Q. IS IT CORRECT TO SAY FROM WHAT YOU SAID ABOUT REMOVING THE MUNITIONS LIST CONTROLS THAT THE UNITED STATES HAS AGREED IN PRINCIPLE TO SELL ARMS TO CHINA, BUT THAT THE DETAILS OF WHAT IT WILL SELL WILL BE DETERMINED ON A CASE BY CASE BASIS. IS THAT THE UPSHOT OF IT?

HOLD BACK THE SOVIET UNION IF THE ECONOMY AT HOME CANNOT SUSTAIN THIS EXTRA EFFORT. SO WHAT WE ARE DOING THEN UNDER THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION IS TRYING TO PUT THE AMERICAN ECONOMY BACK IN SHAPE, TO DECREASE GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURES BY AS MUCH AS 50 BILLION DOLLARS IN ONE FISCAL YEAR. SO THAT'S THE THIRD PILLAR. THE FOURTH PILLAR IS TO STRENGTHEN THE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES. NOW HERE IS WHERE THE SOVIET UNION IS ATTEMPTING TO MAKE THE GREATEST AMOUNT OF HEADWAY, HERE'S WHERE YOU HAVE THE GREATEST NUMBER OF ECONOMIC, POLITICAL, SOCIAL DISLOCATIONS AS COUNTRIES ARE TRYING TO MOVE INTO NEW WAYS OF DOING THINGS FROM OLD WAYS OF DOING THINGS AND THE VULNERABILITIES THAT ARE THERE ARE VERY GREAT. SO CONSEQUENTLY IT IS UP TO THE UNITED STATES TO MOVE INTO, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES AND TO HELP OUT WHERE WE CAN, WITH DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE, WITH POLITICAL MORAL SUPPORT, WHICH DOESN'T COST US QUITE SO MUCH, BUT MAY BE VERY IMPORTANT INDEED, AND IN GENERAL TO RECOGNIZE THE IMPORTANCE OF THE THIRD WORLD OR THE DEVELOPING WORLD OR WHATEVER YOU WANT TO CALL IT IN OUR PRESENT SCHEME OF THINGS. IN ADDITION TO JUST TALKING ABOUT IT WE ARE GOING TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE, WE ARE GOING TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL MILITARY ASSISTANCE WHERE NECESSARY. WE ARE GOING TO BACK UP OUR WORDS WITH CONCRETE MEASURES TO ESTABLISH OURSELVES IN A BETTER POSITION WITH OUR FRIENDS AND

MEETING AND ALSO THE ANZUS COUNCIL MEETING IN WELLINGTON. IT WAS THEN DECIDED IT WAS IMPORTANT IF WE COULD TO ATTACH SOME OTHER STOPS ON THE SECRETARY'S LINE OF MARCH, AND WE INTENDED TO HAVE HIM GO FIRST TO JAPAN AND THEN TO CHINA, OR MAYBE CHINA LATER ON, AND JAPAN LATER ON. AT LEAST WE WANTED TO ATTACH AT LEAST THESE TWO OTHER COUNTRIES. IN OUR JAPAN SITUATION, WE HAD TO DROP IT BUT PRIME MINISTER SUZUKI WAS GOING OFF TO THE EEC, THE NEW FOREIGN MINISTER SONODA WAS GOING WITH HIM. THEREFORE, THERE WOULD BE NOBODY IN JAPAN FOR THE SECRETARY TO TALK TO. HE'S GOING TO MEET SONODA IN MANILA AT THE ASEAN FOREIGN MINISTERS' MEETING AND THERE WE WILL DISCUSS OUR SITUATION, OUR MUTUAL INTERESTS WITH SONODA. THE CHINA VISIT, HOWEVER, REMAINED. AND IT WAS QUITE CLEAR TO ALL CONCERNED WHY CHINA IS AN IMPORTANT WAY STOP FOR THE SECRETARY IF