Schmidt's Meeting with Mitterrand

The Germans have provided our Charge in Bonn with a full read-out on Schmidt's May 24 meeting with Mitterrand. In addition to the discussion of possible U.S.-French contacts, which I reported to you separately, the highlights were as follows:

- -- Schmidt conveyed your greetings to Mitterrand, told him you wanted close relations with the Allies based on active consultations, and looked forward to close cooperation with Mitterrand. Mitterrand listened carefully and said he considered this an important message. Schmidt's impression was that Mitterrand wanted good and productive relations with us.
- -- Schmidt gave Mitterrand his impressions of his Washington visit and they spoke about the French role in the Alliance.

 Mitterrand indicated there would be no change in the French attitude. He endorsed the NATO double decision on Theater

 Nuclear Forces installation and negotiation.
- -- Mitterrand said he would not change his previous positive attitude toward Israel, though he acknowledged the need for good relations with the Arabs. Mitterrand noted that two cabinet appointments (Foreign Minister Cheysson and Foreign Trade Minister Jobert) had been made with the Arabs in mind, and that he would send an emissary to the Arabs soon.
- -- Mitterrand expressed concern over U.S. interest rate policies and hoped U.S. economic policy would not adversely affect his own hopes for French economic resurgence.

 Mitterrand said he would defend the franc and was not considering devaluation. France would stay in the European Monetary System. Schmidt promised to be helpful.

- -- Mitterrand said <u>he would participate in the North-South</u> Summit in Mexico next October.
- -- Mitterrand shared Schmidt's misgivings over the recent arrangement to limit Japanese auto exports to the U.S.
- -- The Germans say Mitterrand wants to continue and develop close Franco-German relations within the European Community setting. A Franco-German Summit has been advanced to July, before the Ottawa Summit.
- -- Our German interlocutor <u>did</u> not <u>know whether Schmidt</u> had raised with <u>Mitterrand our concerns</u> over the possibility that Communists would be included in the French government.

As I reported to you earlier, French Foreign Minister Cheysson expressed the desire to visit Washington before the June 14-21 French legislative elections to establish a dialogue with us. We have now agreed on a visit on June 4-6.

Since we have to be careful to give Cheysson treatment equal to what we offered Francois-Poncet last February,
I hope you will be able to see Cheysson for a half-hour
sometime on June 5 or 6. I will also ask the Vice President,
and -- given Cheysson's interest in economic issues -Don Regan, Murray Weidenbaum and Paul Volcker to see him.

If you agree, when you see Cheysson, you could ask him to convey a message to Mitterrand that you would like to send the Vice President to Paris after the legislative elections to establish contact with him, if mutually convenient dates can be arranged. We, of course, would have to rethink this course were Mitterrand to take Communists into the Government.

On Saturday, May 23, I learned of the Vice President's desire to visit Paris as soon as possible to initiate high-level contacts with the new Government of France. Meanwhile, we had asked Chancellor Schmidt when he was here last week to sound out the French on this subject during his visit to Paris over the weekend.

After Schmidt returned to Bonn, the Germans gave our Charge, Bill Woessner, a debriefing on Schmidt's conversations with Mitterrand. The upshot of this debrief was that the French are very eager to begin their contacts with us, but prefer to do it in Washington and at a level somewhat lower than the Mitterrand-Bush level. The French Foreign Minister, Cheysson, called our Ambassador in Paris yesterday, May 25, to convey the same message.

Most recently, the French Ambassador in Washington, Francois de Laboulaye, called on Larry Eagleburger at noon today to convey Paris' desire for an invitation for Cheysson to visit Washington within the next ten days to meet with me and with senior economic officials. I suspect that their desire to meet with economic officials stems from two concerns: (a) the French are getting more than a little bit nervous about capital flight, the stock market, and the weakening franc; and (b) Cheysson does not want to be accused by the French Right of taking instructions from Washington.

I have since talked with the Vice President, in light of the above, who has decided to forego his plans to go to Paris in the immediate future. If you agree, I would suggest that we invite Cheysson to come to Washington to meet with me, Treasury Secretary Regan, and others on June 4-8. While he is here, we could propose that the Vice President go to Paris after the second round of French Parliamentary elections in late June for conversations with Mitterrand on the future of US-French bilateral relations. If your schedule permits, I would recommend that you give Cheysson a few minutes of your time as well while he is in Washington.

