John Jacob Astor sent a fur trading expedition here in 1811, establishing the first white settlement in the Oregon Country, and giving the city its name. The British captured Astoria in 1812 (renaming the city Fort George) and we were under British rule for six years.

Our ties have continued throughout the years. The Astor family contributed to our distinctive Astoria Column, built in 1927 and rising majestically above the city. Lord John Jacob Astor IV visited us many times after World War II, helping fund our library and participating in the dedication of an Indian Canoe in an impressive ceremony. United Kingdom

Sir Oliver Wright has had long experience as a member of Her Majesty's Diplomatic Service. From 1972-1975, he served as Deputy Under Secretary of State at the Foreign Office. He served as Ambassador to Denmark (1966-1969) and Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany (1975-1981). Sir Oliver retired in March 1981.

Ambassador Wright entered the Diplomatic Service in November 1945, after service in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve. His early assignments include tours in New York, Bucharest, Singapore, Berlin, Pretoria, and the Imperial Defense College. In 1960 he served as Assistant Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and in 1963 as Counsellor and Private Secretary. From 1964-1966, he was Private Secretary to the Prime Minister (the Rt. Hon. Sir Alec Douglas-Home, and subsequently, Rt. Hon. Harold Wilson). From August 1969 to March 1970, he was seconded to the Home Office as UK Representative to the Northern Ireland Government, and returned to the Foreign Office to become Chief Clerk from 1970-1972.

Born in 1921, Ambassador Wright was educated at Solihull School and Christ's College, Cambridge. He has been married since 1942 to the former Lillian Marjory Osborne. They have three sons.

## Details of the career of Sir Oliver Wright GCMG GCVO DSC

Sir Oliver Wright was born in 1921. He was educated at Solihull School and Christ's College, Cambridge. He served in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve from 1941-1945, and joined Her Majesty's Diplomatic Service in November 1945. From 1946-47 he served in New York; 1948-50 in Bucharest; 1950-51 in Singapore; 1952-54 in the Foreign Office; 1954-56 in Berlin; 1957-58 in Pretoria; 1959 in the Imperial Defence College; 1960 served as Assistant Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; 1963 served as Counsellor and Private Secretary; 1964-66 served as Private Secretary to the Prime Minister; 1966-69 as Ambassador in Denmark. From August 1969 to March 1970 he was seconded to the Home Office as UK Representative to the Northern Ireland Government. He then returned to the Foreign Office to become Chief Clerk from 1970-72. Then from 1972-75 he became Deputy Under Secretary of State at the Foreign Office; and from 1975-81 served as Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany. Sir Oliver Wright retired from the Diplomatic Service in March 1981.

Sir Oliver is married with three sons.




Mrs. Reagan asked that I thank you for your recent letter. She knew that you would understand that due to the hectic December schedule it was impossible for her to respond personally.

I understand that you and Ron are personally involved in the itinerary of Queen Elizabeth's first visit to California. Personally, I am delighted to hear this since I know that your involvement will definitely insure a most pleasant and informative visit for Her Majesty and the Duke of Edinburgh, which they both so deserve.

I've heard that the San Diego Zoo, quite rightly, has been considered as a probable visit on the Royal couple's schedule in San Diego, and I should like to recommend a client of ours, Sea World of San Diego, as another visit there for the royal couple. I don't know whether you and Ron have visited there or not, but it's truly a fascinating and most commendable institution, of which we Californians can be most proud. I feel sure that the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh would thoroughly enjoy a visit there, not only for the vast number of marine specimens on display, but also because of the great research being conducted there for the preservation of marine life.

Sea World of San Diego is the home of an important marine research foundation, as such, show business and science serve each other in a complex but effective relationship: revenues from the park finance scientific research on a variety of marine topics, and the training procedures involved in the creation of the shows are themselves creating new understanding of marine mammals and inter-species communications.

Currently under construction in the park is a unique new facility that will be far and away the world's largest Antarctic environment, one that will be populated eventually by some 600 penguins of half a dozen species, including the magnificent Emperor Penguins. The installation caps years of research into


these birds, some of which are on the world endangered list, and Sea World is now the only place on earth in which several species of penguins are bred in captivity.

Finally, Sea World's biggest "star," Shamu the Killer Whale, is actually a whale called "Winston," brought to San Diego by airlift from Windsor Park, near London, several years ago.

I hope that you may consider adding Sea World to Her Majesty's and His Royal Highness' itinerary for San Diego. It's a remarkable, fascinating, and varied place.
