1. SECRET - ENTIRE TEXT.

SUMMARY. DEPUTY SECRETARY CLARK BRIEFED FOREIGN MINISTER GENSCHER ON HIS RECENT TALKS IN SOUTHERN AFRICA. HE STRESSED THAT THE U.S. STILL REGARDED UN RESOLUTION 435 AS THE BASIS FOR A SETTLEMENT, ALTHOUGH MODIFICATIONS MIGHT BR REQUIRED. HE HAD MADE CLEAR TO THE SOUTH AFRICAN LEADERSHIP THAT THE U.S. WOULD NOT BE PARTY TO A CHARADE OR DELIBERATE DELAY ON THEIR PART. ONCE HE HAD CONVEYED SOUTH AFRICA'S PROPOSALS TO THE SECRETARY AND THE PRESIDENT, TOGETHER WITH HIS OWN EVALUATION AND PROPOSALS, CLARK PROMISED THE USG WOULD SHARE HIS FINDINGS WITH THE CONTACT GROUP.

GENSCHER EXPRESSED HIS STRONG BELIEF THAT THE TIDE IN THE THIRD WORLD, ESPECIALLY SINCE THE SOVIET INVASION OF AFGHANISTAN, WAS RUNNING IN FAVOR OF THE WEST. HE WAS CONCERNED THAT THE ISRAELI RAID ON TUWAITHA WOULD DIVERT ARAB ATTENTION AWAY FROM THE SOVIET THREAT. IT WAS DOUBLY IMPORTANT, THEREFORE, THAT THE WEST NOT DISAPPOINT THE AFRICANS ON NAMIBIA. SUCH A DEVELOPMENT

COULD CAUSE THE THIRD WORLD TO REDEFINE ITS POSITION AND GIVE THE USSR A "HISTORIC BREATHING SPACE."

4. GENSCHER ADVISED THE U.S. TO DO MORE TO PUBLICIZE

BOTH THE THREAT POSED BY SS-20'S AND THE TALKS IT WAS HAVING WITH THE SUVIETS REGARDING THE. HE ALSO EXPRESSED ANXIETY ABOUT POLAND IN THE PERIOD LEADING UP TO THE PZPR CONGRESS AND ADVISED KEEPING THE CSCE IN SESSION PAST

THEN AS AT LEAST A MARGINAL INCENTIVE TO THE SOVIETS NOT TO INVADE. ACTION REQUESTED: SEE PARAGRAPH 22.

END SUMMARY.

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5. DEPUTY SECRETARY CLARK MET WITH FOREIGN MINISTER GENSCHER FOR NINETY MINUTES JUNE 18. THEIR MEETING, ARRANGED AT GENSCHER'S INVITATION, WAS HELD IN GENSCHER'S PRIVATE HOME. ALSO PRESENT WERE ASSISTANT SECRETARY EAGLEBURGER, CHARGE WOESSNER, STATE SECRETARY VON STADEN AND OFFICE DIRECTOR SCHENK.

6. DEPUTY SECRETARY CLARK BRIEFED FOREIGN MINISTER GENSCHER ON HIS RECENT TRIP TO SOUTHERN AFRICA. HE SAID THAT IN EXTENSIVE TALKS WITH THE SOUTH AFRICAN MINISTER

THAT IN EXTENSIVE TALKS WITH THE SOUTH AFRICAN MINISTER AND FOREIGN MINISTER, WITH VARIOUS PARTIES AND INFLUENTIAL GROUPS IN NAMIBIA, AND WITH MUGABE IN ZIMBABWE, HE HAD MADE CLEAR THAT THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION WAS STARTING FROM UN RESOLUTION 435. IT RECOGNIZED THE NEED TO MOVE THE NEGOTIATIONS OFF DEAD CENTER, BUT IT HAD NO SEPARATE PLAN. NEITHER WOULD IT BE PARTY TO A CHARADE OR DELIBERATE DELAY BY SOUTH AFRICA. ASSISTANT SECRETARIES CROCKER AND ABRAMS WWRE NOW AT WORK EVALUATING THESE TALKS AND DRAWING UP POSITIONS WHICH CLARK WOULD PRESENT TO THE PRESIDENT AND SECRETARY HAIG NEXT WEEK. A JUDGMENT WOULD HAVE TO BE REACHED ON THE SINCERITY OF THE SOUTH AFRICANS IN WANTING TO REACH A SETTLEMENT. THEREAFTER AND BEFORE

THE END OF JUNE, THE U.S. WOULD DISCUSS ITS IMPRESSIONS WITH THE CONTACT GROUP.

REGARDING THIS SESSION WITH MUGABE, CLARK NOTED THAT HE HAD RAISED CUBA THREE TIMES AND ONLY ON THE THIRD OCCASION DID MUGABE AGREE THAT HE WOULD NOT OBJECT IF THE CUBANS IN ANGOLA WENT HOME. CLARK TOLD MUGABE THAT HE COULD DO A LOT TO EXPEDITE THEIR DEPARTURE. THEIR CONTINUED PRESENCE IN ANGOLA WAS FOR THE U.S. A MAJOR STUMBLING BLOCK TO A NAMIBIAN SETTLEMENT. MUGABE TOLD CLARK HE WANTED TO CONTINUE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SETTLE-MENT PROCESS, BUT WOULD NOT WELCOME MODIFICATIONS TO 435. CLARK RESPONDED THAT WHILE 435 REMAINED THE BASIS FOR A SETTLEMENT, TWO YEARS HAD ELAPSED SINCE IT HAD BEEN PASSED, AND MODIFICATIONS OR EXTENSIONS MIGHT BE NEEDED. 8. IN RESPONSE TO A QUESTION FROM GENSCHER ABOUT SOUTH AFRICAN INTENTIONS, CLARK EXPLAINED THAT BOTHA HAD GIVEN HIM FIVE POINTS BUT THAT HE REALLY FELT OBLIGED TO PRESENT THESE FIRST TO THE PRESIDENT AND SECRETARY HAIG BEFORE SHARING THEM WITH THE CONTACT GROUP. GENSCHER EXPRESSED FULL UNDERSTANDING.

9. WHEN GENSCHER ASKED WHETHER THE SOUTH AFRICANS SAW THE REALITIES, CLARK RESPONDED THAT THEY ARE NOW MINDFUL OF BT

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AT LEAST SOME OF THE REALITIES OF THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION. THE STATEMENTS OF SOME SENATORS NOTWITHSTANDING, THE U.S. WAS NOT GOING TO GO ITS SEPARATE WAY. CLARK RELATED TO GENSCHER HOW THE SOUTH AFRICANS HAD BECOME QUITE EMOTIONAL WHEN HE REFUSED TO DON THE BUSH CLOTHES THEY HAD PROVIDED AND FLY ON THEIR HELICOPTERS TO INSPECT THE BORDER WITH MOZAMBIQUE. HE POINTED OUT THAT BY DOING SO, HE WOULD HAVE RISKED LOSING HIS CREDIBILITY WITH THE FRONT LINE THEY ACCUSED HIM OF BEING AS INSENSITIVE TO THEIR SITUATION AS THE CARTER ADMINISTRATION HAD BEEN. BUT WHEN HE THREATENED TO CUT SHORT HIS VISIT, THEY CALMED DOWN. CLARK EXPLAINED THAT THE U.S. SHARED SOUTH AFRICA'S CON-CERN THAT NAMIBIA MIGHT BECOME A SPRINGBOARD FOR THE SOVIETS AS WELL AS ITS CONCERN ABOUT SOVIET HARDWARR POURING INTO ANGOLA, BUT THAT THE U.S. ALSO HAD BROADER RESPONSIBILITIES TO CONSIDER.

GENSCHER THEN LAUNCHED INTO A LENGTHY DISCOURSE ON AFRICA AND THE MIDDLE EAST. THE SOVIETS HAD IN THE PAST YEAR SUFFERED SETBACKS IN BOTH AREAS. WAS SIGNIFICANT TRUST AMONG AFRICANS IN THE WESTERN GROUP OF FIVE. MUGABE'S ASSUMPTION OF POWER IN ZIMBABWE WAS AN ENCOURAGING EXAMPLE. MUGABE EXERTED A POSITIVE INFLUENCE ON MACHEL. ANGOLA WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE CUBANS LEAVE. HOW COULD THE WEST PROMOTE THIS? THREE TO FOUR YEARS AGO THE SOUTH AFRICANS WERE SAYING THE SAME THING ABOUT MUGABE THAT THEY'RE SAYING TODAY ABOUT SWAPO. NUJOMA IS NO MUGABE. HE DOESN'T HAVE THE SAME INTELLI-GENCE OR INTERNAL STRENGTH OF CHARACTER, BUT HE HAS GROWN IN HIS SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY. MUGABE'S INFLUENCE ON HIM IS CONSIDERABLE. IT WAS GOOD THAT CLARK WENT TO SALISBURY. HIGH-LEVEL U.S. INFLUENCE ON MUGABE WAS IMPORTANT.

