2. DURING CONVERSATIONS REPORTED REF. A WITH DIRECTEUR DE CABINET POISSON, IT WAS CLEAR THAT KOUNTCHE CONTINUES TO HARBOR HOPES THAT MEETING WITH PRESIDENT REAGAN WILL FALL INTO PLACE. POISSON EXPRESSED UNDERSTANDING OF OUR INABILITY TO ARRANGE MEETING WITH PRESIDENT, GIVEN NARROW WINDOW (ONE DAY) GON HAD OFFERED. HE SUGGESTED THAT IF KOUNTCHE WERE TO LEAVE EARLIER FOR U.S., MEETING COULD CERTAINLY BE ARRANGED. CHARGE REITERATED DIFFIVALTY OF ARRANGING MEETING AT ANY TIME IN COMING MONTHS, BUT POISSON APPEARED UNCONVINCED.

WHILE WHITE HOUSE POSITION ON ADDITIONAL APPOINTMENTS WITH PRESIDENT FOR FOREIGN LEADERS (REF C) IS CLEAR AND UNDERSTANDABLE, WE ALSO NEED TO BE CLEAR ON THE IMPACT FAILURE TO ARRANGE MEETING WILL HAVE ON OUR BILATERAL RELATIONS. KOUVTCHE AND OTHER GON OFFICIALS PUT GREAT STORE IN A MEETING WITH THE PREY DENT AS A MEASURE OF THE USG'S TRUE COMMITMENT TO ASSIST THOSE COUNTRIES MENACED BY LIBYA. IF THE MEETING DOES NOT TAKE PLACE, OUR CONTINUING SUBSTANTIAL DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE AND MODEST MILITARY ASSISTANCE WILL BE NO LESS APPRECIATED. HOWEVER, KOUNTCHE IS LIKELY TO CONCLUDE THAT OUR RECENT STATEMENTS ON LIBYA ARE MERE RHETORIC AS FAR AS NIGER IS CONCERNED AND THAT THE USG LOOKS TO BUSINESS AS USUAL IN NIGER, REGARDING IT AS A FRENCH "CHASSE GARDEE" IN A TIME OF MOUNTING SECURITY CONCERNS. WHILE WE HAVE NEVER TRIED TO

IT MIGHT BE MADE MORE ACCEPTABLE IF WE COULD AT THE SAME TIME CAPITALIZE ON AN IDEA SUGGESTED BY RECENT STAFFDEL CHRISTENSON. 2. THIS MORNING, MARCH 15, NIGER'S PRESIDENT KOUNTCHE CALLED ME IN FOR WHAT HE CHARACTERIZED AS "AN URGENT BRIEF MEETING." HE TOLD ME THAT HE HAD JUST HEARD THAT LIBYA WAS GIVING ARMS TO UPPER VOLTA. HE THEN ASKED IF I COULD CONFIRM THIS INFORMATION. THANKS TO THE VERY TIMELY

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

RECEIPT OF REF (A), I INFORMED HIM THAT WE BELIEVE TWO LIBYAN PLANES HAD BROUGHT ARMS TO UPPER VOLTA BUT DID NOT KNOW THE NUMBERS OR TYPES. KOUNTCHE WAS VISIBLY IMPRESSED THAT I COULD ANSWER HIS REPLY IMMEDIATELY AND NOTED AGAIN THIS PART OF OUR BILATERAL RELATIONS, INFORMATION, WAS VERY MUCH APPRECIATED AND CONSIDERED BY HIM TO BE VITAL TO NIGER'S SECURITY.

- 3. I THEN ASKED HIM IF HE HAD HEARD ABOUT THE RECENT ATTEMPTED CDUP IN UPPER VOLTA. KOUNTCHE SAID HE HAD HEARD ABOUT IT FROM UPPER VOLTA PRIME MINISTER SANKARA WHEN THEY MET IN NEW DELHI FOR THE NAM SUMMIT.
- 4. I TOOK THIS OPENING TO ASK KOUNTCHE IF SANKARA HAD GIVEN HIM A READ OUT OF SANKARA'S VISIT TO TRIPOLI, REF (B). KOUNTCHE STATED THAT HIS CONVERSATIONS WITH

SANKARA GAVE HIM A VERY UNEASY FEELING. HE SAID SANKARA BECAME VERY COY WHEN THE DISCUSSIONS TURNED TO LIBYA. HE COMPLAINED THAT SANKARA WOULD NOT TAKE THE SUBJECT SERIOUSLY AND JOKED ABOUT QADHAFI'S INTENTIONS, SAYING HE WAS NOT AS BAD AS SOME PEOPLE BELIEVED.

