Dear Craig:

During the past year, I have been working again in Sacramento. Over these recent months, the presence of Assemblyman Gary Hart in the State Capitol keeps vividly coming to mind. His commitment to our schools and to California's environment has made a tangible difference during Gary's ten years in the Legislature. He now faces, as you may know, a tough election this coming November. I am urgently asking for your help to avoid losing Gary's voice in state government.

If Gary loses his southern California election, the State Senate will likely move backwards on these issues. To date, the Legislature has played a vital role in moderating the effects of federal changes that have hit schools, universities, youth, and the environment very hard. Yet the state Legislature may follow Washington's lead unless the voices of Gary Hart and legislators like him are strengthened in Sacramento.

I am asking if you can contribute at least \$100 to Gary's election campaign—or what you feel you can afford. It always feels a bit pretentious to ask others for money. But Gary's race is pivotal—the detrimental effects of his losing would be felt by our young people, our teachers, and seen in our environmental quality of life. Please help with what you can afford.
