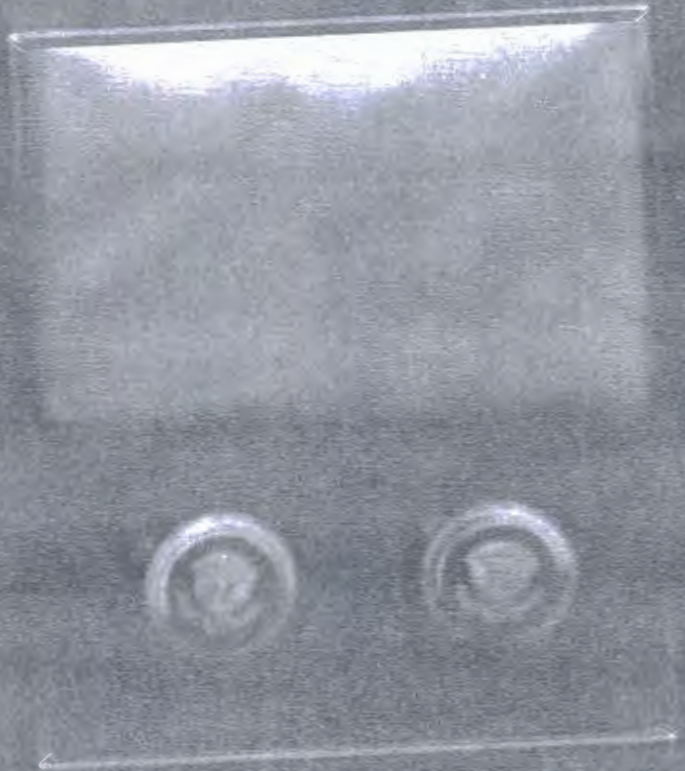

Dear Mr. President and Nancy:

We are most grateful for the beautiful White House plate you sent this year, not only because it is an extremely handsome and welcome addition to our new home, but also because it is another of the many examples we have had over the years of your thoughtfulness.

It is a continuing pleasure and privilege to work with you and to be part of the thoroughly welcome and much needed changes you have wrought in both the American government and the way people look at government and the new set of priorities that you have secured. Most of all, from my point of view, one of the greatest contributions which you have made, and the one for which I am particularly grateful every day, is the change in attitude and morale in both the military forces, and in the general public's attitude toward the dangerous work these forces perform for us all. As I have often told the troops and various interviewers I have dealt with, I think that this change from the very low esteem placed on the military starting with Vietnam and continuing up until 1981, is almost solely due to your leadership, and is one of the most important factors in the goals we have achieved since 1981. I am personally most grateful, not only because it makes my task here much easier and happier, but because it has produced the enormous loyalty and deep gratitude for you that I know you feel when you have the privilege of visiting our troops or working with them as I do every day.

Over and above all of this, it is a delight to have the privilege of working with you and I will always be grateful.