11. THE SOVIETS, GENSCHEE CONTINUED, COULD NOT WISH

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MESSAGE / ANNOTATION:

FOR ANYTHING BETTER THAN THE SOUTH AFRICAN LEADERSHIP. THE SOVIETS WANT A RACIAL WAR. IN NOVEMBER 1979, GROMYKO CAME TO BONN TO COMPLAIN ABOUT THE IMPENDING NATO DECISION ON THE WAS EVEN MORE NERVOUS, HOWEVER, ABOUT CARRINGTON'S PROGRESS AT THE LANCASTER HOUSE TALKS. SOVIETS WERE AFRAID, AND RIGHTLY SD, THAT THEY WOULD LOSE INFLUENCE. FOR THE SAME REASON, THEY WOULD LOVE TO SEE THE GROUP OF FIVE INITIATIVE FAIL. IT WAS THEREFORE GENSCHER'S FIRM CONVICTION THAT 435 HAD TO BE FIRMLY AND VIGOROUSLY IMPLEMENTED. THE FIVE HAD TO STICK TOGETHER AND PUSH THEIR INITIATIVE THROUGH. THE SOUTH AFRICANS HAD BEEN HOPING THAT CHANGES IN GOVERNMENT -- IN CANADA, IN THE FRG, NOW IN THE U.S. == WOULD END THE PRESSURE ON WHAT THE U.S. DID ON THIS, HE ASSERTED, WOULD AFFECT ITS IMAGE THROUGHOUT AFRICA. GENSCHER THEN DIGRESSED INTO A DESCRIPTION OF THE GDR CONSTITUTION TO MAKE THE POINT THAT THE REALITY OF FREEDOMS BORE NO NECESSARY RELATION TO THEIR LEGAL DOCUMENTATION. HE HAD TOLL NUJOMA THAT IF HE TOOK THE SAME COURSE AS MUGABE, IF HE PROMOTED GENUINE COOPERATION BETWEEN BLACKS AND WHITES, THEN THE FRG WAS PREPARED TO HELP MAKE NAMIBIA PROPEROUS. IT WAS THE WEST'S STRENGTH THAT IT COULD ASSIST WITH ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. THIS WAS BETTER THAN ARTIFI-CIALLY CONSTRUCTED CONSTITUTIONAL GUARANTEES. 13. GENSCHER ASKED THE U.S. TO VIEW THE DECISION IT MADE REGARDING SOUTHERN AFRICA IN CONNECTION WITH WHAT WAS HAPPENING IN THE MIDDLE EAST. HE WAS DEEPLY DISTURBED OVER THE ISRAELI ATTACK ON TUWAITHA. HE HAD RECEIVED A REPORT THAT MORNING FROM THE FRG EMBASSY IN CAIRO INDI-CATING SEVERE UNHAPPINESS IN THE EGYPTIAN ARMY. RAID HAD BEEN A TERRIBLE BLOW TO SADAT, ESPECIALLY AS IT OCCURRED SO SOON AFTER HIS MEETING WITH BEGIN. IT HAD ALSO BEEN A BLOW TO RAPPROCHEMENT WITH MODERATE THE IRAQIS TOO WERE INTERESTED IN RAPPROCHEMENT WITH THE WEST, INCLUDING THE UNITED STATES. NOW THE ENTIRE ATTENTION OF THE ARAB WORLD WOULD BE DIVERTED FROM AFGHANISTAN AND THE SOVIET THREAT. THE SOVIET POSITION HAD IMPROVED WITHOUT THEIR HAVING HAD TO LIFT A FINGER. 14. SUMMING UP, GENSCHER WARNED THAT IF THESE TWO GREAT GROUPS, THE AFRICANS AND THE ARABS, WERE DISAPPOINTED IN THE WEST, THE THIRD WORLD COULD RE-DEFINE ITS POSITION, SETTING BACK THE POSITIVE DEVELOPMENTS OF THE PAST FEW YEARS. WE SHOULD NOT GIVE THE SOVIETS THIS HISTORIC BREATHING SPACE. THE WEST HAD BETTER CARDS TO PLAY THAN

THE USSR. THEREFORE, 435 HAD TO BE IMPLEMENTED. THE FRONT

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LINE STATES WERE FED UP WITH NAMIBIA. THEY WOULD BE WILL-ING TO PRESSURE SWAPD IF THE FIVE PUSHED THROUGH THEIR INITIATIVE. NAMIBIA WOULD BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR TO SOUTH ЬТ #2814 NNNN

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AFRICA, GIVING IT TIME TO STRAIGHTEN DUT ITS INTERNAL PROBLEMS. AS A MODEL, GENSCHER CITED A PLEDGE MUGABE HAD GIVEN HIM THAT HE WOULD NOT ALLOW TERRORISTS TO USE ZIMBABWE FOR RAIDS INTO SOUTH AFRICA. ZIMBABWE AND NAMIBIA, IN MUGABE'S VIEW, WERE COLONIAL PROBLEMS THAT NEEDED TO BE SOLVED. SOUTH AFRICA WAS DIFFERENT; ZIMBABWE WOULD NOT INTERFERE.

15. CLARK THANKED GENSCHER FOR HIS COMMENTS WHICH HE SAID WOULD BE VERY HELPFUL TO HIM IN PREPARING HIS REPORT TO THE PRESIDENT. HE EXPRESSED SYMPATHY FOR MUCH OF WHAT GENSCHER HAD SAID. IF THE SOVIETS DID NOT HAVE SOUTHERN AFRICA, THEY WOULD HAVE TO INVENT IT. THEIR IDEOLOGY HAD FAILED IN AFRICA. THE TWO MEN THEN EXCHANGED IMPRESSIONS ABOUT THE SOUTH AFRICAN LEADERS, AGREEING THAT THEY ARE INDEED VERY TOUGH NEGOTIATORS. CLARK OBSERVED THAT THEIR BACKS WERE TO THE WALL AND THAT IT MIGHT BE NECESSARY FOR THE WEST TO DO SOMETHING TO HELP THEM SAVE FACE. CONTRAST TO THE MIDDLE EAST PROBLEM, WHICH PEOPLE HAD BEEN TRYING TO SOLVE FOR MORE THAN THIRTY YEARS, CLARK THOUGHT THAT THE SOUTH AFRICAN QUESTION COULD BE SOLVED. PROMISED THAT IT WOULD HAVE HIS HIGHEST PRIORITY AFTER HIS RETURN TO WASHINGTON. HE WAS INTERESTED IN FINDING A SOLUTION BOTH ON LEGAL AND MORAL GROUNDS. IN RESPONSE TO QUESTIONS FROM PRIME MINISTER BOTHA, CLARK HAD PROMISED HIM THAT WHATEVER PRIVATE THOUGHTS HE MIGHT HAVE ON SOUTH AFRICAAS INTERNAL AFFAIRS, HE WOULD NOT BERATE THE SOUTH AFRICANS PUBLICLY. BOTHA, HE NOTED, HAD PROBLEMS WITH HIS RIGHT WING. GENSCHER REJUINED THAT THE SOUTH AFRICAN GOVERNMENT WAS UNDER PRESSURE FROM BOTH THE RIGHT AND THE LEFT AND THAT, IN HIS VIEW, TIME WAS RUNNING DUT. TURNING TO THE, GENSCHER SAID THAT HE HAD HEARD WITH SATISFACTION AMBASSADOR RUTH'S REPORTS ON THE RECENTLY CONCLUDED SCG. HE ASKED WHETHER SECRETARY HAIG WANTED TO