HE'S GOING TO BE OUT HERE IN THIS PART OF THE WORLD. BUT LET ME START FIRST WITH JAPAN. CONTRARY TO WHAT SOME PEOPLE MAY THINK FROM THE FACT THAT K'IM AN OLD CHINA HAND AND OTHER PEOPLE AROUND HERE ARE OLD CHINESE HANDS, JAPAN REALLY HAS GOT TO INTRINSICALLY BE AT THE TOP OF OUR SCALE OF VALUES IN EAST ASIA. IT'S THE MOST IMPORTANT COUNTRY ECONOMICALLY, IT'S THE ONE WITH WHICH WE HAVE THE GREATEST AMOUNT OF ECONOMIC RELATIONSHIP. OUR TRADE LAST YEAR WITH JAPAN WAS 51 BILLION DOLLARS, BOTH WAYS. OUR TOTAL TRADE WITH ALL OF EAST ASIA, SHOWING THE IMPORTANCE OF EAST ASIA IN GENERAL, WAS ABOUT 139 BILLION DOLLARS PLUS, SO JAPAN IS ABOUT 40 PERCENT ALONE OF OUR TOTAL TRADE WITH EAST ASIA. THIS IN ITSELF INDICATES HOW IMPORTANT JAPAN IS IN OUR SCALE OF VALUES, AND JAPANESE INFLUENCE, ECONOMICALLY AND IN GROWING WAYS POLITICALLY IS BEING FELT IN OTHER PARTS OF THE WORLD. SO, OUR FIRST PRIORITY IS TO STRENGTHEN OUR RELATIONSHIPS WITH JAPAN. I MEAN THIS NOT JUST IN THE MILITARY SENSE. THERE'S BEEN A LOT OF PREOCCUPATION LATELY WITH GETTING THE JAPANESE TO DO MORE IN NATIONAL DEFENSE WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF JAPAN'S NO WAR CONSTITUTION. THAT IS IMPORTANT. BUT EVEN MORE IMPORTANT IS THE UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES THAT OUR INTERESTS, OUR MUTUAL INTERESTS ARE PARAMOUNT, THAT WE NEED EACH OTHER, AND THAT WE'VE GOT TO CONTINUE TO WORK

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THE JAPANESE PEOPLE HAVE OPTED FOR THE LATTER AND THAT THE WHOLE QUESTION OF THE NUCLEAR RELATIONSHIP THE QUOTE ALLIANCE UNQUOTE IN THE JOINT COMMUNIQUE WE SIGNED WITH SUZUKI, THIS IS GOING TO BE TAKEN IN STRIDE, ACCEPTED, AND I EXPECT TO SEE USING THIS AS A BASE LINE, A CONSENSUS DEVELOPING IN JAPAN FOR A GREATER EFFORT IN DEFENSE, NOT A MAGNIFICENTLY TREMENDOUS ONE LIKE OURS, 32 BILLION DOLLARS, BUT ENOUGH THAT JAPAN WILL CONTINUE TO PAY ITS DUE PART IN THE DEFENSE OF THE NORTH-WEST PACIFIC, NORTH EAST ASIA, AND WE WILL CONTINUE TO HAVE VERY CLOSE AND FIRM RELATIONS WITH JAPAN. LET ME TURN BRIEFLY TO KOREA. THERE WE HAVE A SITUATION WHERE THE KOREAN AND AMERICAN INTERESTS SEEMED TO BE QUITE DIVERGENT FOR A CONSIDERABLE PERIOD OF TIME. LOTS OF TENSIONS. WE TOOK STEPS EVEN BEFORE THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION TOOK OFFICE TO SEE IF WE COULDN'T ELIMINATE THOSE. QING DU-HUANG, THE PRESIDENT OF KOREA, I THINK, ON HIS OWN, REALIZED THE IMPORTANCE OF IMPROVING THE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE UNITED STATES AND TOOK THE STEPS NECESSARY WHICH IN THE FIRST INSTANCE REFERRED TO EXERCISING CLEMENCY TO THE KOREAN LEADER KIM DAE JONG; RATHER THAN EXECUTING HIM HE COMMUTED THE SENTENCE TO