Pudo

1. Dr. Wirthlin's plan and his data boil down to one theme: show leadership, prempt the other side. Clear up our negatives (lack of judgement -- we have reinforced this negative recently) and emphasize Carter's weakness (his lack of leadership.) Do this and the ball game is probably over.

2. Proposed here are three premptions: Home runs:

# HOME RUN I

l. As you know, Dr. Wirthlin believes that Civiletti
"is the key."

I proposed that on the night of Carter's acceptance speech, we bring up this issue.

Since then, we have in sporadic spurts tried to put together some sort of surrogate demand for Civiletti's resignation. (Thompson and Thornburgh -- largely because their aides counseled against it in my view rejected going out front.)

Brock was shown the attached statement last week. Had no problem with it and sees the importance of doing it soon.

Civiletti is expected to testify this week.

I propose that Tuesday morning Brock call a press conference and issue a statement. That Casey follow with a statement. That REagan then calls for a meeting of advisors and issues a judicous statement about the importance of integrity, crediblity and confidence the the property of the highest law enforcement official in the land. Refore Coulette's testimony

#### HOME RUN II

1. WASTE and fraud was lost this week for understandable reasons. Strongly suggest putting in a speech early this week. There are infinite variations off this theme. A press story today on the GSA scandal shows that CArter administration blew this one. If the statement had been picked up (Brady reports a positive response by the media) that story might have a Ronald REagan lead.

Although you suggested that waste and fraud be incorporated in this week's speeches, this has not been done according to Bill Gavin. Bill said that a small part was used. Strongly recommend that you urge putting in the whole statement replete with "the factoids" (as CBS correspondent put it) and the challenge that CArter address the American people on this issue.

## HOME RUN III

- 1. Can our researchers quicky put together areas where Jimmy Carter followed RR's lead. Obviously, I'll write something up here. But Bandow and Hopkins and others know this a little better.
- 2. Speech insert for RR should be put in with theme: Where Ron goes, Jimmy follows. Tax-cut etc. Jimmy is our stallow?
- 3. Let's get this message out as quality as possible. The place obviously is in \*\*candidate's speech. We should think about a TV spot.

### TEXAS LEAGUER

1. Jerry Carmen has sent in a wonderful memo about the marriage tax. This is an issue that dominates the thinking of many young marrieds -- as you would expect, it is the sort of issue that Jerry's attenna would pick up.