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HOLD THE TRADITIONAL MEETING OF FOUR FOREIGN MINISTERS AT THE UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY BEFORE OR AFTER HIS MEETING WITH GROMYKO. GENSCHER THOUGHT THAT A MEETING OF THE FOUR AFTERWARDS WOULD BE MOST USEFUL. THE WEST, HE SAID, HAD TO EXPECT A CONTINUATION OF THE SOVIET OFFENSIVE AGAINST THE NATO TWO-TRACK DECISION. THE WEST SHOULD USE EVERY OPPORTUNITY TO CRITICIZE THE SOVIETS PUBLICLY AND TO STRESS THE THREAT THEIR SS-2015 POSED TO WESTERN EUROPE. HE NOTED THAT THE SOVIETS HAD BACKTRACKED ON THEIR CBM OFFER AT THE CSCE AND THEN, IN FACE OF THE WEST'S CRITICISM, HAD APPEARED AT LEAST TO RESTORE SOME OF THEIR ORIGINAL OFFER. GENSCHER REPORTED THAT SOVIET AMBASSADOR SEMYDNOV HAD BEEN IN TO SEE HIM TWO DAYS EARLIER TO DIS-CUSS BREZHNEV'S PROPOSAL FOR A SCIENTIFIC FORUM TO DISCUSS THE DANGERS OF NUCLEAR DISASTERS. GENSCHER RESPONDED THAT THE FRG WOULD HAVE TO CONSULT ITS PARTNERS ABOUT THAT, BUT THAT THE USSR WOULD NOT NEED U.S. OR FRG APPROVAL TO INFORM THE WORLD OF THE DANGERS POSED BY SOVIET NUCLEAR WEAPONS. WITH EVIDENT GLEE, HE SAID HE HAD NEVER SEEN SEMYONOV SO SPEECHLESS. GENSCHER ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT POLAND. THOUGHT THE PERIOD LEADING UP TO THE PZPR CONGRESS WAS MOST DANGEROUS SINCE THE SOVIETS, ANTICIPATING AN OUTCOME NOT TO THEIR LIKING, MIGHT TRY TO OVERTHROW KANIA AND JARUZELSKI BEFORE THE CONGRESS EVER CONVENED. IT WAS ESSENTIAL, THEREFORE, THAT THE WEST MAINTAIN ITS THREE-PART POLICY OF ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE, NON-INTERVENTION, AND CONTINUATION OF EAST-WEST DIALOGUE. ON THIS LAST POINT, IT WAS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT THAT THERE BE NO SUMMER BREAK AT CSCE BEFORE THE PZPR CONGRESS. EAGLEBURGER THOUGHT IT LIKELY THE CSCE WOULD CONTINUE INTO AUGUST. 18. GENSCHER THOUGHT THAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE HAD MADE A HISTORIC MISTAKE IN 1956. THEIR ATTACK ON SUEZ HAD GIVEN THE SOVIETS A FREE HAND IN HUNGARY. ALTHOUGH THE SITUA-TIONS WERE NOT EXACTLY PARALLEL, THE WEST MUST DO NOTHING NOW TO DIVERT WORLD ATTENTION FROM POLAND. IN A VERY RESPONSIBLE WAY, IT WAS NECESSARY TO KEEP THE POLISH SITUATION UNDER CONTROL. 19. NOTING THAT HE WOULD BE IN BULGARIA JULY 8-10 FOR LONG TALKS WITH ZHIVKOV, GENSCHER SAID HE WOULD APPRECIATE RECEIVING A U.S. ASSESSMENT OF EAST-WEST RELATIONS BEFORE TALKING TO ZHIVKOV, HE SAID, WAS THE SAME AS TALK-

ING TO BREZHNEV. EAGLEBURGER PROMISED TO PROVIDE HIM

20. EAGLEBURGER NOTED THAT THE SOVIETS CONTINUED TO SAY

WITH SUCH AN ASSESSMENT.

THESE COUNTRIES WERE RICH, APEL SAID, AND IT WOULD DO NO GOOD FOR THE UNITED STATES, THE UK AND THE FRG TO BE THE ONLY COUNTRIES RESPONDING. IN THAT CASE THERE WOULD BE NO ALLIANCE. OTHERS SHOULD DO THEIR TASK TOO. THE FRG CONTRIBUTION HAD, HE THOUGHT, BEEN REMARKABLE. APEL REMPHASIZED THE THEME OF ALLIANCE UNITY AND NOTED WITH A TOUCH OF SARCASM THAT AT THE LATEST NPG SOME SMALL COUNTRIES HAD APPEARED TO TAKE AN ANTI-NUCLEAR POSITION. APEL SAID HE FELT STRONGLY THAT SUCH AN ATTITUDE UNDERCUT THE ALLIANCE DETERRENT ABILITY.

THE BUDGET PROCESS.

IV. RESPONDING TO THE REMARKS OF DEPSECDEF ABOUT THE DEEP CUTS PLANNED BY THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION IN THE SOCIAL SECTOR, APEL SAID THAT SUCH CUTS WOULD NOT BE POSSIBLE IN WESTERN EUROPE. HE EVEN ENTERTAINED SOME DOUBT THAT THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION WOULD BE ABLE TO ACHIEVE ITS OBJECTIVES. DEPSECDEF MENTIONED THE DIFFICULTIES OF A SIMILAR BUDGET PARING EFFORT IN 197% BUT POINTED OUT THAT CONDITIONS NOW WERE VERY DIFFERENT. HE EXPRESSED THE CONVICTION THAT WITH THE CURRENT STRONG PRESIDENTIAL LEADERSHIP AND A NEW PSYCHOLOGY, THE PRESIDENTIS PROPOSALS WOULD HAVE A QUBSTANTIAL CHANCE OF SUCCESS.

18. APPL EXPRESSED APPRECIATION THAT DEPSECDEF HAD COME TO BONN, NOTING THE VISIT HAD BEEN HIGHLY USEFUL. HE SAID HE LOOKED FORWARD TO CONTINUING THE DISCUSSION DURING HIS FORTHCOMING VISIT TO WASHINGTON IN MARCH. MOESSNER UNQUOTE BROWN

- 2. THE SITUATION IN BANJUL REMAINS UNCERTAIN. THE SENEGALESE NOW HAVE 1,410 TROOPS ON THE GROUND. THEY HAVE SECURED THE AIRPORT. 

- 1. FOLLOWING JOINT STATEMENT RELEASED IN WASHINGTON MAY 22 PROVIDED FOR POSTS! USE: "VISIT TO THE UNITED STATES OF HELMUT SCHMIDT, CHANCELOR OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY, MAY 20-23, 1981".
- 2. DURING THE OFFICIAL VISIT OF CHANCELLOR HELMUT SCHMIDT OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY TO THE UNITED STATES FROM MAY 20-23, 1981, PRESIDENT REAGAN AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR HELD DETAILED TALKS ON A WIDE RANGE OF POLITITICAL AND ECONOMIC QUESTIONS. THEY NOTED WITH SATISFACTION THAT THEY SHARED A COMMON ASSESSMENT OF THE INTERNATIONAL SITUATION AND ITS IMPLICATIONS FOR THE WESTERN ALLIANCE. THEY AGREED THAT THEIR TWO COUNTRIES HAVE A COMMON DESTINY FOUNDED ON JOINT SECURITY INTERESTS AND FIRMLY ROOTED IN THEIR SHARED VALUES OF LIBERTY, A DEMOCRATIC WAY OF LIFE, SELF-DETERMINATION AND BELIEF IN THE INALIENABLE RIGHTS OF MAN.
- 3. THEY REGARD THE RELIABLE AND PROVEN US-GERMAN PARTNERS SHIP AS AN ESSENTIAL FACTOR IN INTERNATIONAL STABILITY AND

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MESSAGE / ANNOTATION!

WESTERN SECURITY BASED ON THE NORTH ATLANTIC ALLIANCE.

THEY AGREED THAT SUBSTANTIVE AND EFFECTIVE CONSULTATIONS ARE A MAINSTAY OF THE RELATIONS BETWEEN WESTERN EUROPE AND THE UNITED STATES.

4. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR WELCOMED AND REAFFIRMED THE RESULTS OF THE RECENT NATO MINISTERIAL MEETINGS IN ROME AND BRUSSELS AS RENEWED PROOF OF THE POLITICAL STRENGTH OF THE ALLIANCE AND THE CONTINUITY OF ALLIANCE POLICY. THEY STRESSED THE DETERMINATION OF ALLIANCE MEMBERS TO TAKE THE NECESSARY STEPS TO WORK WITH THEIR NATO PARTNERS TO STRENGTHEN THE WESTERN DEFENSE POSTURE AND TO ADDRESS ADVERSE TRENDS DUE THE SOVIET MILITARY BUILDUP. TOGETHER WITH DETERRENCE AND DEFENSE, ARMS CONTROL AND DISARMAMENT ARE INTEGRAL PARTS OF ALLIANCE SECURITY POLICY.

5. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR AFFIRMED IN THIS CONNECTION THEIR RESOLVE TO IMPLEMENT BOTH ELEMENTS OF THE NATO DECISION OF DECEMBER 1979 AND TO GIVE EQUAL WEIGHT TO BOTH ELEMENTS. THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR WELCOMED THE US DECISION TO BEGIN NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE SOVIET UNION ON THE LIMITATION OF THEATER NUCLEAR WEAPONS WITHIN THE SALT FRAMEWORK BY THE END OF THIS YEAR. HE ALSO WELD COMED THE FACT THAT THE U.S. SECRETARY OF STATE HAS INITIATED PREPARATORY DISCUSSIONS ON THE WITH THE SOVIET UNION, LOOKING TOWARD AN AGREEMENT TO BEGIN FORMAL NEGO-TIATIONS. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR AGREED THAT THE MODERNIZATION IS ESSENTIAL FOR ALLIANCE SECURITY AND AS A BASIS FOR PARALLEL NEGOTIATIONS LEADING TO CON-CRETE RESULTS ON LIMITATIONS OF THEATER NUCLEAR FORCES. THEY FURTHER AGREED THAT THE PREPARATORY STUDIES CALLED FOR IN THE ROME COMMUNIQUE SHOULD BE UNDERTAKEN AS MATTERS OF IMMEDIATE PRIORITY BY THE RELEVANT NATO BODIES.

6. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR ASSESSED VERY FAVORABLY THE CLOSE COOPERATION BETWEEN THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY AND THE THREE POWERS IN MATTERS RELATING TO BERLIN AND GERMANY AS A WHOLE. THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR THANKED THE PRESIDENT FOR HIS REAFFIRMATION OF THE PLEDGE THAT THE UNITED STATES WILL CONTINUE TO GUARANTEE THE SECURITY AND VIABILITY OF BERLIN. THEY AGREED THAT THE MAINTENANCE OF THE CALM SITUATION IN AND AROUND BERLIN IS OF CRUCIAL SIGNIFICANCE FOR EUROPEAN SECURITY

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AND STABILITY.

7. THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY PLAYS AN IMPORTANT PART IN MAINTAINING INTERNATIONAL POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC STABILITY. THE US WILL CONTINUE TO SUPPORT THE PROCESS OF

EUROPEAN UNIFICATION.

8. BOTH SIDES NOTED THAT A SERIOUS INTERNATIONAL SITUATION HAS BEEN CREATED BY SOVIET EXPANSIONISM AND ARMAMENTS EFFORTS. TO MEET THIS CHALLENGE AND TO SECURE PEACE; THEY ARE DETERMINED TO RESPOND WITH FIRMNESS AND TO MAINTAIN A DIALOGUE WITH THE SOVIET UNION.

9. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR AGREED THAT IT IS IMPORTANT FOR THE STABILIZATION OF EAST-WEST RELATIONS THAT THE CURRENT CSCE REVIEW CONFERENCE IN MADRID AGREE ON A BALANCED SUBSTANTIVE CONCLUDING DOCUMENT WHICH INCLUDES ENHANCED RESPECT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, INCREASED HUMAN CONTACTS, A FREER FLOW OF INFORMATION, AND COOPERATION AMONG AND SECURITY FOR ALL OF THE PARTICIPANTS. IN THIS REGARD, AND AS PART OF SUCH A BALANCED RESULT, THE PRESIDENT AND THE CHANCELLOR FAVOR AGREEMENT ON A PRECISE MANDATE FOR A CONFERENCE ON DISARMAMENT IN EUROPE, PROVIDING FOR THE APPLICATION OF MILITARILY SIGNIFICANT, BINDING AND VERIFIABLE CONFIDENCE—BUILDING MEASURES COVERING ALL OF THE CONTINENT OF EUROPE FROM THE ATLANTIC TO THE URALS.

10. POLAND MUST BE ALLOWED TO SOLVE ITS PROBLEMS PEACE-FULLY AND WITHOUT EXTERNAL INTERFERENCE. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR REAFFIRMED UNEQUIVOCALLY THEIR VIEW THAT ANY EXTERNAL INTERVENTION WOULD HAVE THE GRAVEST CONSEQUENCES FOR INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND WOULD FUNDAMENTALLY CHANGE THE ENTIRE INTERNATIONAL SITUATION.

11. GENUINE NONACIGNMENT OF THE STATES OF THE DEVELOPING WORLD IS AN IMPORTANT STABILIZING FACTOR IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS. THE CHANCELLOR AND THE PRESIDENT SUPPORT THE INDEPENDENCE AND THE RIGHT OF SELF-DETERMINATION OF THE STATES OF THE DEVELOPING WORLD. THEY WILL, IN CONCERT WITH THEIR ALLIES AND THE COUNTRIES AFFECTED, OPPOSE ANY ATTEMPTS, DIRECT OR INDIRECT, BY THE SOVIET UNION TO UNDERMINE THE INDEPENDENCE AND STABILITY OF THESE STATES. THEY CONFIRMED THEIR WILLINGNESS TO CONTINUE THEIR

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COOPERATION WITH THESE STATES ON THE BASIS OF EQUAL PARTNERSHIP AND TO CONTINUE THEIR SUPPORT OF THEIR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

12. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR REAFFIRMED THEIR VIEW THAT THE SOVIET OCCUPATION OF AFGHANISTAN IS UNACCEPTABLE. THEY DEMANDED THE WITHDRAWAL OF SOVIET TROOPS FROM AFGHANISTAN AND RESPECT FOR THAT COUNTRY'S

RIGHT TO RETURN TO INDEPENDENCE AND NONALIGNMENT. THE DESTABILIZING EFFECTS WHICH THE SOVIET INTERVENTION IN AFGHANISTAN HAS ON THE ENTIRE REGION MUST BE COUNTERED.

- 13. BOTH SIDES STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF BROAD-BASED COOPERATION WITH THE STATES OF THE GULF REGION.
- 14. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR AGREED THAT THE UNITED STATES AND THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY, THE LATTER WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF EUROPEAN POLITICAL COOPERATION, SHOULD CONTINUE THE SEARCH FOR A COMPREHENSIVE, JUST AND LASTING PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST. THEIR EFFORTS SHOULD CONTINUE TO BE COMPLEMENTARY AND BUILD UPON WHAT HAS BEEN ACHIEVED SO FAR.
- 15. BOTH SIDES REAFFIRMED THE DETERMINATION TO STRENGTHEN FURTHER THE OPEN SYSTEM OF WORLD TRADE AND TO OPPOSE PRESSURE FOR PROTECTIONIST MEASURES.
- 16. THEY STRESSED THE VITAL IMPORTANCE FOR POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC STABILITY OF FURTHER ENERGY CONSERVATION AND DIVERSIFICATION MEASURES TO REDUCE THE HIGH DEGREE OF DEPENDENCE ON DIL. THE PRESSING ENERGY PROBLEMS CAN ONLY BE MASTERED ON THE BASIS OF WORLD-WIDE COOPERATIVE EFFORTS THAT STRENGTHEN WESTERN ENERGY SECURITY AND REDUCE THE VULNERABILITY OF THE WEST TO POTENTIAL SUPPLY CUTOFFS FROM ANY SOURCE. THE SUPPLY PROBLEMS OF THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES REQUIRE PARTICULAR ATTENTION.
- 17. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR AGREED ON THE NEED IN FRAMING THEIR ECONOMIC POLICIES TO GIVE HIGH PRIORITY TO THE FIGHT AGAINST INFLATION AND TO THE CREATION OF IMPROVED CONDITIONS FOR RENEWED ECONOMIC GROWTH AND INCREASED PRODUCTIVITY. BOTH SIDES STRESSED THE NEED FOR CLOSE COORDINATION OF ECONOMIC POLICIES AMONG THE INDUSTRIAL COUNTRIES.

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18. BUTH SIDES STRESSED THE NEED FOR A CLOSE AND COMPRE-HENSIVE EXCHANGE OF VIEWS ON THE UN CONFERENCE ON THE LAW OF THE SEA WHILE THE US GOVERNMENT REVIEWS ITS POSITION.

19. THE PRESIDENT AND THE FEDERAL CHANCELLOR NOTED THAT THEIR TALKS ONCE MORE DEMONSTRATED THE FRIENDLY AND TRUSTING RELATIONSHIP THAT HAS LINKED THEIR TWO COUNTRIES FOR OVER 30 YEARS. THEY WELCOMED ALL EFFORTS WHICH SERVE TO BROADEN MUTUAL CONTACTS AND UNDERLINED THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE COMING GENERATION FOR MAINTAINING AND DEVELOPING GERMAN-AMERICAN FRIENDSHIP. HAIG BT #4223 NNNN

1. SECRETARY HAIG CALLED IN SOVIET AMBASSADOR DOBRYNIN ON APRIL 21 TO ADVISE HIM OF PRESIDENT REAGAN'S INTENTION TO ANNOUNCE THE LIFTING UF THE EMBARGO ON GRAIN SALES TO THE USSR. POINTING OUT THAT THIS IN NO WAY ALTERED OUR OPPOSITION TO THE SOVIET INVASION OF AFGHANISTAN OR OUR CONCERN OVER THE POSSIBILITY OF A SOVIET INTERVENTION IN POLAND, SECRETARY HAIG SAID THAT THE PRESIDENT WAS ACTING IN FULFILLMENT OF A COMMITMENT THAT HE HAD MADE TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE DURING THE CAMPAIGN. THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, WHICH AS IN THE PAST RULES OUT GERMAN CONTROL OVER CHEMICAL WEAPONS, WILL CONTINUE TO PRESS FOR ARMS CONTROL AGREEMENTS WHICH WILL COMPRISE A COMPREHENSIVE AND VERIFIABLE BAN ON THE DEVELOPMENT, MANUFACTURE AND STOCKPTLING OF CHEMICAL WEAPONS.

