
During a recent trip to Maine, I stopped at the home of a constituent who wanted to present me with a special gift made for President Reagan with the request that I give it to the President.

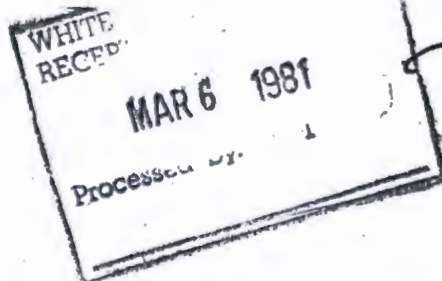




Dear Mr. President:


