



I remember she was trailing you in a convertible and she was always saying such as, "Ronnie, you better put your sweater on" or "Ronnie you've walked far enough you better ride with me for a while." But, again as I rembember you wouldn'T take her advice & I can tell you after we reached the foot of Pine, I was plenty tired myselfk. All I can say is it's no wonder you're in such good health. You have a very concerned love-mate.

The reason I was along taking pictures of you is that I was working for the Long Beach Independent-Press Telegram at the time. One of the enclosed photos was in the paper the next day, j but I can't find the clipping I had. These are the only prints I have, but I might have the negatives. I no longer work as a press photographer as I got caught in the aer-space layoff in 1969. So I had to seekj another type of employment. My first love is still press photography but at my age{57} that kind of work is hard to find. I still take pictures once in a while. If you ever come our way again I'll be there.

I want you and Mrs. Reagan to have these photos as I thought you might like m to add them to you many pictures you have of your political career.

It is my belief that you're going to make us a good president. My family & I have approved of everything you've done so far.