TAM ALSO CONVINCED, HOWEVER, IN VIEW OF THE GROWING THREAT, THAT THE WESTERN DEFENSIVE ALLIANCE CANNOT FOREGO AN UP-TO-DATE CHEMICAL WEAPONS RETALIATORY CAPABILITY UNTIL SUCH TIME AS SUCH A BAN HAS BEEN AGREED. THE OBJECT OF SUCH A CAPABILITY IS TO HAVE AVAILABLE WEAPONS OF COMPARABLE QUALITY WHICH WILL DETER THE WARSAW PACT FROM USING CHEMICAL WEAPONS IN CONTRAVENTION OF INTERNATIONAL LAW. FOR THIS REASON THE MODERNIZATION OF US CHEMICAL WEAPON STOCKS, WHICH IS A DECISION OF YOUR GOVERNMENT ALONE, DESERVES THE SUPPORT OF THE ALLIES.

AS YOU YOURSELF INTIMATED IN YOUR LETTER, A PUBLIC DISCUSSION ON CHEMICAL WEAPONS AT THE PRESENT TIME MIGHT ALSO PROVE CONTROVERSIAL IN THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY AND FURTHER COMPLICATE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NATO'S TWO-TRACK DECISION OF 1979. IT THEREFORE SEEMS IMPORTANT TO ME THAT THIS QUESTION BE HANDLED WITH RESTRAINT, BUT IN PARTICULAR THAT THERE SHOULD BE CLOSE CONSULTATIONS WITH THE ALLIES IN THE FORM YOU HAVE SUGGESTED ABOUT ANY DECISION WHICH MAY HAVE TO BE TAKEN IN SEVERAL YEARS' TIME ON THE DEPLOYMENT OF MODERNIZED CHEMICAL WEAPONS. SINCERELY, (SGD.) HANS-DIETRICH GENSCHER.END TEXT.

MEETING OPENED WITH ONE HOUR TETE-A-TETE FOLLOWED BY ONE AND A HALF HOUR GROUP DISCUSSION IN WHICH OTHERS TAKING PART

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MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

WERE, ON THE US SIDE, UNDER SECRETARY STDESSEL, UNDER SECRETARY RASHISH, ASSISTANT SECRETARY DESIGNATE EAGLEBURGER AND EUR/CE DIRECTOR NILES, AND ON THE GERMAN SIDE, AMBASSADOR HERMES, POLITICAL DIRECTOR BLECH, ECONOMIC DIRECTOR FISCHER, BLECH'S SUCCESSOR PFEFFER, GENSCHER AIDES WALLOU AND PASCHKE AND INTERPRETER WEBER. FOLLOWING LUNCHEDN, THE SECRETARY AND GENSCHER MET WITH THE PRESIDENT, AFTER WHICH THEY MET WITH THE PRESS AT THE WHITE HOUSE, GENSCHER HOSTED RETURN DINNER THAT NIGHT. END SUMMARY.

SUMMARY OF PRIVATE MEETING

(8) SECRETARY OPENED LARGER MEETING WITH BRIEF REVIEW OF HIS PRIVATE DISCUSSION WITH GENSCHER, STRES-SING OVERRIDING IMPORTANCE OF US-FRG RELATIONS FOR THE WESTERN ALLIANCE. TURNING TO CURRENT PROBLEMS, HE CITED IMPORTANCE OF PROCEEDING WITH BOTH TRACKS OF THE DECEMBER 1979 LRTNF DECISION AND ADVISED GENSCHER OF OUR INTENTION TO CALL AN EARLY MEETING OF THE SCG MARCH 31. HE REASSURED GENSCHER OF DUR CONFIDENCE IN THE FRG AS AN ALLY, ADDING THAT WE REGARDED INITIAL PRESS REPORTS OF CUTS IN FRG DEFENSE BUDGET AS "MISCHIEF MAKING BY THE PRESS." TURNING TO BREZHNEV'S LETTERS TO WESTERN HEADS OF GOVERNMENT, HE STRESSED THE NEED FOR EARLY CONSULTATIONS SO THE SUBSTANCE OF ALLIED RESPONSES WOULD BE THE SAME. ON QUESTION OF POSSIBLE US-SOVIET SUMMIT, SECRETARY NOTED OUR MEASURED AND CAUTIOUS APPROACH AND NEED FOR MANIFESTATION OF SOVIET MODERATION, NOT ONLY AS FAR AS POLAND AND AFGHANISTAN ARE CONCERNED BUT ALSO ON SO-CALLED "WARS OF NATIONAL LIBERATIONS SUCH AS WE NOW SEE IN EL SALVADOR. HE NOTED US-FRG AGREEMENT ON PROPOSED MINI-SUMMIT AND ASSURED GENSCHER THAT WHILE HE COULD NOT AT THIS TIME ENDORSE ANY PARTICULAR BASING MODE, GERMANA COULD BE ASSURED THAT WE WOULD NOT ABANDON OUR LAND-BASED STRATEGIC DETERRENT, ON QUESTION OF ABMIS AND THE SALT IVII LIMITATIONS, HE REFERRED TO OUR STATEMENT LAST WEEK OF AFFIRMING ADHERENCE TO THE LIMITATIONS PROVIDED THE SOVIETS DO THE SAME. THIS CONTEXT, HE OBSERVED THAT ABMS QUESTION WAS PARTICULARLY DIFFICULT FOR THE FRENCH (GENSCHER REFERRED TO IT AS "CRUCIAL" FOR FRANCE) AND SAID HE HAD DISCUSSED IT WITH FRANCOIS-PONCET. FINALLY, HE NOTED

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MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

THAT HE AND GENSCHER HAD DISCUSSED POLAND, INCLUDING QUESTION OF FURTHER ASSISTANCE AND OUR THINKING ON FORTHCOMING VISIT BY DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER JAGIELSKI TO THE UNITED STATES.

CENTRALITY OF US RELATIONSHIP FOR THE GERMAN GOVERNMENT.
HE EXPRESSED GREAT APPRECIATION FOR SCG DECISION AND
STRESSED NEED TO MOVE AHEAD WITH GENEVA THE TALKS
"WITHOUT DELAY" IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN PUBLIC SUPPORT FOR
MODERNIZATION. TURNING TO A FAVORITE THEME, HE NOTED
NEED TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE BREZHNEY CONCESSION ON
CDE ZONE OF APPLICABILITY, SUGGESTING THAT HAD THE
UNITED STATES NOT JOINED ALLIED CONSENSUS ON CDE,
BREZHNEY CONCESSION WOULD HAVE NEVER MATERIALIZED.

SECRETARY HAIG OBSERVED THAT WE WILL HAVE TO DETERMINE IN MADRID WHETHER THE ATLANTIC ENDS AT SAN FRANCISCO OR OMAHA. GENSCHER ALSO STATED HIS SATISFACTION WITH US POSTTION ON PROPOSED US-SOVIET SUMMIT AND NORTH/SOUTH MINI-SUMMIT. REGARDING LATTER, HE ASKED WHEN WE PLANNED TO NOTIFY MEXICO AND WAS INFORMED THAT UNDER SECRETARY RASHISH WOULD BE GOING TO MEXICO CITY MARCH 11 FOR THAT PURPOSE.

POLAND

TURNING TO POLAND. GENSCHER SUGGESTED THAT THE SITUATION AGAIN IS IN HIGHLY UNCERTAIN PHASE AND SAID FRG WAS CONCERNED OVER IMPLICATIONS IN COMMUNIQUE ON SOVIET-POLISH MEETING THAT SOVIET CONFIDENCE IN POLISH LEADERSHIP WAS WANING. SECRETARY AGREED THAT OUR PREVIOUS WARNINGS HAD BEEN INSTRUMENTAL IN PREVENTING INTERVENTION IN DECEMBER AND SAID WE SHARED GERMAN CONCERNS OVER BOTH EXERCISE PREPARATIONS AND INTERNAL MEASURES

DEVELOPED BY POLISH LEADERSHIP. GENSCHER REAFFIRMED THAT HE PLANNED TO PROCEED WITH MARCH 19-20 VISIT TO WARSAW UNLESS UNEXPECTED EVENTS INTERVENED.

