.
