2. CHARGE MADE PRESENTATION PER REFTEL MORNING OF AUGUST 27 TO VICE FOREIGN MINISTER ZHANG WENJIN.

HIS REACTION WAS GUARDEDLY PUSITIVE. ZHANG SAID

WE APPEARED TO HAVE PROVIDED THE DEGREE OF

SPECIFICITY THAT THE CHINESE HAD FELT THEY NEEDED. HE SAID HE UNDERSTOOD OUR CONCERN FOR

IMMEDIATE CONFIRMATION OF THE DATES. HE NOTED

GENERAL LIU HUAQING'S PERSONAL CONCERN WITH THE STATUS OF HIS VISIT, AND SAID HE HOPED TO BE BACK

TO US ASAP WITH AN ANSWER AFTER CONSULTATIONS WITH

THE LEADERSHIP. HE DID NOT RAISE THE ISSUE OF DUR

INTENTIONS VIS-A-VIS TAIWAN.

3. ON THE AFTERNOON OF AUGUST 27 DEFENSE ATTACHE BGEN WEBB MET WITH GENERAL ZHANG BINGYU, DEPUTY

DIRECTOR FAB/MND TO MAKE A MORE DETAILED

PRESENTATION. A FULL TRANSLATION OF EACH POINT

WAS MADE. FOLLOWING THE PRESENTATION GENERAL

ZHANG (WHO HAD PROBABLY ALREADY BEEN BRIEFED BY MFA) EXPRESSED HIS APPRECIATION FOR OUR RESPONSE,

NOTING THAT MND WILL TAKE A POSITIVE ATTITUDE ON

THIS AFFAIR. HE CONTINUED, STATING THAT HE AND

HIS STAFF WILL WORK ON THE SUBJECT TUDAY AND MAKE A POSITIVE PROPOSAL TO THEIR SUPERIORS. ZHANG ALSO

SAID THAT HE WOULD URGE A DEFINITE RESPONSE AT

THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE MOMENT, HE NOTED THAT ALL

UNDERSTOOD THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS EVENT TO OUR

BILATERAL RELATIONS.

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4. DATT BELIEVES ZHANG WAS SATISFIED WITH THE POINTS WE MADE. THIS IS PROBABLY VERY SIGNIFICANT AS HE WAS A FULL-TIME PARTICIPANT IN THE 1980 LIU VISIT. MORE IMPORTANTLY, HIS INDICATION OF A POSITIVE RECOMMENDATION UP THE CHAIN OF COMMAND PROBABLY MEANS THAT HE HAS THE DESIRED US RESPONSE. FREEMAN BT #9130 NNNN

VICE CHAIRMAN DENG XIAOPING PRESENTED ONE OF THE CLEAREST PRC EXPOSITIONS TO DATE ON BEIJING'S APPROACH TO TAIWAN DURING HIS AUGUST 27 TALKS WITH FORMER PRESIDENT CARTER. HE FOCUSED AT LENGTH ON CHINA'S PLANS FOR THE PEACEFUL REUNIFICATION OF TAIWAN, CLAIMING THAT THIS APPROACH IS INCREASINGLY BEING "UNDERSTOOD" BY THE PEOPLE ON TAIWAN, DESPITE THE CONTINUED INTRANSIGENCE OF THE TAIWAN "AUTHORITIES." DENG SAID TAIWAN WOULD BECOME A "SPECIAL REGION" WITHIN THE PRC FOLLOWING REUNIFICATION. THE TAIWAN GOVERNMENT WOULD BECOME A LOCAL GOVERNMENT. "PROPER ARRANGEMENTS" WOULD BE MADE TO ENSURE APPROPRIATE POLITICAL POSITIONS FOR

TAIWAN'S LEADERS. TAIWAN WOULD MAINTAIN ITS ARMED FORCES, ITS "SUCIAL SYSTEM," CAPITALISM, AND ITS "WAY AND STYLE OF LIFE." TAIWAN NEED NOT "ACCEPT COMMUNISM" AND COULD -- AS A LOCAL GOVERNMENT -- CARRY ON CONTACTS WITH FOREIGN GOVERNMENTS, FOR EXAMPLE JAPAN AND THE US. HE REMARKED THAT "FOR A CONSIDERABLE PERIOD OF TIME -- NOT A SHORT PERIOD --WE CAN AND WILL CONCENTRATE" ON PEACEFUL UNIFICATION. DENG ALSO EXPRESSED STRONG CONCERN ABOUT THE LACK OF MOVEMENT ON TAIWAN. HE REITERATED THE CHINESE WARNING THAT THE TAIWAN PROBLEM COULD CAUSE SIND-US RELATIONS

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WHSR COMMENTS:

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TO MARK TIME OR EVEN TO RETROGRESS. HE REMARKED THAT THE CHINESE LEADERSHIP IS VULNERABLE ON THE ISSUE AND COULD BE "KICKED OUT OF DEFICE" IF IT IS NOT HANDLED PROPERLY. DENG LISTED THREE SPECIFIC SITUATIONS WHICH COULD LEAD BEIJING TO RESORT TO FORCE ON TAIWAN: TAIWAN LEADERS CONTINUE TO REFUSE TO NEGOTIATE, CHIANG CHING-KUU TURNS TO THE USSR, OR HE ATTEMPTS TO CARRY ON THE CIVIL WAR BY USING FORCE. DENG URGED THAT THE US FACILITATE REUNIFICATION, STATING THAT "THE US IS IN A UNIQUE POSITION TO PROMOTE REGOTIATIONS TOWARD A PEACEFUL SETTLEMENT, THERE IS A LOT YOU CAN DO." HE DID NUT DIRECTLY ADDRESS US ARMS SALES TO TAIWAN. ON GLOBAL ISSUES, DENG EMPHASIZED CONCERTED ACTION AGAINST THE USSR DURING THE DANGEROUS DECADE OF THE 1980'S. HE INSISTED THAT CHINA HAS NO AGGRESSIVE DESIGNS AGAINST ITS NEIGHBORS, NOTING THAT "CHINA CAN'T EVEN MANAGE ITS OWN AFFAIRS AND NEEDS NO MORE TERRITORY OR PROBLEMS." END SUMMARY. 3. AFTER AN EXCHANGE OF COMPLIMENTS ABOUT THE DECISIVE ROLE EACH HAD PLAYED IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF UNITED STATES-CHINA RELATIONS, AND EXPRESSIONS OF HOPE FOR THEIR FURUTHER PROGRESS, THE FORMER PRESIDENT AND VICE CHAIRMAN DENG EXCUSED THE PRESS FROM THE ROOM AND TURNED TO SUBSTANCE. 4. REFERRING TO THE VICE CHAIRMAN'S REFERENCE TO THE TAIWAN QUESTION IN HIS INTRODUCTORY, PUBLIC REMARKS, PRESIDENT CARTER SAID THAT BOTH SIDES HAD PROCEEDED WITH NORMALIZATION DESPITE THE CONTINUING EXISTENCE OF SOME DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE UNITED STATS AND CHINA. BOTH SIDES HAD MADE IT CLEAR AT THE TIME THAT THEY RECOGNIZED THE EXISTENCE OF SUCH DIFFERENCES, BUT BOTH HAD MADE IT CLEAR THAT THEY DID NOT INTEND TO LET THEM GET IN THE WAY OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF OUR RELATIONSHIP. IN HIS PERSONAL VIEW, THE FORMER PRESIDENT SAID, DIFFERENCES WERE INEVITABLE, BUT NEITHER NEW DIFFERENCES NOR THOSE LEFT OVER FROM THE PAST SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO INFLUENCE THE COURSE OF UNITED STATESA-CHINA RELATIONS. HE ADDED THAT HE WAS CONFIDENT THAT IN TIME SUCH DIFFERENCES COULD BE RESOLVED. 5. THE VICE CHAIRMAN RESPONDED THAT THIS SHOULD INDEED BE THE CASE. HE NOTED THAT THERE WERE OFTEN DIFFERENCES EVEN BETWEEN ALLIES AND THAT SOME WERE TO BE EXPECTED BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND CHINA, WHICH HAVE DIFFERING SOCIAL SYSTEMS. IN ORDER TO ADDRESS THESE DIFFERENCES, HE SAID, WE NEED TO

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ENGAGE IN GOOD CONSULTATIONS ON THE BASIS OF MUTUAL RESPECT AND UNDERSTANDING. 6. PRESIDENT CARTER ASKED WHETHER THE VICE CHAIRMAN WAS SATISFIED WITH THE PROGRESS TO DATE IN SIND-AMERICAN RELATIONS. DENG REPLIED THAT "GENERALLY SPEAKING PROGRESS HAD BEEN NOT BAD." BUT NOW, HE SAID, SIND-AMERICAN RELATIONS WERE "CLOUDED" AND "A SHADOW" WAS OVER THEM, I.E., THE TAIWAN PROBLEM. HE FELT UBLIGED TO SAY AGAIN THAT THE PROBLEM WAS STILL TAIWAN. BOTH SIDES NEED TO HANDLE THIS ISSUE "PROPERLY," PARTICULARLY THE UNITED STATES. HE HOPED TO SEE SIND-AMERICAN RELATIONS CONTINUE TO MAKE HEADWAY, HE SAID. HE BELIEVED THAT THIS WAS REQUIRED BY THE NEEDS OF THE GLOBAL STRATEGIC SITUATION. IT WAS ALSO RQUIRED, HE ADDED, BY BOTH CHINA AND THE UNITED STATES (I.E., IN TERMS OF BILATERAL INTERESTS). 7. SOME TIME AGO, HE SAID, SOME IN THE UNITED STATES HAD THE NOTION THAT THEUNITED STATES HAD NOTHING WHICH IT NEEDED TO ASK FROM CHINA, BUT THAT CHINA HAD MUCH TO SEEK IN ITS RELATIONSHIP WITH THE UNITED STATES. THIS NOTION WAS ERRUNEOUS. THE BT #9201 NNNN

NODIS PLAIN FACT WAS THAT "WE NEED EACH OTHER." IF OUR PROBLEMS WERE "NOT HANDLED WELL =- MEANING THE TAIWAN PROBLEM -- THIS COULD CAUSE SINO-AMERICAN RELATIONS TO MARK TIME, OR EVEN TO RETROGRESS." 8. THE VICE CHAIRMAN SAID THAT HE HAD TOLD SECRETARY HAIG IN JUNE THAT THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT NEEDED TO "PAY ATTENTION TO THIS PROBLEM" AND TO APPROACH IT WITH "ALL PRUDENCE." SECRETARY HAIG HAD SHARED THIS VIEW, HE ASSERTED. 9. THE VICE CHAIRMAN SAID "THERE ARE LIMITS TO EVERYTHING." SHOULD THE SITUATION DEVELOP BEYOND THESE LIMITS, THEN THE UNITED STATES WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO "SWALLOW" THE RESULT. NEITHER COULD CHINA STOMACH IT. THE PROBLEM HE WAS DISCUSSING, HE SAID, WAS NOT ONE THAT A FEW LEADERS COULD ARBITRARILY (N.B.; INTERPRETED AS "WILLFULLY") RESOLVE OR DECIDE BECAUSE IT INVOLVED THE SENTIMENTS OF ONE BILLION CHINESE PEOPLE. THE VICE CHAIRMAN SAID HE HAD DRAWN THE ATTENTION OF SECRETARY HAIG TO THIS AND URGED THAT THE UNITED STATES PAY ATTENTION TO THE FEELINGS OF THE CHINESE PEOPLE. "SHOULD WE (THE CHINESE LEADERSHIP) NOT HANDLE THIS ISSUE PROPERLY," THE VICE CHAIRMAN SAID, "THEN WE WILL BE KICKED OUT OF OFFICE." 10. DENG SAID THAT HE HAD TOLD THE SECRETARY THAT IN THE UNITED STATES OPINION POLLS WERE OFTEN ORGANIZED BY LOBBIES, BUT THAT IN CHINA THERE WAS NO NEED TO CONDUCT A POLL ABOUT TAIWAN. THE LEADERSHIP KNEW CLEARLY WHAT THE ONE BILLION CHINESE PEOPLE FELT ON