5. CS.E. THE SECRETARY NOTED OUR SUPPORT FOR FRENCH CDE PROPOSAL, WHICH HE SAID HAD REAL AND PROPAGANDA ADVANTAGES FROM WESTERN POINT OF VIEW. GENSCHER AGREED THAT WE SHOULD USE THE HELSINKI FINAL ACT IN AN "OFFENSIVE" SENSE AGAINST THE SOVIETS BECAUSE THE WEST CAN IMPLEMENT ALL OF THE HELSINKI DOCUMENT WITHOUT DIFFICULTY WHILE IT POSES GRAVE PROBLEMS FOR THE EAST. HE URGED THAT ALLIES PUSH AHEAD IN MADRID ON BASIS OF BREZHNEV CONCESSION.

6. MBFR. ON MBFR, THE SECRETARY QBSERVED THAT NEGOTIATIONS HAVE SERVED A UNIFYING PURPOSE WITHIN NATO AND ADDED WE WOULD WISH TO CONTINUE TO UTILIZE THIS FORUM BOTH FOR ITS OWN SAKE AND AS A MODEL FOR ALLIED CONSULTATIONS. REFLECTING HIS TRADITIONAL

ATTITUDE, GENSCHER AGREED THAT MBFB WAS USEFUL IN PRESERVING WESTERN UNITY. HE POINTED OUT, HOWEVER, THAT SOVIETS SAW MBFR PRIMARILY AS MEANS TO IMPOSE LIMITS ON THE BUNDESWEHR, AND HE EXPRESSED PARTICULAR OPPOSITION TO PROPOSED 50 PERCENT RULE (ORIGINALLY SUGGESTED BY CHANCELLOR SCHMIDT) UNDER WHICH NO INDIVIDUAL ALLY COULD HAVE MORE THAN 50 PERCENT OF THE REMAINING FORCES FOLLOWING A REDUCTION AGREEMENT. IF THIS WERE SO, GENSCHER SAID, IN EVENT OF WITHDRAWAL OF US FORCES, WHICH HE SAID COULD NOT BE EXCLUDED, THIS COULD FORCE REDUCTIONS IN THE BUNDESWEHR IN ORDER TO KEEP UNDER THE 50 PERCENT CEILING. THE SECRETARY SAID THAT WE WERE ALSO SKEPTICAL OF LIKELY OUTCOME IN MOFR BUT FELT THAT THE FORUM COULD BE

7. (R) ECONOMIC RELATIONS (PROPOSED GAS PIPELINE).
THE SECRETARY NOTED THAT PROPOSED GAS PIPELINE WAS A
SENSITIVE INTERNAL QUESTION IN THE FRG. WHILE WE DID

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MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

NOT INTEND TO BECOME INVOLVED, DESPITE EFFORTS BY SOME FRE OPPOSITION POLITICIANS, WE WERE CONCERNED ABOUT DEPENDENCE UPON SOVIET GAS SUPPLIES AS GREATER A RESULT OF THIS PROJECT. HE URGED THAT, AS LONG AS THE POLISH SITUATION REMAINS SO UNCERTAIN, THE GERMANS MOVE SLOWLY ON THIS PROJECT. IN REPLY, GENSCHER REITERATED FRG CONTENTION THAT DEPENDENCY QUESTION HAD BEEN CAREFULLY EXAMINED AND THAT SOVIET SHARE OF UP TO 30 PERCENT OF GAS SUPPLY WAS FOUND TO BE "ACCEPTABLE AND TOLERABLE." HE CLAIMED THE FRENCH AGREED WITH THIS CONCLUSION, AND ADDED THAT IT WAS IMPOSSIBLE AT THIS POINT TO PREDICT HOW VERY COMPLICATED NEGOTIATIONS WOULD PROCEED. ECONOMICS MINISTER LAMBSDORFF, HE BAID, WOULD BE PREPARED TO DISCUSS THE PROJECT IN GREATER DETAIL WITH US OFFICIALS, BUT HE STRESSED AGAIN FACT THAT FRG AUTHORITIES HAD VERY CAREFULLY EVALUATED THIS PROJECT. HE ASKED THAT US HELP WESTERN EUROPEANS DIVERSIFY GAS SUPPLY BY PERSUADING NORWAY TO BE MORE FORTHCOMING. THE SECRETARY SUGGESTED THAT BOTH THE UK AND NORWAY COULD RE HELPFUL ON RESOURCES AND PRICING.

ALLIED MILTTARY QUESTIONS

8. (8) THE SECRETARY ADVISED GENSCHER THAT HE HAD
THREE MINOR POINTS INVOLVING US WEAPONS PROGRAMS
WHICH WOULD BECOME PUBLIC KNOWLEDGE FROM THE NEW
DEFENSE BUDGET AND WHICH COULD CAUSE PROBLEMS FOR THE

GERMANS IF THEY WERE NOT PREVIOUSLY INFORMED. HE
CITED (A) SLCM DEVELOPMENT, WHICH HE CHARACTERIZED
AS A CONVENTIONAL PROGRAM NOT OF IMMEDIATE CONCERN
TO THE FRG; (B) DEVELOPMENT OF BINARY CHEMICAL
WEAPONS, WHICH HE POINTED OUT WAS A FIVE YEAR LONG.
TERM PROGRAM ON WHICH NO DEPLOYMENT DECISION HAD BEEN
MADE. HE EX, LAINED THAT WE WERE UNDERTAKING THIS
PROGRAM BECAUSE OF WHAT WE CONSIDERED TO BE INCREASING
WESTERN VULNERABILITY, ADDING THAT IF WE DID NOT
MODERNIZE IN THIS AREA THERE WOULD BE NO HOPE FOR
NEGOTIATING RESTRAINTS WITH THE SOVIETS; AND (C) ERW,
ON WHICH HE ADVISED GENSCHER THAT ALL US IS UNDERTAKING CURRENTLY IS PRODUCTION OF COMPONENTS. NO
DEPLOYMENT DECISION HAD BEEN MADE, AND HE SAID WE

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MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

WERE VERY WELL AWARE OF THE PROBLEMS ERW HAS CAUSED AND CAN CAUSE FOR OUR ALLIES. ON LATTER POINT, GENSCHER SAID HE WOULD NEVER FORGET HIS 1975 INVOLVEMENT IN THIS ISSUE.

Q. CON RDF COMMAND. REGARDING RDF, THE SECRETARY
SAID HE BELIEVED THAT SACEUR SHOULD BE IN COMMAND
NOT REPEAT NOT BECAUSE HIS TROOPS IN EUROPE WOULD
BE DEPLOYED TO OTHER AREAS BUT BECAUSE SACEUR WAS
UNIQUELY SITUATED GEOGRAPHICALLY AND IN TERMS OF
HIS POLITICAL/MILITARY CONTACTS TO COMMAND THIS FORCE.
IT WAS IMPORTANT, THE SECRETARY POINTED OUT, THAT THE
COMMANDER OF THE RDF BE AWARE OF IMPLICATIONS OF
RDF DEPLOYMENTS FOR SITUATION IN EUROPE. SACEUR
WAS, CONSEQUENTLY, BEST ABLE TO EXERCISE THIS
RESPONSIBILITY. GENSCHER SAID HE FOUND THIS
ARGUMENTATION CONVINCING AND SAID HE THOUGHT IT WAS
IMPORTANT THAT US EXPLAIN DECISION ON THIS TO THE
ALLIES IF SACEUR WERE DESIGNATED AS COMMANDER OF RDF.

10. (R) ON QUESTION OF POSSIBLE BEDUCTION OF US FORCES IN EUROPE, THE SECRETARY SAID HE FULLY UNDER-STOOD THAT ANY REDUCTION WOULD HAVE AN ENORMOUS PSYCHOLOGICAL IMPACT IN EUROPE. GENSCHER SAID HE SHARED THIS VIEW ENTIRELY.