(Friday, May 29 - 1:30 p.m.)

Oreja, though no longer with the government, remains an influential and well-wired figure in the Madrileno political scene (he is also the brother-in-law of Jose Llado, the Spanish Ambassador here). Your exchange with him would be particularly informative in the following areas:

- -- Post-Coup Atmosphere. What can Oreja tell us about the solidity of the present Calvo Sotelo government and the evolution of democracy?
- -- <u>King Juan Carlos</u>. What is his position? Has he emerged strengthened or weakened from the coup attempt? Will the military continue to support him?
- -- Barcelona Bank Caper. What is the significance of this hostage-taking act? Does it represent an isolated incident or does it portend even more serious activity against public order?
- -- Terrorism. Ask Oreja for a political balance-sheet on this issue.

Time permitting, you might also wish to probe him on current Spanish attitudes concerning NATO membership and the prospects for a satisfactory bases agreement. (Last June Oreja had spoken out publicly in favor of an accelerated Spanish bid for NATO membership).

Spanish Embassy Minister Alonso Alvarez de Toledo will accompany Orjea.

THE PRIME MINISTER INVITED DONNA AND ME TO JOIN HIM FOR BREAKFAST WITH GOVERNOR AND MRS. HUGHES OF MARYLAND. MAURDY, AS MAYOR OF LILLE AND HEAD OF THE REGIONAL COUNCIL FOR THE NORTH OF FRANCE, HAS HAD A STRONG INTEREST IN DEVELOPING EXCHANGES TO BENEFIT THE ECONOMY OF THE REGION. AND THIS VISIT WITH THE GOVERNOR HAD BEEN LAID ON SOME TIME BEFORE THE PRESIDENTIAL ELECTIONS. IN THE WARM MESSAGES HE RECEIVED FROM THE PRESIDENT AND THE VICE PRESIDENT.

AT THE OPPORT TUNITY OF GOING TO WASHINGTON AND MEETING THE SECRETARY SO EARLY. I WAS THE FIRST AMBASSADOR HE HAD RECEIVED. THIS WAS ONLY RIGHT AS THE UNITED STATES WAS THE PRINCIPAL ALLY OF FRANCE.

