NORTHERN IRELAND: BRITISH GOVERNMENT PROPOSALS FOR DEVOLUTION

The British Government believe that there is now an urgent need for the people of Northern Ireland to play a much bigger part in the conduct of their own affairs. The Secretary of State for Northern Ireland, Mr James Prior, has been having discussions with the political parties in Northern Ireland. He has told all the Parties that he would like to see early movement towards the election of an Assembly in Northern Ireland which could, by agreement among its members, propose to the Parliament at Westminster a scheme for a form of devolved government acceptable to both sides of the community.

The main elements of Mr Prior's proposal are as follows:

- (a) There would be elections (by proportional representation) to an Assembly. If, for the sake of argument, the results followed those of the local government elections in Northern Ireland in May 1981, seats in the Assembly might be won as follows:

Official Unionist Party	29%
Democratic Unionist Party (Mr Paisley's Party)	27%
Social Democratic and Labour Party	20%
Alliance Party	7%
Others	17%
- (b) The Assembly would, from the start, have power to scrutinise legislation, to oversee the work of Government Departments in Northern Ireland (Commerce, Agriculture, Environment, Finance, Education, Health and Social Services and Manpower). The Assembly might be required to set up oversight committees constituted on proportional lines and with chairmanships allocated on proportional lines.
- (c) Actual executive powers would only be transferred to the new Assembly if 70% of its members could agree on what powers should be transferred and on the way in which they should be exercised. In other words, no power would be transferred unless the Unionists had been able to obtain support across the sectarian divide. Thus, while the proposal does not constitute institutionalised power sharing (unacceptable to the Unionists) it gives the minority an effective blocking power and makes power sharing possible if the minority are able to form a power sharing coalition with elements of the majority.
- (d) If 70% of the Assembly can agree on a full range of powers that might be transferred back to Northern Ireland a new Northern Ireland Administration could be formed accordingly with corresponding legislative powers being given to the Northern Ireland Legislative Assembly. It may be, however, that the necessary majority can only be found for limited devolution in specific areas. Mr Prior's proposal would make partial devolution possible also.

SUBJECT: Your Meeting with Ambassador Henderson
12:00 noon, March 16

Ambassador Henderson probably intends to make to you the same statement he made Monday to Deputy Secretary Stoessel (report attached). Basically, the British are in the delicate stage of an attempt to launch a new initiative in Northern Ireland. They are attempting to convene an assembly representing all parties in Northern Ireland to which they hope to give increasing responsibility. They are afraid that if it looks as if the United States is "tilting" one way or the other, it will make the parties in Northern Ireland more intransigent. They are afraid that Prime Minister Haughey will be attempting to associate the President with his goals for Northern Ireland: withdrawal of British troops and eventual reunification.

We can reassure Ambassador Henderson that we intend that the luncheon tomorrow will be strictly a social occasion, in which politics will not be discussed. However we do intend to restate our position on Northern Ireland of concerned impartiality in a separate statement to be issued by the press office in the President's name.

2. BRITISH AMBASSADOR, SIR NICHOLAS HENDERSON, CALLED ON DEPUTY SECRETARY STOESEL MARCH 10 TO DISCUSS US POLICY TOWARD NORTHERN IRELAND. HE SAID THAT ON THE OCCASION OF THE MARCH 16-17 VISIT OF THE NEW IRISH PRIME MINISTER, IT WAS IMPORTANT THAT PRESIDENT REAGAN NOT SAY ANYTHING WHICH COULD ADVERSELY AFFECT THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT'S PRESENT ATTEMPT TO REACH A POLITICAL SOLUTION TO THE CONFLICT IN NORTHERN IRELAND. HENDERSON SAID THAT THE STATEMENT ON NORTHERN IRELAND ISSUED THAT DAY BY PRIME MINISTER HAUGHEY HAD BEEN UNHELPFUL, AND HE FERVENTLY HOPED THE PRESIDENT WOULD NOT SAY ANYTHING THAT WOULD APPEAR TO ENDORSE HAUGHEY'S POSITION.

3. STOESEL ASSURED HENDERSON THAT US POSITION IN NORTHERN IRELAND CONTINUED TO BE ONE OF NEUTRALITY AND WHATEVER THE PRESIDENT SAID WOULD BE CONSISTENT WITH HIS STATEMENT OF LAST YEAR. HENDERSON ASKED IF THE PRESIDENT WOULD WARN AMERICANS AGAINST CONTRIBUTING TO ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS NORAD WHICH THE US GOVERNMENT HAS CHARGED WITH AIDING IRA

TERRORISTS. THE DEPUTY SECRETARY SAID THAT HE THOUGHT THE PRESIDENT WOULD AGAIN CAUTION AMERICANS AGAINST DOING ANYTHING WHICH WOULD PROMOTE VIOLENCE. I met for over an hour with Mrs. Thatcher Wednesday evening. She was charming as usual, and she asked me to give you her very warm regards. I gave her a rather extensive debriefing of my meeting in Morocco, Ankara, and Brussels, for which she was most appreciative. She was absolutely delighted with your zero-option proposal and speech, and she expressed her admiration for the way the administration handled the AWACs issue. She indicated that the UK intended to maintain its own nuclear deterrent, and she believed that a summit meeting with Brezhnev could be very useful -- if there were good prospects for a suitable outcome and after we made the necessary detailed preparations. Finally, she would be honored to have you make an official visit to London in conjunction with the June economic summit in Paris.

- MFO/Middle East. John expressed confidence in Carrington, described him as the "best they've got", and seemed convinced that he was not working at cross-purposes with us. Much will now depend on the revised version of the MFO declarations he is renegotiating with the four European contributors to the Force and the larger European Community. *(e)*
- U.S. Image In Britain. There is little anti-Americanism per se in the UK, but the anti-nuclear demonstrators must be taken seriously (i.e., we must make a greater effort to appeal to British and European public opinion). *(C)*
- Northern Ireland. John believes that the best thing we can do on this issue is stick with our present policy as reflected in your St. Patrick's Day statement; this will be particularly important in connection with Bill Clark's December visit to Dublin. *(U)*
- Thatcher's Domestic Position. It is getting more vulnerable, and the possibility of Tory defeat, with the present government replaced by a coalition government, cannot be discounted. *(C)*

- Thatcher's Domestic Position. John has reported extensively on the growing difficulties Mrs. Thatcher confronts (some of them of her own making) in her domestic program. Seek his assessment of Thatcher's leadership and its prospects for the near-term. (C)
