Dear Mrs. Reagan:

Each year the World Health Assembly -- the chief governing body of the World Health Organization -- meets, usually in Geneva, to shape the policies of WHO and review the substantive aspects of its program and budget. As you may be aware, WHO generally is regarded as among the most effective and least political of U.N. agencies. Last May it was my privilege to head the U.S. delegation to the Assembly. I am planning to do so again for the 1983 Assembly, which will meet May 2 - 20, and I would be honored if you would agree to visit Geneva for two or three days with our delegation.

Your presence in Geneva and your interaction with the health ministers of other nations will serve to reaffirm our commitment to WHO. You would have the opportunity to meet with the WHO senior staff to learn about WHO's emphasis on primary health care, on inclusion of health within broad development strategies, and on matters that may be of special interest to you, such as WHO's programs concerning the health of the elderly and the abuse of narcotic drugs.

In addition to attending several of the Assembly sessions and meeting with WHO staff, you could meet officials of other UN agencies in Geneva and members of the American community, perhaps in an official reception.

I would be pleased to provide any further information about WHO and the Assembly that would be helpful.

By note dated April 27 you asked that I check to determine if the State Department proposal to have the President designate delegates to the Thirty-sixth World Health Assembly of the World Health Organization complied with Public Law 80-643. I have examined that statute, codified at 22 U.S.C. § 290a, and have no objection to the contemplated action. The President is authorized to designate up to three delegates (including a chief delegate) and an unspecified number of alternates. As proposed by State, he will name three delegates and two alternates. The designees must be investigated as to loyalty and security by OPM; State verifies that this has been done.

The United States Government, a Member of the World Health Organization, has been notified of the convening of the Thirty-sixth World Health Assembly in Geneva, Switzerland, from May 2 through 18, 1983. I recommend, and the Secretary of Health and Human Services concurs, that you designate the Chief Delegate, Delegates, and Alternate Delegates to this meeting as indicated on the attached list.

Public Law 643, 80th Congress, requires presidential designation of the Chief Delegate, Delegates, and Alternate Delegates to sessions of the World Health Assembly. Senate confirmation is not required.

The individuals named on this list have been certified as to security in accordance with Public Law 643, 80th Congress, as amended by Public Law 298, 82nd Congress.
