If, in any other manner in which the portrait may be presented, such as; through a meeting of possibly high persons of the oil industry here in Louisiana, or whatever other industry and area you may know or possibly suggest. I will accept this also.

Certainly, my main objective is that President Reagan recieve this portrait. I feel that it has a unique quality that literally overwhelms and enthusiastically inspires every person who looks upon this portrait of the President. I speak not from conciet nor egotism of myself as having painted it. There is something special here, because it seemed to almost literally paint itself as though it was meant to be, by purpose.

I have such strong feelings about how, positively, this portrait will affect this country when it is accepted.

I must admit, that this is the greatest thing I have done and because of what I believe, of the greatest man and President our country has had in many years.

Mr. Livingston, I respectfully and sincerely request that you do all that is in your power to put this through.

I have enclosed photographs of the portrait, two of which I would like to be presented again to the President. The other four are for you and whomever you would like to show or give them to.

Again, thank you very much for your consideration, cooperation and understanding in this matter. I am waiting each day with great anticipation and have been reluctant to show this portrait as requests of several establishments, because of being sort of, on stand-by, in case I hear from you or the President. If need be, I can come to Washington with the portrait at any time or notice if you think this necessary in expediting getting it into the WhiteHouse. Or, if you would like to recieve the portrait personally yourself and take it to the President. I will immediately bring it to you in Washington. Please don't hesitate as an imposition, to contact me by phone to do this. I am waiting and ready to respond in any way to get this portrait into the hands of President Reagan, and I will not give up until he recieves it.

With great enthusiasm, I am looking forward to hearing from you, and with appreciation, I close this letter.




