
During a recent trip to Maine, I stopped at the home of a constituent who wanted to present me with a special gift made for President Reagan with the request that I give it to the President.


This ceremony is of long standing tradition and will aid the continuing sale of the medal throughout the country resulting in additional monies coming into the Inaugural Committee's treasury.



Hagoita (Battledore)

The hagoita (battledore) made of a rectangular paulownia or cedar board with grip is a plaything of Japanese girls in the New Year. Since the 1300's, they have enjoyed playing battledore and shuttlecock during the New Year season. Originally, the hagoita is a talisman against evil, and it is our old custom to present it to a newborn girl in the New Year with every good wish for a healthy growth.

Later in the 1800's, there appeared another hagoita artistically ornamented with portraits of famous Kabuki actors or something similar in raised pictures. This decorative battledore is made by hand and requires expert skill for making it. It has gradually become gorgeous and luxurious. Today, it is usually displayed in the alcove of the living room on New Year's Day.

This hagoita (battledore) is ornamented with "KAGAMIJISHI" in raised picture.

"KAGAMIJISHI"

In old time, it was custom to display a wooden curving lion head in a hall of Tokyo castle, now the Imperial palace, on the new year days.

In these days, a lion head was believed to expel the evil influences from human body. And on the day, the most beautiful girl was elected in the castle to play a dance carrying the lion head.

One year, while a beautiful girl named "Yayoi" was dancing, she was suddenly possessed by the spirit of lion and danced as real wild lion.

Now-a-days, "Kagami-jishi" is one of the famous Kabuki plays.




