THE OPENED DISCUSSION BY READING FROM AMBASSADOR HENDERSON'S REPORT OF HIS CONVERSATION THIS PAST WEEKEND WITH MR. DEAVER, IN WHICH THE LATTER SAID IT MIGHT BE PREFERABLE FOR THE PRESIDENT NOT MPT NOT TO MAKE A MAJOR SPEECH DURING HIS U.K. VISIT AND ALSO NOT MPT NOT TO SCHEDULE A LUNCHEON, JUNE B. AT AMBASSADOR LOUIS! RESIDENCE. ON THESE THO POINTS, UKE STATED THE FOLLOWING:

(8) WITH REGARD TO THE JUNE 8 LUNCHEON AT AMBASSAUDR LOUIS' RESIDENCE, URE RECOGNIZED THAT THE VISIT SCHEDULE, AS DISCUSSED WITH HR. LEAVER, MAS NOT FIRM SINCE IT HAD NOT YET BEEN AGREED TO BY THE U.S. SIDE. NONETHELESS, HMG BELIEVES IT REPRESENTS THEIR BEST THINKING UN THE PRESIDENT'S SCHEDULE AND THEY CONSIDER THE LUNCH AT THE U.S. EMBASSY RESIDENCE TO BE A GOOD IDEA BECAUSE IT PROVIDES AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE PRESIDENT TO MEET A BRUAUER CROSSECTION OF THE BRITISH PUBLIC THAN THE UTHER, MORE FORMAL, EVENTS, AND MUULD ALSO LEAVE THE PRIME MINISTER FREE AT THAT THE TO MEET HER DULIGATION TO RESPOND TO MUESTIONS IN THE COMMONS. - 2. THE MARCH 18-19 SENIOR-LEVEL CONTACT GROUP IN LONDON WAS DOMINATED BY CONSIDERATION OF HOW TO MOVE THROUGH THE PHASE ONE IMPASSE VIS-A-VIS THE FRONT LINE STATES AND SWAPO ON THE ELECTORAL SYSTEM IN THE CONSTITUTIONAL PRINCIPLES. WE AGREED ON A WIDER RANGE OF DIPLOMATIC ACTIONS BASED ON A SIMPLIFIED ELECTION PROCEDURE -- ONE VOTE THAT WOULD BE COUNTED TWICE IN THE MIXED ELECTION SYSTEM -- WHICH WE HOPE WILL SERVE TO BREAK THE LOGJAM AND ALLOW US TO MOVE ON TO PHASE TWO.
- 3. WE ALL RECOGNIZE THAT IN "ONE VOTE COUNTED TWICE" WE HAVE PULLED A RATHER SMALL SLEEPY RABBIT OUT OF THE CG HAT, BUT WE ALSO HOPE THAT WITH SUFFICIENT STAGECRAFT OUR BUNNY WILL BE ABLE TO RUN THE COURSE. IN THAT REGARD, I ALONG WITH FRANCE'S AFRICA DIRECTOR, JEAN AUSSEIL, WILL GO TO LUANDA IN EARLY APRIL TO SEE THE SWAPO LEADERSHIP (WHOSE INTRANSIGENCE WAS UNDERLINED IN SWAPO'S MARCH 18 MESSAGE TO THE FIVE) AND POSSIBLY REPRESENTATIVES OF THE

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

FRONT LINE (I PLAN TO TAKE THE OPPORTUNITY TO DO SOME SIDE BUSINESS WITH THE ANGOLANS, IN PARTICULAR, I HOPE TO DISCUSS OUR SOUTHERN AFRICA AGENDA WITH OTHER CRUCIAL MPLA LEADERS, ASIDE FROM PAULO JORGE.)