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THIS ISSUE. HE HAD SUGGESTED TO THE SECRETARY, HE SAID, THAT THE AMERICAN LEADERSHIP DID NOT NEED THE OPINION OF LOBBIES AND SPECIAL INTEREST GROUPS, WHICH REPRESENTED ONLY TENS OF THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE, AS DISTINCT FROM THE ONE BILLION CHINESE PEOPLE WHOSE FEELINGS WERE INVOLVED IN THIS ISSUE. 11. PRESIDENT CARTER SAID THAT AMERICANS, INCLUDING HIMSELF, WERE WELL AWARE OF THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS ISSUE TO THE CHINSE LEADERSHIP AND PEOPLE. IN NORMALIZING RELATIONS HE HAD EMPHASIZED THE NEED FOR PRUDENCE, PATIENCE AND PEACEFUL MEANS IN APPROACHING THE ISSUE. HE HAD COMMITTED THE UNITED STATES -- AND DONE SO PUBLICLY -- TO THE RECOGNITION OF ONE CHINA OF WHICH TAIWAN IS A PART. HE HAD EXPRESSED HIS UNDERSTANDING THAT "EVERY EFFORT" WOULD BE MADE BY THE CHINESE ON THE MAINLAND AND THE PEOPLE OF TAIWAN TO RESOLVE THE ISSUE PEACEFULLY "WITHOUT INTERFERENCE FROM OUR COUNTRY." ALL OF THE AGREE-MENTS WHICH HAD BEEN CONSUMMATED WERE CLEARLY RECORDED IN THE NORMALIZATION STATEMENTS. THERE WERE NO CONFLICTING STATEMENTS, RULES OR LAWS THAT OVERRODE THOSE COMMITMENTS. HE ADDED THAT THE UNITED STATES RECOGNIZED THAT CHINA FACED A SERIOUS SECURITY SITUATION TO ITS NORTH AS WELL AS ITS SOUTH, AND THAT IT WOULD BE A SERIOUS MISTAKE FOR THE UNITED STATES TO DO ANYTHING TO ADD A SECURITY PROBLEM TO CHINA'S EAST. 12. THE FORMER PRESIDENT SAID THAT WHEN HE RETURNED TO THE UNITED STATES HE WOULD COMMUNICATE VICE CHAIRMAN DENG'S DEEP CONCERNS ABOUT THIS ISSUE TO PRESIDENT REAGAN AND SECRETARY HAIG. HE ADDED THAT HE WOULD ALSO EXPRESS HIS OWN PERSONAL VIEWS ON THE ISSUE TO THEM. HE WOULD BE HAPPY TO CONVEY THESE VIEWS TO THE VICE CHAIRMAN AS WELL, IN PRIVATE. 13. DENG AGREED TO A PRIVATE SESSION WITH PRESIDENT CARTER. HE SAID HE SINCERELY HOPED THAT SIND-AMERICAN RELATIONS WOULD CONTINUE TO PROGRESS AND NOT COME TO A STANDSTILL. "THIS IS REQUIRED," HE SAID, "BY DEVELOPMENTS IN THE GLOBAL STRATEGIC SITUATION." 14. THE VICE CHAIRMAN REMARKED THAT THE DECADE OF THE 1980'S HAD JUST BEGUN. AS WE HAD APPROACHED THIS DECADE, HE SAID, MANY HAD FORESEEN THAT IT WOULD BE A "DECADE OF DANGER." THIS VIEW WAS "FAR FROM BASELESS." HE ASKED RHETDRICALLY WHETHER THE SOVIET UNION HAD SLACKENED ITS CHALLENGE, AND ANSWERED THAT

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IT HAD NOT. RATHER THE SOVIETS REMAINED READY TO EXPLOIT EVERY POSSIBLE OPENING. HAD THE SITUATIONS IN AFGHANISTAN AND KAMPUCHEA BEEN SOLVED? HAD THE MIDDLE EAST SITUATION BEEN SOLVED? NEW PROBLEMS CONTINUALLY CROPPED UP, INCLUDING NEW PROBLEMS IN THE MIDDLE EAST, HE SAID. HE DESCRIBED THE MIDDLE EAST AS A "VERY DANGEROUS AND EXPLOSIVE SITUATION." IF ONE ASKED WHETHER THESE KINDS OF PROBLEMS IN THE WORLD HAD DIMINISHED OR GROWN, IT WAS OBVIOUS, HE SAID, THEY HAD CONTINUED TO INCREASE. 15. DENG NOTED THE RECENT FORGING OF A MILITARY ALLIANCE BETWEEN ETHIOPIA, LIBYA AND OSTH YEMEN. HE REFERRED TO THE CLASH -- "IN INTERNATIONAL WATERS" -- BETWEEN AMERICAN AIRCRAFT AND LIBYAN JETS. HE ADDED THAT THE ISRAELIS HAD RECENTLY RESORTED TO A SERIES OF ILL-ADVISED TACTICAL MOVES. HE NOTED THAT QADHAFI HAD SAID THAT IF THE UNITED STATES COULD LOOK TO ITS OWN FRIENDS, LIBYA COULD DO LIKEWISE. DENG REMARKED ON THE CONTINUING EXISTENCE OF SERIOUS PROBLEMS CONCERNING IRAN AND, SUMMARIZING, SAID THAT MANY NEW PROBLEMS WERE EMERGING. HE ADDED THAT "ONE CAN FIND THE HAND OF THE SOVIET UNION BEHIND ALL THIS." 16. THE VICE CHAIRMAN CONCLUDED BY SAYING THAT HE HAD MENTIONED THESE PROBLEMS IN THE HOPE THAT THE BT #9201 NNNN