3. IN OUR CONVERSATION HE ESSENTIALLY OUTLINED THE FOREIGN POLICY OF THE NEW SOCIALIST GOVERNMENT, WHICH HE SAID HE DULD DESCRIBE IN WASHINGTON IN DETAIL. STRESSED SEVERAL POINTS. FIRST, FRENCH FOREIGN POLICY WOULD SHOW CONTINUITY. FOR INSTANCE, AS HE HAD PUBLICLY STATED, THEY WOULD HONDR ALL CONTRACTS SIGNED BY THE PREVIOUS GOVERNMENT, INCLUDING THOSE ON ARMAMENTS, EVEN THOUGH, AS HE PUT IT, SOME "STUCK IN OUR CRAW." SECONDLY. THEIR POLICY WOULD START FROM THE SAME BASES. FOR INSTANCE, THEY WOULD REMAIN IN THE CONSULTATIVE GROUP ON NAMIBIA. THERE WOULD BE NO SHARP CHANGES OF DIRECTION, BUT IT SHOULD BE UNDERSTOOD THAT THERE WOULD BE CHANGES OF DRIENTATION. THIRDLY, HE RE-AFFIRMED THE IMPORTANCE THAT HIS GOVERNMENT ATTACHES TO THE ATLANTIC ALLIANCE. PRESIDENT MITTERRAND WAS PERSONALLY A STRONG SUPPORTER OF IT. - 5. ON CONSULTATIONS, HE SEEMED TO RECOGNIZE THEIR IMPORTANCE AND INDICATED FLEXIBILITY ON HOW THEY MIGHT BE CONDUCTED, MENTIONING U.S., GERMANY AND THE U.K. WITHOUT, HOWEVER, LEAVING OUT ITALY.
- 6. IN FURTHER OUTLINING FRENCH FOREIGN POLICY, HE AGAIN EXPRESSED THE FIRM ATTACHMENT OF HIS GOVERNMENT TO THE ATLANTIC ALLIANCE AND THE IMPORTANCE OF FRENCH-U.S. RELATIONS. HE HOPES FOR DETAILED DISCUSSIONS ON POLAND, WHICH HE CONSIDERS THE KEY TO MANY PROBLEMS. HE POINTED OUT THAT THE MITTERRAND GOVERNMENT WILL WANT TO KEEP PRIVILEGED RELATIONS WITH GERMANY AND THAT ONE OF THE MAJOR POST-WAR FOREIGN POLICY OBJECTIVES OF FRANCE WAS TO ACHIEVE RECONCILIATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. HE THOUGHT THIS HAD SUCCEEDED AND IT REMAINED A BASIC ELEMENT OF FRENCH FOREIGN POLICY. HOWEVER, THESE RELATIONS WERE NOT EXCLUSIVE. CARRINGTON HAD BEEN IN PARIS ON THURSDAY AND THEY ALSO INTENDED TO MAINTAIN RELATIONS WITH OTHER "DLD ALLIES" SUCH AS ITALY.
- 7. I SUGGESTED THAT WE MIGHT FIND DIFFERENCES ON THIRD WORLD ISSUES. CHEYSSON DID NOT DENY THE POINT; HOWEVER, HE EMPHASIZED THAT DIVERSITY OF VIEWS WAS AN ELEMENT OF STRENGTH IN THE ALLIANCE AND DIFFERENCES WERE "STIMULATING." IT WAS IMPORTANT THAT WE ALL LEARN TO DISCUSS OUR DIFFERENCES.
- 8. ON THIRD WORLD QUESTIONS, I EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT WE WOULD BE CAREFUL IN TREATING SOME OF THESE ISSUES WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT SOME HAD SECURITY IMPLICATIONS FOR THE OTHER. On Saturday, May 23, I learned of the Vice President's desire to visit Paris as soon as possible to initiate high-level contacts with the new Government of France. Meanwhile, we had asked Chancellor Schmidt when he was here last week to sound out the French on this subject during his visit to Paris over the weekend.

After Schmidt returned to Bonn, the Germans gave our Charge, Bill Woessner, a debriefing on Schmidt's conversations with Mitterrand. The upshot of this debrief was that the French are very eager to begin their contacts with us, but prefer to do it in Washington and at a level somewhat lower than the Mitterrand-Bush level. The French Foreign Minister, Cheysson, called our Ambassador in Paris yesterday, May 25, to convey the same message.

Most recently, the French Ambassador in Washington, Francois de Laboulaye, called on Larry Eagleburger at noon today to convey Paris' desire for an invitation for Cheysson to visit Washington within the next ten days to meet with me and with senior economic officials. I suspect that their desire to meet with economic officials stems from two concerns:

(a) the French are getting more than a little bit nervous about capital flight, the stock market, and the weakening franc; and (b) Cheysson does not want to be accused by the French Right of taking instructions from Washington.

I have since talked with the Vice President, in light of the above, who has decided to forego his plans to go to Paris in the immediate future. If you agree, I would suggest that we invite Cheysson to come to Washington to meet with me, Treasury Secretary Regan, and others on June 4-8. While he is here, we could propose that the Vice President go to Paris after the second round of French Parliamentary elections in late June for conversations with Mitterrand on the future of US-French bilateral relations. If your schedule permits, I would recommend that you give Cheysson a few minutes of your time as well while he is in Washington.

Foreign Minister

As I reported to you earlier, French Foreign Minister Cheysson expressed the desire to visit Washington before the June 14-21 French legislative elections to establish a dialogue with us. We have now agreed on a visit on June 4-6.

Since we have to be careful to give Cheysson treatment equal to what we offered Francois-Poncet last February, I hope you will be able to see Cheysson for a half-hour sometime on June 5 or 6. I will also ask the Vice President, and -- given Cheysson's interest in economic issues --Don Regan, Murray Weidenbaum and Paul Volcker to see him.

If you agree, when you see Cheysson, you could ask him to convey a message to Mitterrand that you would like to send the Vice President to Paris after the legislative elections to establish contact with him, if mutually convenient dates can be arranged. We, of course, would have to rethink this course were Mitterrand to take Communists into the Government.
