SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES

Three radio interviews with Kansas and Missouri stations commenting on the issues the President touched on his remarks there Thursday.

RED FLAGS:

- . The Conservative and Pro-Family groups are concerned at reports that Senator Baker will switch his position and attempt to strip the Debt Limitation Bill of pro-life and pro-school prayer amendments. Special concern that White House won't fight against Baker's retreat.
- . Conservative organizations, encouraged by Senator Gordon Humphrey and Congressman Vin Weber, have decided to oppose Clinch River Breeder Reactor, now convinced it is a mammoth boondoggle supported by the Administration only because it is in the Senate Majority Leader's home state.

MISCELLANEOUS:

The President's support for cloture on the pro-life amendment is greatly appreciated by pro-life groups.