NODIS - UNITED STATES ADMINISTRATION WOULD NOT THINK THAT A TOUCH STANCE INTERNATIONALLY WOULD REDUCE THE IMPORTANCE OF THESE PROBLEMS OR SOLVE THEM. HE SAID THAT BREZHNEV HAD RECENTLY RETURNED TO DISCUSSING "DETENTE," AND NOTED THAT SOME SEEMED TO TAKE THIS AS IF, "IN THIS WAY, THE UNITED STATES HAS GAINED A POINT." 17. PRESIDENT CARTER RESPONDED THAT THE UNITED STATES DID NOT WANT TO LOSE THIS PUINT. HE ADDED THAT IT WAS IMPORTANT TO ISOLATE AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE THE AGGRESSORS IN AFGHANISTAN AND KAMPUCHEA. IT WAS VERY IMPORTANT, HE SAID, THAT VIETNAM KNOW THAT IT COULD "FIND NO FRIEND EITHER IN THIS REGION OR ELSEWHERE IN THE WORLD AS LONG AS IT MAINTAINS ITS INVASION FORCES IN KAMPUCHEA." VICE CHAIRMAN DENG SAID HE AGREED. 18. PRESIDENT CARTER CALLED THE RECENT INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON KAMPUCHEA IN NEW YORK A VERY GOOD STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION, AND LAUDED THE CHANGES IN THE RESOLUTION BROUGHT ABOUT BY CHINESE EFFORTS. THE CONFERENCE HAD ACHIEVED GOOD RESULTS. SIMILARLY, PREMIER ZHAD ZIYANG'S RECENT VISIT TO SOUTHEAST ASIAN COUNTRIES HAD BEEN HELPFUL IN ALLEVIATING THEIR LONG-TERM CONCERNS ABOUT CHINESE INTENTIONS. THOSE COUNTRIES THREATENED BY JOINT SOVIET-VIETNAMESE AGGRESSION MUST KNOW WITH CERTITUDE THAT THE UNITED STATES, CHINA, JAPAN, ASEAN, AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND STAND TOGETHER IN OPPOSITION TO AGGRESSION

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THAT THIS UNITY WILL NOT FLAG. 19. IT WAS THE SAME WITH SOVIET AGGRESSION IN AFGHANISTAN, THE FORMER PRESIDENT ADDED. IN HIS VIEW, THE SOVIETTS HAD MADE A SERIOUS MISTAKE IN THEIR INVASION OF AFGHANISTAN. THIS ACTION HAD DAMAGED THEIR STATUS AMONG MANY DEVELOPING NATIONS. IT HAD REVEALED THEIR TRUE INTENTIONS. HE CALLED THE HERDISM OF THE AFGHANISTAN FREEDOM FIGHTERS AND THE CONSISTENT, UNSWERVING OPPOSITION OF OTHER NATIONS TO THIS AGGRESSION "VERY IMPRESSIVE." ON THESE QUESTIONS, HE SAID, THE UNITED STATES AND CHINA HAD VERY SIMILAR, IF NOT IDENTICAL, VIEWS. 20. PRESIDENT CARTER SAID THAT HIS EFFORTS IN THE MIDDLE EAST HAD BEEN DIRECTED TO THE EXCLUSION OF SOVIET INFLUENCE AND THE SEARCH FOR PEACE BETWEEN ISRAEL AND HER NEIGHBORS. HE HAD BEEN SUCCESSFUL TO SOME DEGREE WITH EGYPT, HE SAID, BUT THE OVERALL QUESTION WAS HOW TO HONOR THE RIGHTS OF THE PALESTINIAN PEOPLE. HE TERMED SOME ISRAELI ACTIONS VERY DISAPPOINTING TO HIM PERSONALLY AND VERY EMBARRASSING TO THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT. HE ADDED, HOWEVER, THAT IT WAS IMPORTANT THAT THE CHINESE LEADERSHIP REALIZE THAT THE STRONG COMMITMENT TO ISREAEL'S SECURITY AMONG THE ONE QUARTER BILLION AMERICAN PEOPLE WAS NOT LIMITED TO A SMALL GROUP OR TO A PORTION OF THE AMERICAN POLITICAL LEADERSHIP. HE NOTED THAT IN A FEW MONTHS -- IN APRIL -- ISRAEL WOULD BE RETURNING THE REMAINING TERRITORY IN THE SINAI TO EGYPT. PRESIDENT SADAT, WHO HAD COME TO SEE HIM DURING HIS MOST RECENT VISIT TO THE UNITED STATES, HAD TOLD HIM THAT BOTH PRESIDENT REAGAN AND SECRETARY HAIG WERE COMMITTED TO PURSUE THE PEACE PROCESS FURTHER AFTER THIS LAND WAS RETURNED. THE LAST POINT ON THIS MATTER WAS THAT ISRAEL MUST HONOR PALESTINIAN RIGHTS AND THE PALESTINIANS, FOR THEIR PART, MUST RECOGNIZE ISREAEL'S RIGHT TO LIVE IN PEACE. 21. THE FORMER PRESIDENT EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT THE UNITED STATES WOULD CONTINUE TO REACH OUT THE HAND OF FRIENDSHIP TO THE NATIONS OF AFRICA AND ASIA. HE HOPED THAT PRESIDENT REAGAN AND SECRETARY HAIG WOULD CONTINUE THE EFFORTS THAT HE HAD BEGUN IN THIS REGARD, AND HE BELIEVED THAT THEY WOULD. 22. VICE CHAIRMAN DENG SAID THAT, AS HE HAD EARLIER REMARKED, WE WERE NOW AT THE BEGINNING OF THE "DANGEROUS DECADE OF THE 1980'S." WHEN HE HAD TALKED

