My staff has alerted you to the German request for President Carstens to address a joint session of Congress on October 4 or 5, when he will be in Washington on a State visit in conjunction with the three-hundredth anniversary of German immigration to America. The German Ambassador, Peter Hermes, has informed Secretary Shultz that the Speaker can only extend an invitation if requested to do so by the President (Tab A). The State Department has recommended that the President write to the Speaker (Tab B).

While we support the German request, we recognize that invitations to foreign leaders are very rare. Therefore, it seems to us that the appropriate first step would be for you to discuss it with the Speaker. Following your "consultations," we could move forward with the Presidential letter, assuming all is in order.

Please let us know the Speaker's reaction. Thank you.

Thank you for your message concerning the possibility of President Regan joining President Carstens in Philadelphia. We have reviewed the President's schedule and must again regret.

Please let me assure you, however, that President Reagan will go out of his way to make President Carstens' Washington visit a booming success. There will be both working meetings and a State dinner in President Carstens honor. We hope these activities will generate the type of positive publicity that we both seek, as we move forward on INF.



SUBJECT: Reply to Horst Teltschik

Horst Teltschik has sent you a private channel message urging that the President join President Carstens in Philadelphia in October for the celebration of the 300th anniversary of German Immigration to America (Tab II). John Poindexter informs me that the Teltschik message resurfaces an earlier invitation that had been declined.

After checking with John Poindexter and the Vice President's office (Jennifer Fitzgerald, his chief scheduler), I have drafted a reply to Teltschik noting that the President cannot go to Philadelphia, but that the Vice President may be able to go. The Vice President has been approached separately and may go. The reply also underlines all the President is doing (working meeting and State dinner) for Carstens in Washington.
