Dear Mr. President:

The Utah Chapter Associated General Contractors of America is one of the state's oldest and largest construction trade associations representing more than 425 general contractors, subcontractors, and suppliers of materials or services. The association has been serving the construction industry in Utah for more than 61 years and the AGC members do a majority of the construction work within the State.

We as an association are very concerned over the Department of Transportation's current approach in implementing Section 105(F), the Minority Business Enterprise Provision, of the 1982 Surface Transportation Assistance Act. We believe this proposal will greatly interfere with the intentions of the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982. In our opinion it does not take into account any local or state's ability in meeting percent set-aside.

In Utah the entire minority population is less than 10%. This includes men, women, and children, and it would be, in our opinion, physically impossible for contractors to meet a 10% MBE set-aside for Assistance Act funds. We believe that should the proposed Section 105(F) of the MBE requirements be adopted, it will become extremely difficult for Utah to even secure a waiver from this provision. We understand it is very inflexible and does not take into consideration any local or state circumstances. This causes us great concern.

We urge your review of this very critical matter and would hope for the sake of the construction industry this will be changed.





### Assistant to the President

Elizabeth Hanford Dole, Assistant to the President for Public Liaison, directs President Reagan's major outreach program at the White House. She is responsible for assuring that the views of key groups are considered by the President in developing his agenda and for providing a means of developing consensus for the Reagan Administration's policies and programs.

Mrs. Dole is a former Federal Trade Commissioner, a former Deputy Special Assistant to the President and a former Staff Assistant to the Assistant Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare.

She was graduated with distinction in political science from Duke University, where she was president of the student body and elected to Phi Beta Kappa. She received her law degree from Harvard Law School and a master's degree in education from Harvard University. Following her service at the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, in which she specialized in educational problems of the disabled, Mrs. Dole served as Executive Director of the President's Committee on Consumer Interests from 1969 to 1971. When the Office of Consumer Affairs was created in 1971, Mrs. Dole was named Deputy Director. In 1973 she became a member of the Federal Trade Commission where she worked to promote competition in the marketplace and to eliminate unfair and deceptive market practices which affected the consumer.

In 1972 Mrs. Dole received the Arthur S. Flemming Award for Outstanding Government Service and in 1974 *Time* Magazine chose her as one of America's 200 "Faces for the Future". She currently serves on the Board of Trustees of Duke University and the Board of Advisors for the Duke Business School. During the 1980 Presidential campaign, Mrs. Dole served as Chairman of Voters for Reagan-Bush and as a member of the Reagan-Bush Truth Squad. She directed the Human Services Group for the Office of Executive Branch Management, Office of the President-elect.

A native of Salisbury, North Carolina, she is married to Bob Dole, United States Senator from Kansas.