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TO PRESIDENT CARTER IN WASHINGTON, HE SAID, HE HADSTATED THAT CHINA HAD NO OBJECTIONS TO MEETING THE SOVIET CHALLENGE THROUGH THE SIGNING OF AGREEMENTS WITH MOSCOW, BUT THAT TO REALLY COUNTER THE SOVIETS SUCCESSFULLY, IT WAS IMPORTANT "TO DO SOMETHING SUBSTANTIVE AND DOWN TO EARTH." HE RECALLED THAT HE HAD CITED THE SIND-JAPANESE TREATY OF PEACE AND FRIENDSHIP AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF NORMAL RELATIONS BETWEEN CHINA AND THE UNITED STATES AS EXAMPLES OF THIS KIND OF ACTION. 23. VICE CHAIRMAN DENG SAID THAT THE UNITED STATES COULD NOT STAND UP TO THE SOVIET CHALLENGE BY ITSELF ALONE. NOR COULD WESTERN EUROPE DO SO, LET ALONE CHINA, "WHICH IS A POOR AND WEAK COUNTRY." IT WAS ESSENTIAL, THEREFORE, HE SAID, THAT CHINA, JAPAN, THE UNITED STATES, WESTERN EUROPE AND OTHERS IN THIS GEOGRAPHICAL BELT, INCLUDING THIRD WORLD NATIONS IN THE MIDDLE EAST, AND IN SOUTH AND SOUTHEAST ASIA, BAND TUGETHER TO MEET THE CHALLENGE. "WE ARE REQUIRED TO COORDINATE OUR COURSES OF ACTION." NOW, HE SAID, DUR FIRST PRIDRITY MUST BE TO PURSUE THIS EARNESTLY TO COPE WITH DEVELOPMENTS IN THIS "DANGEROUS DECADE." "EACH AND EVERY STEP TOWARD UNITY AMONG THE COUNTRIES I HAVE MENTIONED IS ONE MORE STEP TOWARD REDUCING THE RISK OF SOVIET AGGRESSION. PERHAPS YOU WILL RECALL THAT WHEN I

I SINCERELY HOPE THAT LEADERS IN THE UNITED STATES, CHINA, JAPAN AS WELL AS IN WESTERN EUROPE WILL CONSIDER MATTERS FROM A GLOBAL STRATEGIC PROPSECTIVE, AND I INCLUDE IN THAT THE HOPE THAT THAT WILL BE OUR APPROACH TO SIND-AMERICAN RELATIONS." 24. PRESIDENT CARTER INQUIRED WHETHER VICE CHAIRMAN DENG COULD BE MORE SPECIFIC ON THOSE OPPORTUNITIES WE SHOULD BE PURSUING AND STEPS WE SHOULD BE TAKING TO FORGE GREATER UNITY AMONG US. THE VICE CHAIRMAN REPLIED THAT THERE WERE INDEED FURTHER OPPORTUNITIES, AND CITED RESOLUTION OF THE TAIWAN ISSUE AS "ONE EXAMPLE IN THE CONTEXT OF SIND-AMERICAN RELATIONS." HE EXPRESS THE HOPE THAT QUESTIONS OF THIS KIND NOT BE ALLOWED TO DEVELOP "IN A BAD WAY." HE ADDED THAT HE AND OTHER CHINESE COULD NOT HELP BEING CONSCIOUS OF THESE PROBLEMS. HE HAD TOLD SECRETARY HAIG THAT "WE CANNOT BUT CONSIDER THAT INTERFERENCE AND THE SHADOWS THAT LIE OVER SINO-AMERICAN RELATIONS COULD CAUSE THEM TO STAND STILL OR TO RETROGRESS." CHINA WOULD NOT LIKE TO SEE THIS HAPPEN. BUT, HE ADDED, SHOULD THIS HAPPEN "IT WOULD NOT TERRIFY THE CHINESE PEOPLE." 25. HE AND OTHER CHINESE HAD TOLD SECRETARY HAIG

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AND OTHER AMERICANS THAT SUME MAY CONSIDER CHINA TO BE UNSTABLE, BACKWARD AND AFRAID OF THE INTERNATIONAL SITUATION. HE HAD TOLD THE SECRETARY THAT CHINA DID NOT FEAR ANY FOREIGN COUNTRY. CHINA MIGHT BE POOR AND BACKWARD, HE SAID, BUT IT HAD GREAT ABILITY TO SURVIVE. 26. THE VICE CHAIRMAN NOTED THAT SOME IN SOUTHEAST ASIA, FOR EXAMPLE, IN INDONESIA AND MALAYSIA, SEEM TO BELIEVE THAT THE MAIN THREAT TO THEM WAS FROM CHINA. "BUT I HAVE SAID TO THEM THAT WE CAN'T EVEN MANAGE OUR OWN AFFAIRS IN THE 9.6 MILLION SQUARE KILOMETERS WE NOW HAVE, SO WHY SHOULD WE WANT TO TAKE ON MORE TERRITORY AND MORE PROBLEMS?" THE VICE CHAIRMAN SAID THAT IF ONE STUDIES MODERN CHINESE HISTORY, ONE WOULD SEE THAT CHINA HAD NEVER INVADED ANY DTHER COUNTRIES. HE SAID HE HAD TOLD THE LEADERS OF ASEAN THAT EVEN IF THE STRAITS OF MALACCA WERE CUT, CHINA WOULD STILL SURVIVE. SOVIET TROOPS WERE MASSED ON CHINA'S BORDERS, HE SAID, "BUT, SO WHAT? WE WENT THROUGH DUR MOST DIFFICULT TIMES IN YAN'AN BUT WE STILL SURVIVED EVEN THAT." 27. "SO," HE CONCLUDED, "WE CHINESE ARE REALISTIC. DENG RESPONDED THAT THERE HAD BEEN NO MARKED PROGRESS. NVERTHELESS, THERE HAD BEEN A CERTAIN EFFECT FELT IN TAIWAN IN TERMS OF MORE AND MORE EXPRESSIONS OF HOPE FOR THE REUNIFICATION OF THE COUNTRY. CHINA'S TAIWAN POLICY, HE SAID, "IS SLOWLY BEING UNDERSTOOD BY MORE AND MORE PEOPLE IN TAIWAN, THAT IS OUR POLICIES VIS=A-VIS TAIWAN AFTER REUNIFICATION ARE BECOMING BETTER KNOWN. 29. HE NOTED THAT PRESIDENT CARTER AS WELL AS MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS HAD ASKED THE CHINESE GOVERNMENT POINTEDLY WHETHER CHINA WOULD GIVE UP THE RESPONSIBLITY OF USING FORCE TO BRING ABOUT REUNIFICATION. "CHINA HAS NOT DONE SO," HE SAID, "AND, WERE WE TO DO SO, CHIANG CHING-KUD AND THE TAIWAN AUTHORITIES WOULD HAVE NOTHING TO WORRY