11. (R) FRG DEFENSE BUDGET. REFERRING TO DEFENSE MINISTER APEL'S ANNOUNCEMENT OF CHANGES IN WEAPONS PROCUREMENT SCHEDULES, GENSCHER SAID APEL WOULD EXPLAIN THESE DECISIONS HIMSELF DURING HIS MARCH 23-25 VISIT. HE ADDED, HOWEVER, THAT HE WANTED THE SECRETARY TO KNOW THAT THE FRG WOULD CARRY OUT ITS NATO PROGRAMS, CITING IN PARTICULAR "TORNADO" AND LEOPARD II. ACQUISITION OF SEVENTH

AND EIGHTH FRIGATES WOULD BE DELAYED AND "ROLAND"
WOULD GO ONLY TO THE ARMY. HE CONFIRMED THAT THE
FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAD REACHED POSITIVE DECISION
ON ALL EIGHT POINTS OF AMBASSADOR STOESSEL'S
NOVEMBER 4, 1960 HOST NATION SUPPORT DEMARCHE AND SAID
APEL WOULD BE PREPARED TO DISCUSS THE DETAILS. THE

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MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

SECRETARY SAID HE WELCOMED THIS EXPLANATION, ADDING THAT WE WERE NOT ALARMED BY PRESS REPORTS. HE SAID WE ARE PLEASED WITH DECISION ON HOST NATION SUPPORT IN VIEW OF URGENT NEEDS TO IMPROVE FORCE DEPLOYMENT ON GENERAL SUBJECT OF DEFENSE AND LIVING CONDITIONS. BURDEN, HE STRESSED NEED TO AVOID GIVING SKEPTICS IN OUR CONGRESS AMMUNITION ON ISSUE OF ALLIED ALL NATO MEMBERS MUST DO MORE FOR BURDENSHARING. COMMON DEFENSE, DESPITE DIFFICULT ECONOMIC SITUATIONS THROUGHOUT THE ALLIANCE, HE ADDED. THE THREE PERCENT DEFENSE SPENDING TARGET HAD LED TO UNNECESSARY DISPUTES BETWEEN THE US AND THE FRE AND REFLECTED A LACK OF UNDERSTANDING IN WASHINGTON OF HOW THE FRG PLANNING PROCESS WORKS.

INNER-GERMAN RELATIONS

AT THE SECRETARY'S REQUEST, DENSCHER REVIEWED CURRENT STATE OF INNER GERMAN RELATIONS, STRESSING IN PARTICULAR THAT THIS RELATIONSHIP COULD NOT BE ISOLATED FROM OVERALL EAST-WEST SITUATION. NOTED RELATIVELY HARSH GDR MOVES VISHA-VIS FRG IN OCTOBER AND NOVEMBER OF LAST YEAR, WHICH HE ATTRIBUTED PRIMARILY TO GOR ASSUMPTION THAT WARSAW PACT INTER-VENTION IN POLAND WAS LIKELY AND THAT EASTERN COUNTRIES SHOULD "PREPARE FOR IT." HE ADDED THAT EAST GERMANS ARE NOW MOVING IN A MORE POSITIVE DIRECTION, CITING HONECKER'S REMARKS TO BOELLING. ERG WOULD CONTINUE TO SEEK IMPROVED RELATIONS WITH THE GDR BUT GENSCHER ASSURED THE SECRETARY THAT BONN WAS QUITE WELL AWARE THAT GOR WOULD USE TACTIC OF OFFERING HUMANITARIAN CONCESSIONS IN EXCHANGE FOR FRG ABANDONMENT OF THE SUCH AN ARRANGEMENT WAS OUT OF THE QUESTION, HE SAID. TURNING TO THE SITUATION IN BERLIN, GENSCHER OBSERVED THAT CALM ATMOSPHERE HAD PERSISTED DESPITE DOWNHTURN IN EAST-WEST RELATIONS. HE URGED THAT GOVERNING MAYOR VOGEL AND MAYOR BRUNNER BE GIVEN HIGH-LEVEL TREATMENT WHEN THEY VISIT WASHINGTON IN ORDER TO DEMONSTRATE US SUPPORT FOR BERLIN THE SECRETARY SAID HE SHARED GENSCHER'S GENERAL ASSESSMENT AND SAID THAT WE WOULD DO OUR BEST

TO ENSURE APPROPRIATE PROGRAM FOR VOGEL AND BRUNNER.

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MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

AS FAR AS US-GOR RELATIONS WERE CONCERNED, THE SECRETARY NOTED THAT WE ARE MOVING IN A MEASURED WAY AND WOULD BE GUIDED BY PRG CONCERNS. IN THIS CONNECTION, HE NOTED OUR UNHAPPINESS WITH GOR INVOLVEMENT IN SOME COUNTRIES OF THIS HEMISPHERE, TO WHICH GENSCHER ADDED THAT GOR INVOLVMENT WAS BY NO MEANS RESTRICTED TO LATIN AMERICA.

TURKEY

13. (6) ON TURKEY, THE SECRETARY EXPRESSED THANKS FOR GENSCHER'S RECENT LETTER AND HIS ASSURANCES THAT FRG WOULD CONTINUE ACTIVE SUPPORT OF TURKEY. WHICH HE SAID REPRESENTED CONTINUATION OF LONG-TERM POSITIVE GERMAN ROLE IN THIS SITUATION. GENSCHER REPORTED THAT HE HAD MET ON MARCH & WITH FIVE-MEMBER BUNDESTAG DELEGATION WHICH HAD JUST VISITED TURKEY CONE MEMBER WAS "RATHER LEFT"), AND HE SAID HE WAS PLEASED THEY FORMED AN "ALL PARTY COALITION IN SUPPORT OF CONTINUED ASSISTANCE TO TURKEY." BUNDESTAG MEMBERS HAD MET WITH FORMER PRIME MINISTERS ECEVIT AND DEMIREL, AS WELL AS HEAD OF TRADE UNION FEDERATION, ALL OF WHOM HAD URGED THAT GERMANS NOT PUSH CURRENT GOVERNMENT TOO FAST ON END OF MILITARY RULE. ONLY NEGATIVE POINTS WHICH DID EMERGE FROM THIS VISIT WERE CONCERN OVER EXTENSION OF PERIOD DURING WHICH PERSON ARRESTED ON POSSIBLE SUSPICION OF TERRORISM COULD BE CONFINED WITHOUT ACCESS OF AN ATTORNEY FROM 15 TO 90 DAYS AND GENERAL FEELING THAT TOO MANY PEOPLE HAD BEEN ARRESTED AS SUSPECTED TERRORISTS. AMBASSADOR STOESSEL RAISED QUESTION OF EFFORT TO EXCLUDE TURKEY FROM COUNCIL OF EUROPE, A MOVE WHICH GENSCHER SAID FRG WOULD RESIST SO LONG AS TURKEY IS RESPRESENTED BY PERSONS APPOINTED BY PREVIOUS GOVERNMENT.

14. () THE SECRETARY ASKED GENSCHER WHETHER HE SAW ANY AREAS IN WHICH THE US COULD BE OF ASSISTANCE. GENSCHER SUGGESTED THAT WE RAISE ISSUE OF ACCESS TO LEGAL COUNSEL AND NEED FOR MOVE BY CURRENT GOVERNMENT ON CONSTITUTIONAL REFORM. GENECHER ADDED THAT HE HAD TOLD TURKS THAT HE WOULD VISIT TURKEY AS SOON AS

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MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

NEW CONSTITUTIONAL LEGISLATION IS ADOPTED. THE SECRETARY MADE NO COMMITMENTS ON EITHER POINT.

SPAIN

15. (%) GENSCHER SAIDFRG AND US SHOULD JOIN IN STEPS TO REASSURE SPANISH AFTER RECENT UNSUCCESSFUL COUP D'ETAT ATTEMPT. HE SUGGESTED POSÍTIVE STATEMENTS AS WELL AS PROMINENT VISITS WOULD BE USEFUL. GENSCHER AND THE SECRETARY AGREED THAT THE RECENT EVENTS HAD BEEN MORE SERIOUS THAN INDICATED IN THE PRESS, AND THE SECRETARY ADDED THAT WE SHOULD TAKE STEPS TO SUPPORT THE KING AND SPANISH DEMOCRACY AT THIS TIME.

NAMIBIA

REFERRING TO HIS EARLIER CONVERSATIONS WITH CARRINGTON AND FRANCOIS-PONCET, THE SECRETARY SAID THAT OUR NAMIBIA POLICY WAS STILL UNDER REVIEW. NOTED THAT THIS WAS A DIFFICULT AND CONTRADICTION-LADEN SUBJECT. WE WANT AN INTERNATIONALLY-ACCEPTABLE SETTLEMENT, THE SECRETARY SAID, BUT ARE NOT PLEASED WITH THE PROCESS WHICH COULD INSTALL MARXIST-LENINIST GOVERNMENT IN NAMIBIA. AT THE SAME TIME, THERE IS A NEGOTIATING HISTORY WHICH CANNOT BE IGNORED AS WELL AS UN DECISIONS. HE NOTED THAT HE WERE ASKING THE FRONT LINE STATES AND OTHERS IN THE UN TO BE PATIENT AND ALLOW US TO CONDUCT THE NECESSARY POLICY IN REPLY, GENSCHER PRESENTED & GENERALLY OPTIMISTIC APPRAISAL OF DEVELOPMENTS IN SOUTHERN AFRICA AND ADDED THAT THE SOVIETS SEE A CHANGE IN US POLICY AS A CHANCE FOR THEM, TO GET BACK INTO THE GAME IN THAT PART OF THE WORLD. HE REFERRED TO HIS NOVEMBER 1979 BONN MEETING WITH GROMYKO, IN WHICH THE SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER HAD BEEN TOUGH ON THE BUT EVEN TOUGHER ON ZIMBABWE, WHERE IT WAS CLEAR THE SOVIETS FEARED A PEACEFUL SETTLEMENT. GENSCHER CLAIMED SOUTH AFRICANS WERE UNCONSCIOUSLY HELPING THE SOVIETS WITH THEIR POLICY AND URGED STRONGLY THAT US AGREE TO CONTINUATION OF CONTACT GROUP INITIATIVE.

