#### New START Proposal

- o 60% reductions in strategic offensive forces in nine years.
- -- 50% in seven years, by January 1, 1994; an additional 5% reduction by January 1, 1995; and 5% more by January 1, 1996.
- -- Sublimits of 4800 and 3300 plus direct or indirect limits which reduce ballistic missile throw-weight to 3 million kg by January 1, 1994, followed by additional 5% + 5%.
- o Commitment to abide by the restricted interpretation of the ABM Treaty until January 1, 1988; following which testing could proceed under the broad interpretation, i.e., one which permits an optimum Delta 181 test.
- o No SDI deployments beyond those permitted by the ABM Treaty for seven years; i.e., January 1, 1994.
- -- Followed by a two year discussion in which the parties would discuss the transition to a world of offense-defense. During this period initial deployments of ground-based systems beyond the permitted 100 interceptors could go forward. If no agreement by the end of the two-year period, both sides would be free to deploy space-based systems.
- o Additional details from the existing US 50% proposal which are compatible with the above.

This proposal would supercede both of our existing START proposals; i.e., 50% reductions and zero ballistic missiles.

In my judgment, the Soviets will find the new proposal attractive for four main reasons:

- 1) It postpones 50% reductions by two years to January 1, 1994 -- a more realistic goal.
- 2) 60% reductions in nine years would be a move toward matching the Soviet proposal to eliminate all strategic offensive weapons in ten years. It goes six-tenths of the way there -- a fair compromise. It also removes the Soviets' expressed concern that a zero ballistic missiles proposal made at Reykjavik would place a disproportionate burden on the USSR to restructure its forces.
- 3) A seven year commitment not to deploy advanced strategic defenses, followed by a two year discussion period during which only land-based systems could be deployed would prevent any early deployment of SDI. At the same time, it would still allow us to begin deployment of the ground-based element essentially when we would like to -- that is, on January 1, 1994.
- 4) It is "new" and yet holds to much of what is now on the table.
