Subject: Joint U.S.-U.S.S.R. Commercial Commission

I do not think that this is the time to act on the designation of a U.S. Co-Chairman of the U.S.-U.S.S.R. Commercial Commission. We are engaged in delicate negotiations with our allies on understandings to restrict our economic relations with the Soviets and would risk creating misunderstandings about our intentions and doubts about our consistency in the East-West area. This risk would be even greater now because the private counterpart of the Commission reportedly will be meeting with the Soviets, despite Brezhnev's death, in Moscow this month. In addition, the SIG-IEP has not had the occasion to review this matter.

There appears to be continuing confusion, both within the United States Government and on the part of the Soviets, over the chairmanship of the US-USSR Joint Commercial Commission. As I indicated in my earlier note to you (enclosed), it is still not clear to me why we would be changing the leadership of the Commission at this time. Such a change would, I believe, send confusing and wrong signals to the Soviets about the state of our commercial and economic relations. It could be viewed as an indication that we are interested in activating the Commission in order to promote our economic ties, a signal that I don't believe we want to send.

Anything you can do to clarify the situation would be appreciated.

You will recall the discussions that transpired last year concerning the Joint U.S.-U.S.S.R. Commercial Commission and the designation of the U.S. Co-Chairman.

Our records show that the tentative decision by the President was to have the Secretary of Commerce chair the U.S. side of the Joint U.S.-U.S.S.R. Commercial Commission. The memorandum announcing that understanding was never transmitted.

As you know, the Commission has not met since December of 1978 and it is not likely that the U.S. will be represented at any point in the near future. We are inclined to document the President's decision so that we may close the books on the matter, however, we would appreciate your thoughts prior to that action being implemented.

SUBJECT: Joint US-USSR Commercial Commission

We disagree with the attached draft memorandum which would designate the Secretary of Commerce as the U.S. Chairman of the Joint US-USSR Commercial Commission. Every Treasury Secretary since George Shults in 1973 has been designated American Chairman of the Commission. A change of leadership at this time is inappropriate.

A shift in leadership of the Commission would send a confusing and wrong signal to the USSR. At a time when the state of our commercial relations is at a low point, it would be seen as an indication that we were actively interested in improving our economic and commercial ties with the Soviets.

The work of the Commission has in the past transcended the discussion of strictly commercial matters. The very nature of our relationship with the Soviet Union has required the Commission to deal with issues within the broader context of our overall economic and political relationships with the USSR. If the chairmanship was transferred to Commerce and our relations with the Soviet Union were to improve, it would be necessary to create yet another Commission to provide a framework for broad economic cooperation. This would be a waste of both time and money.

I request that the American Chairmanship of the Commercial Commission remain at the Treasury.

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

SUBJECT: Designation of the Secretary of Commerce as U.S. Co-chairman of the Joint U.S.-U.S.S.R. Commercial Commission

The Provident has decided that the U.S. side of the Joint U.S.-U.S.S.R. Commercel Commission will be chaired by the Secretary of Commerce.

The Joint U.S.-U.S.S.R. Commercial Commission was established in May 1972, to deal with most aspects of U.S.-Soviet commercial relations. On the Soviet side the Commission has been co-chaired since its inception by the Minister of Foreign Wrade. It last met in December 1973. No meetings are currently scheduled.

The Commission's functions include monitoring implementation of the 1974 U.S.-Soviet Long-term Agreement to Caellitate Economic, Industrial and Rechnical Cooperation; to exchange information and forecasts of basic economic and industrial trends; and to assist in identifying fields for cooperation between U.S. firms and Soviet economic and commorpial entities.

The generally held belief at Commerce, expressed by Helen Robbins, is that the Secretary of Commerce was designated to serve as the U.S. chairman of the Joint US-USSR Commercial Commission. Secretary Baldrige holds that belief as well.

While Helen was sure something had come over from the White House; having checked, she concedes they have nothing on paper. Nevertheless, they "clearly remember" the word coming from Ed Meese and/ or Ken Cribb: that Baldrige would receive that appointment.

DOC feels it would be "nice" to have something in writing in the event the Commission meets again (last met in 1978).

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

If the decision has in fact been made that the Secretary of Commerce should be designated the US chairman (transferring that distinction from Treasury), the attached or similar memo from Ed Meese should be sent.

In checking with the Chief Clerk's Office, Presidential Personnel and Records Management, I find there is no record of any appointment (Secretary Baldrige's or other) to the Co-Chairmanship of the Joint US-USSR Commercial Commission.

The last record in the Chief Clerk's Office is that G. William Miller, Secretary of the Treasury during the Carter Administration, served as co-chairman of the Commission. Bloomenthal preceded him, apparently.

Records Management shows that CLF has the original Meese memo and file, which is true; and their last piece of paper on the matter is dated November 12 (the EM memo, I believe).
