



Dear Mrs. Beals:

Your letter to the President, regarding a gift of a quilt, has been referred to this office for reply. The Office of the Chief of Protocol maintains the historical records of gifts given by the President and First Lady to foreign government officials during official travel abroad.

The information contained in the Newsletter of the Quilters' Guild of England is not entirely correct. A quilt was given in France, but it was not "an electric patchwork" quilt. Mrs. Reagan, in June 1982, presented Mrs. Mitterrand, the wife of the French President, with a "Grandmother's Fan" pattern quilt that was pieced and hand-quilted in Pennsylvania. This traditional patchwork patterned quilt was in the colors of red, white and blue--the national colors of both our countries. We do not, however, know where this gift is being displayed or used. The quilt was purchased locally in Washington, D.C.

I hope the above information is of help to you.