MIDDLE EAST

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MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

THE SECRETARY SAID LORD CARRINGTON HAD REASSURED HIM DURING THEIR RECENT TALKS THAT EC TEN
WOULD NOT PLAN TO ACT IN A MANNER WHICH WOULD COMPLICATE
THE PEACE PROCESS IN THE MIDDLE EAST, WHICH THE
SECRETARY SAID MUST BE BASED ON UN SECURITY
COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS 242 AND 338, THE CAMP DAVID
PROCESS, AND THE AUTOMONY TALKS, REFERRING TO HIS

APRIL VISIT TO THE AREA, HE SAID HE WAS GOING WITHOUT PRECONCEPTIONS BUT IN THE HOPE OF KEEPING THE PROCESS GOING. IN GENERAL COMMENT ON THE MIDDLE EAST, THE SECRETARY URGED THAT EUROPEANS VIEW SITUATION IN ITS TOTALITY, AVOIDING PREDCCUPATION WITH ARABA ISRAELI DISPUTE. THERE ARE OTHER, VERY IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENTS, INCLUDING MODERATING STANCE PREVIOUSLY RADICAL ARAB STATES, GROWING DISTRUST OF THE USSR, POSSIBLE IMPROVEMENT IN SAUDI/EGYPT RELATIONS, TRENDS TOWARD COOPERATION OF THE GULF STATES, AS WELL AS DEVELOPMENTS IN NEIGHBORING AFRICAN COUNTRIES. GENSCHER REITERATED FRG AND EC TEN DESIRE TO BE HELPFUL AND COMPLEMENTARY IN THEIR APPROACH TO THE MIDDLE EAST. HE AGREED WITH THE SECRETARY'S ASSESSMENT OF POSSIBLE IMPROVEMENT IN EGYPT/SAUDI RELATIONSHIP, BUT HE ADDED ISRAELIS SHOULD HELP BY SHOWING FLEXIBILITY ON ISSUE OF JERUSALEM, WHICH IS KEY FOR SAUDIS.

PAKISTAN

REFERRING TO HIS RECENT VISIT THERE, GENSCHER STRESSED NEED FOR GREATER WESTERN ASSISTANCE TO PAKISTAN. WHILE HE ADMITTED THAT WE MIGHT WISH FOR SOMETHING BETTER THAN THE ZIA GOVERNMENT, PAKISTAN HAS ENORMOUS STRATEGIC IMPORTANCE IN THE WAKE OF AFGHANISTAN. HE SAID ZIA HAD STRESSED TO HIM THE NEED TO PU-H DEVELOPMENT OF BALUSCHISTAN AND DESERVED INTERNATIONAL SUPPORT IN THIS EFFORT AS WELL AS IN COPING WITH THE 1.5 MILLION AFGHAN REFUGEES. ALSO NEEDS HELP IN DEVELOPING "MILITARY INFRASTRUCTURE" OF HIS COUNTRY TO ENABLE REDEPLOYMENT OF FORCES FROM PAKISTAN-INDIAN BORDER TO THE BORDER WITH AFGHANISTAN. HE SAID THE FRG PLANS TO INCREASE ITS ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE BUT DID NOT PLAN ARMS AID TO PAKISTAN. THE SECRETARY SAID WE SHARED THE FRG

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ASSESSMENT OF THE NEED TO ASSIST PAKISTAN AND SAID HE WAS CONFIDENT THAT WHEN OUR CURRENT POLICY REVIEW WAS CONCLUDED, WE WOULD RECOMMEND TO THE PRESIDENT THAT HE APPROVE ADDITIONAL ECONOMIC AND MILITARY ASSISTANCE. IN THIS CONTEXT, THE SECRETARY NOTED THE CONTROVERSY IN GERMANY REGARDING POSSIBLE TANK SALES TO SAUDI ARABIA AND EXPRESSED UNDERSTANDING OF THE PROBLEMS WHICH THIS POSED FOR THE FRG GOVERNMENT. IN GENERAL OBSERVATION, HE SUGGESTED THAT THE WESTERN ALLIES SHOULD COORDINATE THEIR ASSISTANCE TO COUNTRIES IN THAT AREA. GENSCHER REVIEWED STATUS OF DEBATE IN THE PRG OVER ARMS-TD-SAUDI-ARABIA ISSUE WITHOUT INDICATING HOW HE EXPECTED ISSUE TO BE RESOLVED.

CENTRAL AMERICA

THE SECRETARY LAMENTED SITUATION IN WHICH THE MEDIA FOCUSSED ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY ON MILITARY ASSISTANCE TO EL SALVADOR, DESPITE FACT THAT THIS WAS RELATIVELY MINOR PART OF OUR AID EFFORT. BASIC OBJECTIVE REMAINS, HE SAID, TO STOP OUTSIDE INTERVENTION BY COMMUNIST COUNTRIES AND ALLOW PEOPLE OF EL SALVADOR TO DECIDE THEIR FUTURE THEMSELVES. HE NOTED PROPOSALS BY SOME SOCIAL DEMOCRATIC PARTIES THAT SOLUTION BE SOUGHT THROUGH RECONCILIATION BETWEEN PRESIDENT DUARTE AND SOCIALTST LEADER UNGO, A APPROACH WHICH HE SAID OFFERED NO SOLUTION SINCE UNGO WAS DISCREDITED IN EL SALVADOR. THE SOLUTION, HE SAID, WAS TO PUSH AHEAD FOR FREE AND OPEN ELECTIONS. HE ASSURED GENSCHER THAT WE ARE CONCERNED ABOUT EL SALVADOR NOT BECAUSE IT IS PART OF THE AMERICAN HEMISPHERE BUT BECAUSE IT IS SUCH A BLATANT EXAMPLE OF A SOVIET EFFORT TO DESTABILIZE A SITUATION TO ITS ADVANTAGE. GENSCHER URGED THAT WE STRESS REFORM EFFORT UNDERWAY IN EL SALVADOR AS MEANS TO ATTRACT GREATER PUBLIC SUPPORT FOR OUR POLICY IN WESTERN EUROPE. SECRETARY REVIEWED OUR EFFORTS TO BERSUADE THE NICARAGUANS TO CEASE THEIR PARTICIPATION IN THE CLANDESTINE ARMS SUPPLY EFFORT, IN WHICH HE SAID THE NICARAGUANS ADMITTED THEY HAD BEEN INVOLVED. WHILE WE HAD RECEIVED ASSURANCES FROM THE NICARAGUANS ON THERE POINTS, WE WERE WATCHING THE SITUATION VERY

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CLOSELY TO SEE HOW THEY ACTUALLY PERFORMED.

SEVEN-NATION ECONOMIC SUMMIT AND AID LEVELS

20. (B) THE SECRETARY SAID HE WOULD WELCOME GENSCHER'S COMMENTS ON THE GUESTIONS TO BE CONSIDERED BY THE DTTAWA SUMMIT, TO WHICH GENSCHER LISTED COORDINATION OF ECONOMIC POLICIES, EAST-WEST RELATIONS, A GENERAL POLICY REVIEW AND STRATEGIES FOR THE NORTH/SOUTH MINI-SUMMIT. ON AID LEVELS, THE SECRETARY CALLED GENSCHER'S ATTENTION TO THE FACT THAT DESPITE SERIOUS BUDGETARY PROBLEMS, WE WOULD MEET ALL OUR OBLIGATIONS TO THE IFI'S, INCLUDING IDA VI. HE NOTED THAT WHILE WE SEE UTILITY OF MULTILATERAL AID AND WOULD CONTINUE IT, WE BELIEVE THAT BILATERAL ASSISTANCE COULD ALSO HAVE A VERY USEFUL IMPACT. GENSCHER SAID THAT HE AGREED ENTIRELY WITH THE SECRETARY'S REMARKS AND STATE SECRETARY FISCHER POINTED OUT THAT FRG ASSISTANCE PROGRAM IS DIVIDED ROUGHLY 70-30 BETWEEN BILATERAL AND MULTILATERAL