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ABOUT, SO THEY WOULD BECOME EVEN MORE COCKY AND STICK UP THEIR TAIL 10,000 METERS INTO THE SKY," 30. THE VICE CHAIRMAN THEN SAID HE HAD TOLD THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS DURING HIS JANUARY 1979 VISIT TO WASHINGTON THAT THERE WERE TWO SETS OF CIRCUMSTANCES IN WHICH CINA WOULD HAVE NO ALTERNATIVE TO USE OF FORCE. FIRST, SHOULD TAIWAN'S LEADERS REFUSE TO TALK. IF THEY REFUSED TO TALK "THEN WE EITHER HAVE TO GIVE UP DUR EFFORT TO REUNIFY THE COUNTRY OR WE HAVE TO USE FORCE." SECOND, IF CHIANG CHING-KUD WERE TO TURN TO THE SOVIET UNION AND MAKE TAIWAN INTO A SOVIET BASE. "THEN WHAT? CHIANG CHING-KUU HAS A RUSSIAN WIFE. WE KNOW THAT THE TAIWAN AUTHORITIES HAVE CERTAIN CONTACTS WITH THE SOVIET UNION. BUT, IT IS NOT TOO EASY FOR CHIANG CHING-KUD TO TURN TO THE SOVIETS, GIVEN THE AMERICAN AND JAPANESE PRESENCE IN TAIWAN THROUGH INVESTMENTS AND OTHER LINKAGES. IT IS NOT EASY FOR HIM TO FREE HIMSELF FROM THE EFFECTS OF THAT PRESENCE. I ASKED MEMBERS OF THE CONGRESS WHETHER, IF THE SOVIET UNION WERE TO MOVE INTO TAIWAN, YOU WOULD STILL OPPOSE THE USE OF FORCE BY US AGAINST IT?"

MOST OF THE DISCUSSION WAS ON CHINESE DOMESTIC AND INTERNAL PARTY MATTERS. NOTING RECENT CHANGES IN CHINA'S LEADERSHIP, HU PREDICTED FURTHER CHANGES NEXT YEAR, WITH AN EMPHASIS ON BRINGING IN YOUNGER PEOPLE TO LEADERSHIP POSITIONS. HE REVEALED THAT AT THE SIXTH PLENUM THE WHOLE CENTRAL COMMITTEE HAD WANTED DENG TO BECOME PARTY CHAIRMAN BUT THAT HE HAD DECLINED BECAUSE OF HIS FEELING A MAN OVER 70 SHOULD NOT BE CHAIRMAN. HE DESCRIBED THE PARTY'S DIRECTION, DOMESTICALLY AND EXTERNALLY, AS CONSTANT SINCE THE THIRD PLENUM, PRAISING THE PARTY'S "FINE TRADITIONS" FROM WHICH IT HAD UNFORTUNATELY DEPARTED (PRESUMABLY DURING THE CULTURAL REVOLUTION). HE DESCRIBED RESTORATION OF COLLECTIVE LEADERSHIP, SEPARATION OF PARTY AND GOVERN-MENT, AND MAKING CHINA'S POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC SYSTEM CONFORM TO REALITY AS MAJOR GOALS. HU DESCRIBED HIS OWN WORK AS PRIMARILY CONCERNED WITH PARTY AND DOMESTIC AFFAIRS, SAYING DENG XIADPING, ZHAD ZIYANG, AND LI XIANNIAN ARE THE MAIN FOREIGN POLICY ACTORS. NOTING CHINA EXPECTED A BUMPER HARVEST THIS YEAR AND A

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BIG INCREASE IN LIGHT INDUSTRY PRODUCTION, HU STRESSED THAT CHINA'S MAIN TASK REMAINED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. NEVERTHELESS, HE REMINDED FORMER PRESIDENT CARTER THAT CHINA CANNOT FORGET THE IMPORTANCE OF RESTORING TAIWAN TO THE MOTHERLAND. END SUMMARY. 3. FORMER PRESIDENT CARTER MET WITH CHINESE COMMUNIST PARTY CHAIRMAN HU YADBANG AT 2030 DN AUGUST 27. 4. PRESIDENT CARTER CONGRATULATED HU ON HIS APPOINTMENT AS CHAIRMAN. THE CHAIRMAN SAID, " I DON'T KNOW VERY MUCH ABOUT YOUR DOMESTIC POLITICAL SITUATION IN THE UNITED STATES. BUT I HAVE THE IMPRESSION THAT THE AVERAGE AGE OF FUNCTIONARIES AND LEADERS IN THE UNITED STAES - WHETHER REPUBLICAN OR DEMOCRAT --IS QUITE A BIT LOWER THAN IT IS HERE. I CAN TELL YOU A SECRET ABOUT WHAT HAPPENED AT THE SIXTH PLENUM OF OUR ELEVENTH PARTY CONGRESS IN JUNE. ORIGINALLY ALL THE MEMBERS OF OUR CENTRAL COMMITTEE WANTED DENG XIADPING TO BECOME CHAIRMAN BECAUSE OF HIS DUTSTANDING ABILITY, RICH EXPERIENCE AND GREAT PRESTIGE IN THE PARTY AND AMONG THE PEOPLE. BUT DUR VETERAN LEADERS -- INCLUDING COMRADE DENG XIAOPING HIMSELF -- SAID THAT THERE SHOULD BE A RULE THAT NO ONE OVER SEVENTY COULD BE CHAIRMAN. SO I WAS ELECTED," HU SAID. 10. HE CONTINUED, " WE HAVE BEEN SAYING IN OUR PRESS THAT DUR PARTY NEEDS TO LOWER ITS AVERAGE AGE (NIANQINGHUA -- REJUVENATION) AND TO TURN TO PEOPLE WITH PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCE AND EXPERTISE (ZHISHIHUA). THERE IS, IN FACT, A RESERVOIR OF SUCH PEOPLE IN CHINA WHO CAN BE PROMOTED TO KEY POSTS UP AND DOWN THE PARTY. WE NOW HAVE ABOUT FIVE MILLION PARTY MEMBERS WITH A HIGHER EDUCATION. SO NEXT YEAR,

