SUBJECT: SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY TRIP TO CHINA

I am scheduled, on your behalf, to lead a U.S. delegation to China late next week for the third meeting of the U.S./PRC Science and Technology Exchange Commission. The head of virtually every U.S. agency dealing with research and development will participate. This visit will follow-up on George Shultz's trip to China in February in which Chinese Leader Deng Xiao-Ping emphatically expressed the importance of access to U.S. technology. He noted that we treat India much better even though they are friendly with Moscow and asked whether we considered China friend or foe. To respond to these concerns, we are now working through the interagency process a memorandum for your decision that should provide a basis for an appropriate clarification and adjustment of our technology transfer policy.

Although the preparations for the trip are going well, we have been unable to arrange a military airplane for this delegation. I would not raise this to your attention were it not for the great Chinese sensitivity to external indications of your commitment to the U.S./PRC relationship. All previous senior-level U.S. delegations to China have used military airplanes, including that led by my predecessor. Without the airplane, it will be impossible for our large delegation to arrive and depart simultaneously. In contrast to Jack Anderson's allegations about previous "junkets," a military airplane will be only slightly more expensive than flying business class and less expensive than first class. Consequently, in view of the importance of this trip to your objective of improving U.S.-China relations, I would appreciate it if you would authorize the use of a military airplane for this mission.

Bill Clark concurs.