LIFE IMPRISONMENT. I WOULD BE VERY SURPRISED IF OVER A PERIOD THERE MIGHT NOT BE A FURTHER EXERCISE OF CLEMENCY. BE THAT AS IT MAY THIS REMOVED AN ELEMENT OF TENSION IN U.S./KOREAN RELATIONS AND WE'VE NOW GONE BACK TO A MUCH BROADER, FREER EXCHANGE OF VIEWS, AND I MIGHT SAY THE RELATIONSHIP TO MY MIND SEEMS TO ME TO BE VERY GOOD, FRUITFUL ON BOTH SIDES, NO TENSIONS AND WE CAN CONCENTRATE ON ONE AREA OF MUTUAL CONCERN WHICH IS SECURITY. THERE IS A PROBLEM ON THE KOREAN PENINSULA, AND I'M NOT GOING TO DESCRIBE IT. SIMPLY TO SAY THAT IT EXISTS BUT THAT WE CAN NOW APPROACH IT IN A MUCH MORE EASY WAY THAN WAS THE CASE BEFORE. THIS DOES NOT MEAN THAT IN KOREA OR IN ANY OTHER COUNTRY WE ARE GOING TO NEGLECT THE PROBLEM OF HUMAN RIGHTS. IT'S THERE, IT'S A PART OF AMERICAN FOREIGN POLICY, IT'S A PART OF OUR CONCEPT OF RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN COUNTRIES NOW, AND ONE CANNOT OPERATE A FOREIGN POLICY EFFECTIVELY WITHOUT A BASE IN MORALITY. BUT THE WAY YOU EXECUTE FOREIGN POLICY, HANDLING THE ISSUE OF HUMAN RIGHTS, MAY DIFFER FROM THE WAY IT WAS EXERCISED - THE POLICY WAS CONDUCTED IN THE PREVIOUS ADMINISTRATION. WE

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DO NOT INTEND TO FLAGELLATE OUR FRIENDS IN PUBLIC.
THERE ARE OTHER WAYS OF BRINGING ATTENTION
TO BEAR ON THE QUESTION AND THESE OTHER WAYS MAY
PROVE TO BE FAR MORE EFFECTIVE THAN PUBLIC
PRESSURE, WHICH ONLY MAKES TENSIONS, FORCES LEADERS
AND COUNTRIES INTO CORNERS AND MAKE THE REACTIONS
UNPREDICTABLE. WE HAVE SEEN WHAT'S HAPPENED IN
KIM DAE JONG AND THERE HAVE BEEN OTHER EPISODES SINCE
THEN WHICH SUGGEST TO ME THAT KOREA UNDERSTANDS THE
PROBLEM AND IS POINTING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION. I CAN
SAY THE SAME FOR OTHER COUNTRIES IN EAST ASIA AS WELL.

LET ME TALK BRIEFLY ABOUT CHINA. IT'S QUITE CLEAR
THAT STRATEGICALLY SPEAKING CHINA HAS GOT TO BE IN
CLOSE JUXTAPOSITION WITH THE UNITED STATES.
STRATEGICALLY SPEAKING, , YOU'VE
GOT TO HAVE THE RELATIONSHIP WITH CHINA. THERE ARE
NOW 51 SOVIET DIVISIONS STATIONED ALONG THE CHINESE
BORDER. THE SOVIET PACIFIC FLTTE IS SECOND IN SIZE
ONLY TO THE SOVIET NORTHERN FLEET WHICH IS THE ONE
DEPLOYED OPPOSITE NATO. SOVIET AIR POWER IS GROWING
AND CONSIDERABLE. THE SOVIET POSITION IN SOUTH
CHINA SEAS IS EVIDENT TO US ALL IN BAY.
THE SOVIET SUPPORT FOR VIET NAM AND KAMPUCHEA IS
ALSO THERE. STRATEGICALLY THEN, CHINA OCCUPIES A
VERY IMPORTANT POSITION IN OUR RELATIONSHIPS AND
OUR CONCEPT OF THE WORLD BALANCE OF POWER. WHAT THE
SECRETARY IS HERE TO DO IS TO MAINTAIN AND IF
POSSIBLE STRENGTHEN THE STRATEGIC RELATIONSHIP WITH
THE PRC, WHICH HE HAS DESCRIBED IN A TIME INTERVIEW
OF MARCH 16 AS BEING OF OVERRIDING IMPORTANCE.