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AND INDEED IN THE FOLLOWING YEARS, THERE WILL BE QUITE A FEW PERSONNEL CHANGES -- BECAUSE WE WANT MORE KNOWLEDGEABLE PEOPLE IN POSITIONS OF AUTHORITY. OF COURSE, I CAN'T PINPOINT THE PRECISE CHANGES FOR YOU NOW. THAT MUST BE DECIDED THROUGH DEMOCRATIC DISCUSSION AND ELECTIONS WITHIN THE PARTY. 11. "BUT, IN ANOTHER SENSE, THERE WILL BE NO CHANGE. THAT'S BECAUSE THE DIRECTION OF OUR POLICY WILL REMAIN CONSTANT. LET ME PUT IT THIS WAY, OUR SITUATION DICTATES THAT WE RESTORE THE FINE TRADITIONS OF OUR PARTY, FROM WHICH WE HAVE LAPSED." 12. PRESIDENT CARTER SAID HE HAD NOTED ARTICLES IN THE CHINESE PRESS DEPLORING THE "PERSONALITY CULT." HE ASKED WHETHER THERE WAS NOW A DELIBERATE EFFORT TO DISPERSE AUTHORITY. 13. CHAIRMAN HU SAID, " JUST NOW WHEN I SAID THAT DUR POLICY WILL NOT CHANGE, I MEANT THEPOLICIES WE HAVE BEEN FOLLOWING SINCE THE THIRD PLENUM OF OUR ELEVENTH PARTY CONGRESS. WE HAVE TO RESTORE SOME OF THE GOOD POLITICIES AND PRACTICES THAT OUR PARTY FOLLOWED IN THE PAST. I SHOULD ADD THAT THERE WILL BE NO CHANGE IN OUR FUREIGN POLICY. WE HAVE BEEN AND WILL REMAIN CONSISTENT. 14. "WHEN I SAY THAT WE WANT TO RESTORE THE OLD POLICIES, I MEAN THAT: FIRST, WE NEED TO RESTORE THE TRADITIONS OF COLLECTIVE LEADERSHIP OF THE PARTY. TWENTY YEARS OR SO AGO WE HAD A STRICT SYSTEM OF COLLECTIVE PARTY LEADERSHIP. SINCE THEN THIS GOOD SYSTEM HAS BEEN ERODED. CHAIRMAN MAD MADE A FEW MISTAKES IN THIS REGARD, THOUGH, OF COURSE, HE ALSO MADE GREAT CONTRIBUTIONS TO CHINA. DUR PARTY LEADERSHIP HAS GONE THROUGH VARIOUS STAGES. IN THE FIRST PERIOD OF THE REVOLUTION, IT MAY HAVE BEEN ALL RIGHT FOR ONE LEADER TO OCCUPY A VERY PROMINENT POSITION. THI IS, OF COURSE, A PRODUCT OF HISTORICAL CONDITIONS. BUT SINCE OUR PARTY ASSUMED POWER THE SITUATION HAS CHANGED. NOW, IN VIEW OF THE ENDRMITY OF THE TASKS WE CONFRONT, IT WOULD BE VERY DIFFICULT FOR ONE LEADER TO MONOPOLIZE POWE." 15. PRESIDENT CARTER ASKED WHETHER THERE WAS AN EFFORT UNDERWAY TO SEPARATE THE PARTY FROM THE GOVERNMENT. 16. CHAIRMAN HU RESPONDED THAT THERE WAS. "OUR PARTY HAS DISCUSSED THIS AND CONCUDED THAT IN DUR COUNTRY, NO ONE PERSON SHOULD HOLD TOO MANY POSTS

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CONCURRENTLY. SO I WILL NEVER TAKE ANY GOVERNMENT POST MYSELF. WE HAVE ABOUT TWENTY MILLION CADRES TO WHOM THE WORKLOAD CAN AND SHOULD BE DISPERSED. WE WILL GET MUCH BETTER RESULTS IF WE APPROACH PROBLEMS ONLY AFTER BROAD DISCUSSION." 17. PRESIDENT CARTER ASKED WHETHER IT WOULD BE FAIR TO SAY THEN THAT CHAIRMAN HU'S PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES WERE REFORM OF PARTY PERSONNEL AND DOMESTIC POLICIES, CHAIRMAN HU LAUGHED AND SAID "YOU COULD PUT IT THAT WAY -- THAT WHAT I AM MOSTLY ENGAGED IN ARE PARTY AND DUMESTIC AFFAIRS." 18. PRESIDENT CARTER ASKED WHAT PREMIER ZHAD ZIYANG'S RESPONSIBILITIES WERE. HU ANSWERED "HE IS MAINLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CHINESE ECONOMY. HE HAS RICH EXPERIENCE IN ECONOMIC WORK." 19. PRESIDENT CARTER ASKED WHETHER FOREIGN POLICY WAS THEN SET BY VICE CHAIRMAN DENG IN CONSULTATION WITH OTHER LEADERS. CHAIRMAN HU SAID THAT WAS RIGHT. "HE HAS LONG EXPERIENCE IN FOREIGN POLICY. AMONG OUR OLDER LEADERS FROM THE LONG MARCH WHO ARE STILL WITH US, HE IS THE ONE WHO DOES THE MOST WORK. MARSHALL YE (YE JIANYING) IS NOW 84, HE'S JUST NOT STRONG ENOUGH TO DO MUCH ANYMOREA." 20. PRESIDENT CARTER ASKED WHETHER CHAIRMAN HU PLANNED TO TRAVEL ABROAD, ADDING THAT HE WAS SURE HE WOULD BE MOST WELCOME IN THE UNITED STATES.

