


If there is anything else you need done, want to know, news from the street, or people to be taken under my wing before the tour with Antonio Anguilar begins, let me know and it's done.



Presidential Inscription in Presentation Book for King Olav V of Norway

With this memorandum I request your assistance in obtaining an inscription from President Reagan in a book to be presented to King Olav V of Norway. The occasion for the presentation will be the opening in Oslo June 23 of a major Norwegian exhibition on emigration to the United States, titled "The Journey to America." The presentation to the King of a book inscribed by President Reagan would make an extremely positive public affairs impact on this important NATO ally.

The exhibition commemorates the lives and experiences of the nearly 800,000 Norwegians who emigrated to the United States during the last century. This major undertaking, a multi-media event, is sponsored by the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Culture and Science, the University of Oslo Press, and "Aftenposten," Norway's most prestigious newspaper. King Olav V and other members of the royal family serve on the honorary committee, and the King himself will open the exhibition. USIA is also supporting the exhibition with a private sector grant, seminars, films and cultural groups.

Our Embassy in Oslo feels that the connections of kinship and culture between Norway and the United States, which historically have been strong and extensive, have recently been on the wane, particularly among young people. The Norwegian press is particularly negative about U.S. policies in Central America, and there is a vocal minority in opposition to Norwegian membership in NATO. The exhibition will serve to rekindle interest among Norwegians of all age groups in these close ties. In addition, it will help to draw Norwegian attention to positive aspects of the U.S.-Norwegian relationship, rather than to the frequent negative media treatment of U.S. policies. I agree with the Embassy that a brief message from President Reagan inscribed in the book, <u>We Americans</u>, to King Olav would add immeasurably to the occasion of the exhibition's opening. Suggested language for the inscription follows:

To His Majesty, King Olav V --With best wishes and highest esteem on the occasion of the opening of the exhibition, "The Journey to America," June 23, 1984, in Oslo.

A copy of <u>We Americans</u> is enclosed. We would like to forward the inscribed book to the Embassy in Oslo by the first of June, in good time for the exhibition opening. I appreciate your assistance in this matter.

The State Department Bureau of European Affairs concurs in this request.
