# TEXT OF THE MESSAGE ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE BY THE MINISTER OF ROEIGN AFFAIRS OF ITALY DATED NOVEMBER 16,1982

Signor Segretario di Stato e caro amico,

desidero innanzitutto vivamente ringraziarLa delle aggiornate valutazioni che mi ha fatto avere, tramite l'Ambasciata a Roma, secondo le intese intervenute, alla vigilia della mia partenza per Beirut.

Per parte mia Le ho fatto subito pervenire, tramite la nostra Ambasciata a Washington, le impressioni di quella visita, durante la quale ho del resto avuto modo di intrattenermi lungamente con l'Ambasciatore Draper.

Sia per lo sviluppo della situazione in Libano, sia piu' in generale per la ripresa dei negoziati sui territori occupati – e quindi un avvio a soluzione del problema palestinese – le prossime settimane mi sembrano cruciali.

Cio' che e' in gioco e' la possibilita' di far uscire gradualmente Israele dalla dialettica del confronto armato con il Comando Arabo e assicurale prospettive di pace e di collaborazione. A mio avviso lo si deve fare nell'interesse del Medio Oriente e della stessa Israele nonostante l'opposizione dell'attuale Governo o per lo meno di una parte di esso. Dai continui contatti che molto opportunamente il Dipartimento di Stato mantiene con la nostra Ambasiata su questi temi, vedo che vi era la ferma intenzione di utilizzare l'incontro del Presidente Reagan con il Primo Ministro Begin e in genere i colloqui che quest'ultimo doveva avere a Washington proprio ai predetti fini, esercitando pressioni particolari a favore:

- 1) di un sollecito ritiro delle forze straniere dal Libano;
- 2) dell'assoluta inaccettabilita' delle recenti iniziative rivolte a creare nuovi insediamenti nei territori occupati.

In base a tutti gli elementi di valutazione che affluiscono anche a noi – di nuovo molto preoccupanti per quanto riguarda la situazione a Beirut e il consolidamento del Governo libanese – desidero dirle che questa impostazione mi sembra quella necessaria e giusta. Mi auguro pertanto che essa possa al piu' presto essere fatta valere presso il Governo Israeliano.

Unofficial translation of the message addressed to Secertary of State Shultz from the Italian Minister of Foreign Affairs, Emilio Colombo, dated November 16th, 1982.

Dear Mr. Secretary and friend,

First of all let me thank you most sincerely for the updated evaluations which you forwarded to me through your Embassy in Rome on the eve of my departure for Beirut, on the basis of the understanding already reached.

For my own part I have forwarded to you through our Embassy in Wash-ington my impressions on that visit, in the course of which I had the opportunity to have extensive talks with Ambassador Draper.

I believe that the coming weeks will be crucial both with regard to the development of the situation in Lebanon and more generally regarding the renewal of the negotiations concerning the occupied territories — and therefore a search for a solution to the Palestinian problem.

What is at stake is the possibility of gradually moving Israel away from the dialectic of armed confrontation with the Arab World, ensuring prospects for peace and cooperation to the Israelis. In my opinion it is necessary to promote such a process in the interests of the Middle East and of Israel itself, despite the opposition of its present government or at least of a part of it. From the continuous contacts which the State Department so effectively maintains with our Embassy on these issues, I see that there was a firm intention of using the meeting between President Reagan and Prime Minister Begin and more generally the talks the Israeli leader was supposed to hold in Washington, to exactly this end, exercising all possible influence in favour of:

- 1) A prompt withdrawal of the foreign forces from Lebanon
- 2) The absolute unacceptability of the recent initiatives aimed at creating new settlements in the occupied territories.

Bearing also in mind all the elements of evaluation which have come to our notice and which are of particular concern to us, with regard both to the situation in Beirut and to the consolidation of the Lebanese government, I wish to tell you that this approach seems to me to be the necessary and just one. Therefore I hope that it may be adopted as soon as possible with regard to the Israeli government.