OUR SESSIONS IN LONDON BEGAN WITH THE SHARED RECOGNITION THAT WE ARE BECALMED IN OUR EFFORTS TO CONCLUDE PHASE ONE AND IT IS BEGINNING TO PROVIDE AN UNDESERVED OPPORTUNITY TO DOUBTERS. IN PARTICULAR, AUSSEIL SAID THAT THE SAME VOICES WHO LAST YEAR HAD QUESTIONED THE VALUE OF FRANCE'S CONTINUED PARTICIPATION IN THE CG WERE AGAIN BEING RAISED. IN CONTRAST TO SOME PREVIOUS CG MEETINGS HOWEVER, THIS SHARED RECOGNITION LED TO A COMMON WILLINGNESS TO GRAB AN OAR AND COOPERATE RATHER THAN TO ENGAGE IN RECRIMINATION. IN WHICH WE AND THE BRITISH PRECOOK, THE FRENCH COOPERATE, EVEN THE CANADIANS ARE HELPFUL, WHILE THE GERMANS ARE MORALISTIC AND GLUM BUT DUTIFUL. OUR UNITY HAS BEEN REINFORCED BY THE COMMON PERCEPTION THAT THE SOVIETS ARE CHIPPING AWAY AT OUR INITIATIVE, ESPECIALLY WITH SWAPO. - 5. I WOULD RATE OUR CHANCES OF SUCCESS IN CONCLUDING PHASE ONE WITH THE "ONE VOTE, COUNTED TWICE" GIMMICK AS NO BETTER THAN EVEN. ON THE ONE HAND, IT MAY NOT BE ENOUGH FOR THE AFRICANS WHO ARE WELL DUG IN IN THEIR OPPOSITION TO THE HALF-PROPORTIONAL, HALF-CONSTITUENCIES ELECTORAL SYSTEM WHICH WE HAVE PROPOSED. IN THAT REGARD, I BRIEFLY SAW TANZANIA'S FOREIGN MINISTER SALIM IN LONDON AND, WHILE HE APPRECIATED HIS MEETING WITH YOU, IT IS CLEAR THAT HE AND HIS FLS COLLEAGUES HAVE LITTLE STOMACH TO BRING SWAPO IN LINE ON THIS ISSUE.
- 6. SIMILARLY, BUT LESS SERIOUSLY I HOPE, WE MAY HAVE SOME TROUBLE WITH THE SOUTH AFRICANS ON "ONE VOTE, COUNTED TWICE." WHEN WE PRIVATELY CHECKED ON ITS ACCEPTABILITY

WHILE WE ARE BEING CAREFUL NOT TO SHIFT THE ONUS FOR THE IMPASSE TO THEM, WE ARE NOW GOING BACK TO THEM TO SAY IT IS THE CG'S PREFERENCE AND ON THAT BASIS WE ARE USING IT WITH THE AFRICANS IN AN EFFORT TO CONCLUDE PHASE ONE. - REF (B) CONTAINS ANSWERS TO SEVERAL OF THE QUESTIONS YOU ASKED US TO ADDRESS IN PREPARATION FOR YOUR VISIT TO LONDON. IT SUMMARIZES BRITISH POSITION ON EXPORT CREDIT GUARANTEES VIS-A-VIS THE USSR AND CONTAINS SUGGESTIONS FOR LINES OF ARGUMENT WHICH WE BELIEVE WILL BE MOST USEFUL WITH BRITISH. IN THIS MESSAGE, I WOULD SIMPLY LIKE TO HIT THE MAIN POINTS AS I SEE THEM.
- WHILE THE CONSERVATIVE GOVERNMENT DOES NOT FEEL THE COMPULSION TO EXPAND TRADE WITH THE SOVIETS WHICH THE PRIOR LABOR GOVERNMENT DID, IT IS BY NO MEANS INDIFFERENT ABOUT EXPORTS TO THE SOVIETS. - 1. C- ENTIRE TEXT
- IN THE COURSE OF A CONVERSATION ON ANOTHER SUBJECT, I RAISED WITH GENSCHER MY CONCERN OVER THE TENSIONS WHICH HAVE ARISEN TO PLAGUE U.S.-GERMAN RELATIONS IN RECENT WEEKS. I TOLD HIM THAT THESE DEVELOPMENTS TROUBLED ME DEEPLY, AS THEY MUST TROUBLE HIM AND THE FRG. I THOUGHT IT HIGHLY IMPORTANT TO SEEK TO GET AT THE BASIC CAUSES THAT HAVE ENGENDERED THESE STRAINS, RATHER THAN TO REACT TO THE DAY-BY-DAY MANIFESTATIONS OF THEM. I MENTIONED THAT VON STADEN AND I HAD AGREED TO BEGIN CONVERSATIONS AIMED AT IDENTIFYING THE ROOT CAUSES OF DIFFICULTIES AND SEEKING WAYS TO ALLEVIATE I TOLD GENSCHER THAT I THOUGHT IT MIGHT BE THEM. USEFUL TO MEET TOGETHER TO DISCUSS THIS SUBJECT.
- GENSCHER SAID HE GLADLY ACCEPTED MY INVITATION. JUDGED GERMAN-AMERICAN RELATIONS TO BE GOOD, SOUND AND CONSTRUCTIVE, BUT THE LIGHT IN WHICH OUR RELATIONS WAS CAST WAS QUITE BAD. HE WAS NOT INCLINED TO BLAME THE

PRESS; IT REFLECTS WHAT IT HEARS WHETHER OFFICIALLY OR UNOFFICIALLY. GERMANY HAS MADE SOME GRAVE MISTAKES IN THE RECENT PAST, BUT HOPEFULLY THAT PHASE HAS PASSED AND THOSE MISTAKES WILL NOT BE REPEATED. IN ANY CASE "THE FOG AND SMOG" THAT HAVE OVERLAID THE ATMOSPHERE MUST BE DISPELLED, SO THAT THE CLARITY AND UNITY OF U. S. -GERMAN VIEWS CAN ONCE AGAIN BE DISCERNED.