THAT STATEMENT IN TIME OF MARCH 16 RECEIVED HIGHEST
LEVEL U.S. GOVERNMENT CLEARANCE. I WOULD ALSO REFER
YOU TO WHAT WAS SAID ABOUT TAIWAN IN THAT SAME

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ARTICLE. I'M NOT GOING TO GO INTO ANY OTHER DETAIL, JUST LET YOU GO BACK AND CONSULT YOUR FILES, AND THAT'S HOW WE INTEND TO HANDLE THE TAIWAN PROBLEM. NOW, LET ME PROCEED FURTHER ABOUT SOUTH EAST ASIA. ASEAN IS THE HARD CORE OF AMERICAN POLICY AT THIS TIME IN SOUTH EAST ASIA. THE FIVE COUNTRIES...OF COURSE WE HAVE BILATERAL RELATIONS - VERY FRUITFUL BILATERAL RELATIONS WITH ALL FIVE. BUT THEY ARE TENDING IN THE INTERNATIONAL ARENA, FAIRLY STEADILY, MORE AND MORE TO FUNCTION AS A UNIT. ASEAN IS A FORCE IN BEING AND IS NOW OF SOME CONSEQUENCE, PARTICULARLY AS PERTAINS TO THE VIETNAMESE AGGRESSION AGAINST, AND OCCUPATION OF, KAMPUCHEA. WE AND THE ASEAN COUNTRIES ARE ON THE SAME WICKET WITH REPECT TO THE VIETNAMESE AND SOUTH EAST ASIA. WE BELIEVE THAT IT IS IMPERATIVE TO GET THE VIETNAMESE OUT OF KAMPUCHEA AND IN FACT THE SOVIETS OUT OF VIET NAM. AND WE WILL BE WORKING VERY CLOSELY WITH THE ASEAN COUNTRIES, WITH THAILAND, THE FRONT LINE STATE, AND THE OTHERS TO THIS END. WHEN THE SECRETARY GETS TO THE MANILA CONFERENCE OF FOREIGN MINISTERS OF THE ASEAN COUNTRIES WE WILL BE TALKING ABOUT WHAT WE CAN DO TO HELP EACH OTHER IN THIS REGARD. WE ARE NOT GOING TO BE OUT IN FRONT. WE WILL TAKE OUR CUE FROM THE ASEAN COUNTRIES. THEY ARE THE ONES MOST DIRECTLY CONCERNED AND IT WOULD BE IMPROPER FOR US TO TELL THEM WHAT WE THINK THEY SHOULD DO. IT IS FAR MORE APPROPRIATE THAT WE LISTEN TO WHAT THEY HAVE TO SAY AND TO TAKE OUR CUE FROM THEM. ONE THING THAT WE ARE GOING TO DO IS...I ASSUME THAT THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON KAMPUCHEA WILL BE CONVENED ON THE 13TH JULY. IT IS TENTATIVELY NOW SET FOR NEW YORK. THE SECRETARY OF STATE WILL BE THERE, WE BELIEVE, AND SO WILL THE FOREIGN MINISTERS OF THE FIVE ASEAN COUNTRIES. I SUSPECT THERE MAY BE REPRESENTATION FROM HERE IN THE PRC. I UNDERSTAND THAT SONODA OF JAPAN WILL BE ALSO PRESENT. PROBLEMS TO BE SURE, AND IN AUSTRALIA, IF WE LOOK AT THE NEWSPAPERS, ALMOST EVERY DAY THERE IS SOME ARTICLE THAT HAS SOME GRIPE ABOUT THE DEFENSE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE UNITED STATES. ON THE OTHER HAND, MY AUSTRALIAN FRIENDS IN WASHINGTON, D.C., TELL ME, THAT IF A POLL WERE TO BE TAKEN AT LEAST 70 PERCENT OF THE AUSTRALIAN PEOPLE WOULD BE VERY STRONG INDEED ON THE STRENGTH OF THE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE UNITED STATES AND THAT OPPOSITION POLITICIANS WHO WISH TO USE THE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE U.S. AS A MEANS TO EMBARRASS THE FRASER GOVERNMENT ARE NOT GOING TO MAKE IT. IT JUST WON'T WORK. THE SAME THING IS TRUE WITH NEW ZEALAND. AND WITH RESPECT TO THESE COUNTRIES, WE HAVE A MILITARY RELATIONSHIP, YES, AND WE APPLAUD WHAT THEY'RE DOING. THE CONTRIBUTION OF AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND TO THE STABILITY OF SOUTH EAST ASIA THROUGH SOMETHING CALLED THE FPDA, THE FIVE POWER DEFENSE ARRANGEMENT BY WHICH THE AUSTRALIANS HAVE TWO SQUADRONS OF MIRAGE STATIONED AT BUTTERSWORTH IN MALAYSIA, AND THE NEW ZEALANDERS HAVE A BATTALION REINFORCED OF THEIR TROOPS IN SINGAPORE.
