

# BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA A PROCLAMATION

None among us deserve more respect than the millions of patriotic men and women who have worn our Nation's uniform to preserve America's freedom and world peace.

OUr Armed Forces veterans have earned a special day in which you and I may focus on their heroic accomplishments. For their unselfish devotion to duty, Congress established Veterans Day as a national expression of gratitude. On this historic occasion, our hearts and minds should be with our living veterans and their deceased comrades who have contributed so much to the defense of our country's ideals.

From the freezing cold of Valley Forge when our Nation was in its infancy, to the Vietnam conflict where our soldiers fought and died for the human rights of others, through war and peace, these valiant citizens have answered the call to service with honor and dignity. They are indeed worthy of a formal tribute from a grateful nation. Special consideration is due to those veterans who are sick and disabled. There is no better tangible expression of our affection than by remembering to visit them at home or in our hospitals.

In order that we pay meaningful tribute to the efforts of these valiant men and women of our Armed Forces, Congress has provided (5 U.S.C. 6103(a)) that November 11 shall be set aside each year as a national holiday to honor America's veterans.

NOW THEREFORE, I, RONALD REAGAN, President of the United States of America, do hereby declare Friday, November 11, 1983, as Veterans Day. In recognition of their valor, I urge all Americans to join with me in a fitting salute to our veterans, and I call upon Federal, State and local government officials to mark Veterans Day by displaying the flag of the United States, and I ask those Government

officials to support fully and personally its observance by appropriate ceremonies throughout the country.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this day of , in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and eighty-three, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and eighth.

SUMMARY. This memorandum forwards for your consideration a proposed Executive order which would provide for the restoration of certain benefits to the surviving spouses and children of certain persons who died in or as a result of military service.

BACKGROUND. Section 156 of Public Law 97-377 provided for the restoration of certain social security-type benefits to the survivors of certain military personnel. These benefits had been eliminated by the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981. The proposed order would implement the new, freestanding benefit mechanism established by Section 156.

The proposal would designate the Veterans Administration as the agency responsible for administering the program. Pursuant to Section 156, the benefits and the expenses incurred in administering the program will be paid by transferring funds from the Department of Defense to the Veterans Administration. The Department of Health and Human Services' will provide the Veterans Administration such information and technical assistance as it shall require to implement the benefits program.

None of the commenting agencies has objected to the proposed order, as revised by this Office. The Veterans Administration expressed concern regarding the scope of its legal responsibility under Section 156. That question has now been conclusively resolved by a comprehensive opinion issued by the Office of Legal Counsel of the Department of Justice, and its conclusions are reflected in the proposed order.

RECOMMENDATION. I recommend that you sign the proposed Executive order.

#### MEMORANDUM

The attached proposed Executive order was submitted by the Veterans Administration. It has been forwarded for the consideration of this Department as to form and legality by the Office of Management and Budget with the approval of the Director. A minor technical correction was made by the Office of Management and Budget at the suggestion of this Office.

The proposed Executive order would designate the Administrator of Veterans Affairs as the head of the agency charged with administering the provision of benefits under Section 156 of the 1983 Continuing Appropriations Act, Pub. L. No. 97-377, 96 Stat. 1830, 1920 (codified at 42 U.S.C. § 402 note). This section authorizes the payment of benefits to the survivors of persons who died in or as a result of military service. Before the Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1981, Pub. L. No. 97-35, 95 Stat. 842, such benefits were provided under §§ 202(d) and 202(q) of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 402(d), (g), by the Social Security Administration, but were terminated by the Omnibus Reconciliation Act. The 1983 Continuing Appropriations Act restored these benefits and permitted the President to vest administative authority over their payment in "the head of [one] department or agency[,] as the President shall designate." § 156(i)(1), 96 Stat. 1922.

In addition to designating the Administrator of Veterans Affairs as the head of the agency charged with administering this program, the proposed Executive order would also require the Secretary of Defense, as set forth in § 156(g)(1), 96 Stat. 1922, to transfer to the Veterans Administration such funds

as the Administator reasonably determines are necessary to pay the benefits and the administrative expenses of the program. The Secretary of Health and Human Services is also directed to provide to the Administrator, on a reimbursable basis, such information and technical assistance as the Administrator may reasonably require to discharge his responsibilities under § 156. See § 156(d)(1), 96 Stat. 1921. A July 15, 1983 opinion of the Office of Legal Counsel analyzing certain legal issues raised by the program is attached.

The proposed Executive order is acceptable as to form and legality.

Theodore B. Olson Assistant Attorney General Office of Legal Counsel PAYMENT OF CERTAIN BENEFITS TO SURVIVORS OF PERSONS WHO DIED IN OR AS A RESULT OF MILITARY SERVICE

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and laws of the United States of America, including Section 156 of Public Law 97-377 (96 Stat. 1920; 42 U.S.C. 402 note), in order to provide certain benefits to the surviving spouses and children of certain persons who died in or as a result of military service, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1. The Administrator of Veterans Affairs is designated to administer the provisions of Section 156 of Public Law 97-377.

Sec. 2. The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall provide to the Administrator of Veterans Affairs such information and such technical assistance as the Administrator may reasonably require to discharge his responsibilities under Section 156. The Administrator of Veterans Affairs shall reimburse the Department of Health and Human Services for all expenses it incurs in providing such information and technical assistance to the Veterans Administration. Such expenses shall be paid from the Veterans Administration account described in Section 3 of this Order.

Sec. 3. During fiscal year 1983 and each succeeding fiscal year, the Secretary of Defense shall transfer, from time to time, from the "Retired Pay, Defense" account of the Department of Defense to an account established in the Veterans Administration, such amounts as the Administrator of Veterans Affairs determines to be necessary to pay the benefits authorized by Section 156 during fiscal year 1983 and each succeeding fiscal year, and the expenses incurred by the Veterans Administration in paying such benefits during fiscal year 1983 and each succeeding fiscal year. Such transfers shall, to the extent feasible, be made in advance

PROPOSED EXECUTIVE ORDER ENTITLED "PAYMENT OF CERTAIN BENEFITS TO SURVIVORS OF PERSONS WHO DIED IN OR AS A RESULT OF MILITARY SERVICE"

SUMMARY. This memorandum forwards for your consideration a proposed Executive order which would provide for the restoration of certain benefits to the surviving spouses and children of certain persons who died in or as a result of military service.

BACKGROUND. Section 156 of Public Law 97-377 provided for the restoration of certain social security-type benefits to the survivors of certain military personnel. These benefits had been eliminated by the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981. The proposed order would implement the new, freestanding benefit mechanism established by Section 156.

The proposal would designate the Veterans Administration as the agency responsible for administering the program. Pursuant to Section 156, the benefits and the expenses incurred in administering the program will be paid by transferring funds from the Department of Defense to the Veterans Administration. The Department of Health and Human Services' will provide the Veterans Administration such information and technical assistance as it shall require to implement the benefits program.

None of the commenting agencies has objected to the proposed order, as revised by this Office. The Veterans Administration expressed concern regarding the scope of its legal responsibility under Section 156. That question has now been conclusively resolved by a comprehensive opinion issued by the Office of Legal Counsel of the Department of Justice, and its conclusions are reflected in the proposed order.

RECOMMENDATION. I recommend that you sign the proposed Executive order.

The attached proposed Executive order was submitted by the Veterans Administration. It has been forwarded for the consideration of this Department as to form and legality by the Office of Management and Budget with the approval of the Director. A minor technical correction was made by the Office of Management and Budget at the suggestion of this Office.

The proposed Executive order would designate the Administrator of Veterans Affairs as the head of the agency charged with administering the provision of benefits under Section 156 of the 1983 Continuing Appropriations Act, Pub. L. No. 97-377, 96 Stat. 1830, 1920 (codified at 42 U.S.C. § 402 note). This section authorizes the payment of benefits to the survivors of persons who died in or as a result of military service. Before the Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1981, Pub. L. No. 97-35, 95 Stat. 842, such benefits were provided under §§ 202(d) and 202(g) of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 402(d), (q), by the Social Security Administration, but were terminated by the Omnibus Reconciliation Act. The 1983 Continuing Appropriations Act restored these benefits and permitted the President to vest administative authority over their payment in "the head of [one] department or agency[,] as the President shall designate." § 156(i)(1), 96 Stat. 1922.

In addition to designating the Administrator of Veterans Affairs as the head of the agency charged with administering this program, the proposed Executive order would also require the Secretary of Defense, as set forth in § 156(g)(1), 96 Stat. 1922, to transfer to the Veterans Administration such funds

as the Administator reasonably determines are necessary to pay the benefits and the administrative expenses of the program. The Secretary of Health and Human Services is also directed to provide to the Administrator, on a reimbursable basis, such information and technical assistance as the Administrator may reasonably require to discharge his responsibilities under § 156. See § 156(d)(1), 96 Stat. 1921. A July 15, 1983 opinion of the Office of Legal Counsel analyzing certain legal issues raised by the program is attached.

The proposed Executive order is acceptable as to form and legality.

Theodore B. Olson Assistant Attorney General Office of Legal Counsel PAYMENT OF CERTAIN BENEFITS TO SURVIVORS OF PERSONS WHO DIED IN OR AS A RESULT OF MILITARY SERVICE

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and laws of the United States of America, including Section 156 of Public Law 97-377 (96 Stat. 1920; 42 U.S.C. 402 note), in order to provide certain benefits to the surviving spouses and children of certain persons who died in or as a result of military service, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1. The Administrator of Veterans Affairs is designated to administer the provisions of Section 156 of Public Law 97-377.

Sec. 2. The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall provide to the Administrator of Veterans Affairs such information and such technical assistance as the Administrator may reasonably require to discharge his responsibilities under Section 156. The Administrator of Veterans Affairs shall reimburse the Department of Health and Human Services for all expenses it incurs in providing such information and technical assistance to the Veterans Administration. Such expenses shall be paid from the Veterans Administration account described in Section 3 of this Order.

Sec. 3. During fiscal year 1983 and each succeeding fiscal year, the Secretary of Defense shall transfer, from time to time, from the "Retired Pay, Defense" account of the Department of Defense to an account established in the Veterans Administration, such amounts as the Administrator of Veterans Affairs determines to be necessary to pay the benefits authorized by Section 156 during fiscal year 1983 and each succeeding fiscal year, and the expenses incurred by the Veterans Administration in paying such benefits during fiscal year 1983 and each succeeding fiscal year. Such transfers shall, to the extent feasible, be made in advance

of the payment of benefits and expenses by the Veterans Administration.

Sec. 4. This Order shall be effective as of January 1, 1983.