- 5. KOUNTCHE WAS THEN INTERRUPTED BY A LONG DISTANCE PHONE CALL WHICH HE TOOK IN ANOTHER ROOM. ALTHOUGH I COULD NOT HEAR MUCH OF THE CONVERSATION, THE WORDS "UPPER VOLTA" WERE MENTIONED SEVERAL TIMES WITH GREAT FORCE. KOUNTCHE THEN RETURNED AND SAID HE WAS JUST INFORMED THAT TANKS OR TANK-LIKE MOBILE EQUIPMENT (ARMORED PERSONNEL CARRIERS?) WERE AMONG THE ITEMS GIVEN TO UPPER VOLTA BY LIBYA. HE THEN ASKED IF I HAD ANY INFORMATION TO CONFIRM THIS. I REITERATED THAT I HAD NO INFORMATION CONCERNING TYPES OR NUMBERS OF ARMS INVOLVED. KOUNTCHE THEN REQUESTED THAT I INFORM HIM ASAP AFTER I RECEIVED ANY MORE INFORMATION.
- 6. KOUNTCHE ENDED THE CONVERSATION BY SAYING IT WAS NOW CLEAR THAT QADHAFI HAD "WON" IN UPPER VOLTA AND THIS PUTS NIGER IN THE POSITION OF A "NUT BETWEEN THE PINCHERS OF A NUT CRACKER." HE SAID NIGER WILL HAVE TO BE EVEN MORE ALERT VIS-A-VIS ACTIVITIES ON ITS BORDERS. HE STRESSED NIGER'S FRIENDS MUST UNDERSTAND THIS. I ASSURED HIM THE USG WAS VERY CONCERNED WITH LIBYA'S ACTIVITIES IN UPPER VOLTA AND HOW THOSE ACTIVITIES AFFECTED THE REGION.



LONG RANGE PLANNING AND GUIDANCE DOCUMENT (CDSS), USAID WAS PROPOSING ONGOING DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE FOR NIGER. 7. KOUNTCHE THEN ABRUPTLY CHANGED THE CONVERSATION AND ASKED WHAT I THOUGHT WOULD HAPPEN NEXT IN UPPER VOLTA. AFTER SWAPPING SEVERAL RUMORS, HE STATED HE LOOKED FORWARD TO EXCHANGING INFORMATION WHEN DCM SOUTHWICK RETURNED FROM HIS TRIP TO OUAGADOUGOU.

Issue

To encourage President Kountche of Niger to adhere to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty. (C)

Background

Niger is the world's fifth largest uranium producer and exporter, and is not a signatory to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty. In recent discussions with our Ambassador, President Kountche has indicated he is willing to discuss NPT adherence with us. Our relations with the Government of Niger are excellent and we have a useful working dialogue on a number of subjects. (C)

Discussion

Ken Adelman proposes the attached letter from you to President Kountche encouraging adherence to the NPT by the Government of Niger. Ken states that Niger adherence would add momentum to the NPT and would give us and the IAEA greater oversight of uranium shipments. State and the NSC Staff concur. The speechwriters have cleared the text. (C)

Our Ambassador to Niger has advised that Niger President Kountche has indicated he is prepared to discuss the adherence of Niger to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT). (C)

ACDA proposes and State concurs in a Presidential letter to President Kountche encouraging NPT adherence. ACDA believes that since Niger is a large uranium producer, its adherence would add useful momentum to the treaty at an important time.



SUBJECT: Encouraging Niger to Adhere to the NPT

In a recent meeting with ACDA officials, our Ambassador to Niger, William R. Casey Jr., emphasized his personal objective of convincing Niger that it would be in its interest to adhere to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT). President Kountche of Niger has told Ambassador Casey that he is willing to discuss NPT adherence and is very interested in strengthening Niger's ties with the United States. In this context, it would be particularly valuable for President Reagan to send a personal letter to President Kountche urging Niger to adhere to the Treaty. Ambassador Casey would use this letter as part of his efforts to convince Niger's President to adhere to the NPT.

Bringing Niger into the NPT regime would be a significant achievement. Because Niger is the fifth largest exporter of natural uranium, its adherence would add momentum to the Treaty at a time when we are preparing for the 1985 NPT Review Conference. Moreover, as an NPT party, Niger would assume a legal obligation to report the quantities and destination of uranium shipments to the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), aiding US efforts to prevent misuse of such exports.

I strongly recommend that the President send a letter to President Kountche encouraging NPT adherence. The Department of State and Ambassador Kennedy fully concur in the proposed letter. A draft is attached.

Dear Mr. President:

Over the past three years, the United States has actively pursued far-reaching arms control initiatives to strengthen international peace and security. Our highest priority is to achieve deep reductions in the nuclear armaments of the United States and the Soviet Union. With this in mind, we have made serious proposals taking into account the views and concerns expressed by the Soviet side. For our part, the United States stands ready to continue these negotiations at any time.

Another important element of United States policy is to join with the majority of other nations to prevent the further spread of nuclear weapons. The Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons is a critical cornerstone of international efforts to reduce this threat to global peace. A decision by Niger to become a party to the Non-Proliferation Treaty would be widely welcomed within the community of nations and would be a major step in support of a more peaceful world.

Ambassador Casey will be discussing this matter with you further. However, I wish to express my personal hope that Niger will soon be able to join the United States and the majority of other nations by acceding to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons.