NODIS 21. THE CHAIRMAN RESPONDED, "I HONESTLY HAVEN'T THOUGHT ABOUT IT. I THINK PERHAPS PREMIER ZHAO, WHO WILL BE VISITING YOUR COUNTRY NEXT YEAR, MAY BE A BETTER CHOICE THAN I. HE CAN REPRESENT BOTH THE PARTY AND THE GOVERNMENT. AND, OF COURSE, OUR VERY ABLE VICE PREMIER HUANG HUA, WITH WHOM I WORKED FOR TEN YEARS IN SHANXI PROVINCE BEFORE THE FOUNDING OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA -- AND FOR A HALF YEAR LATER ALSO IN SHANXI -- GOES TO THE UNITED STATES FREQUENTLY." 22. PRESIDENT CARTER NOTED THAT CHAIRMAN HU HAD RECENTLY MET WITH THE LEADER OF MALI AND HAD ISSUED A STATEMENT ON THE PALESTINIAN QUESTION. SO HE SEEMED TO HAVE A PERSONAL INTEREST IN INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS. 23. THE CHAIRM SAID, "WELL, I MET WITH THAT GUY FROM MALI BECAUSE HE IS THE GENERAL SECRETARY OF THE PEOPLE'S LEAGUE AND THEY WANTED TO ESTABLISH SOME PARTY-TO-PARTY CONTACT WITH US. 24. "LET ME SAY SOMETHING ELSE. THE MAJORITY OF OUR CADRES NEED TO CONCENTRATE NOW ON BOOSTING THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF OUR COUNTRY, WHAT WE MEAN BY 'SUCIALIST CONSTRUCTION' IS THE GAINING OF A BETTER, MORE PROSPEROUS LIFE FOR OUR PEOPLE. CHINA AND THE US ARE ALMOST THE SAME SIZE IN TERRITORY, ABOUT 9.6 MILLION SQURE KILDMETERS. BUT CHINA HAS A MUCH BIGGER POPULATION, AND WE ARE VERY POOR. SO DUR PRIMARY NEED IS TO DO A GOOD JOB IN ADVANCING OUR ECONOMY AND IN RAISING CULTURAL

THE FORMER PRESIDENT ASKED WHAT PROGRESS WAS BEING MADE IN THIS REGARD. THE CHAIRMAN REPLIED THAT RELATIVELY GOOD PROGRESS HAD BEEN MADE OVER THE TWO AND ONE HALF YEARS SINCE 1979. PRESIDENT CARTER OUIPPED, "OH! YOU MEAN SINCE NORMALIZATION?" HU BOUCED UP IN HIS CHAIR AND LAUGHED UPROARIOUSLY. HE SAID, "WELL, I GUESS YOU COULD SAY THAT THAT WAS AN EXTERNAL FACTOR THAT PLAYED A A CERTAIN ROLE. 25. "THE PROGRESS WE HAVE MADE HAS BEEN MAINLY IN THREE AREAS. FIRST, IN AGRICULTURE. AND THIRD, IN CORRECTING OUR THINKING AND OUR GUIDING PRINCIPLES. IN THE PAST, OUR APPROACH DIDN'T TALLY WITH THE ACTUAL ECONOMIC CONDITIONS IN CHINA. IF WE FOLLOW OUR PRESENT COURSE, I AM CONFIDENT WE WILL SHOW STEADY IMPROVEMENT." 26. THE FORMER PRESIDENT REMARKED THAT AMERICANS WERE VERY INTERESTED IN SEEING CHINA CONTINUE TO MAKE ECONOMIC PROGRESS. "WE THINK THAT THE GREATEST POSSIBLE AMOUNT OF EXCHANGE BETWEEN US SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED, IN SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, CULTUE, TRADE, AMONG STUDENTS AND SCHOLARS, AND TOURISTS. THIS COULD BE VERY HELPFUL TO YOU AS WELL AS TO US." 27. THE CHAIRMAN REPLIED THAT "THE KIND OF EXCHANGE WE ARE MOST INTERESTED IN IS THAT JUST CARRIED OUT BY YOUR MR. HAMMER (ARMAND HAMMER, OCCIDENTAL PETROLEUM). HE HAS AGREED TO HELP US OPEN A BIG COAL MINE IN SHANXI AT PINGSUO. THIS IS EXACTLY THE BEST WAY TO HELP US." 28. THE FORMER PRESIDENT SAID HE WAS CONVINCED THAT MANY AMERICAN BUSINESSMEN WERE EAGER TO BE OF ASSISTANCE AND TO PURSUE OPPORTUNITIES LIKE THIS. 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WE CANNOT AND WILL NOT FORGET." 30. PRESIDENT CARTER ASKED WHO HAD THE PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY IN CHINA FOR THIS TASK, DRAWING LAUGHTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN WHEN HE ADDED "I SUPPOSE YOU CONSIDER THIS A DOMESTIC PROBLEM?" CHAIRMAN HU REPLIED THAT "EVERYONE IN THE POLITBURG IS CONCERNED WITH THIS. INDEED EVERYONE OF THE ONE BILLION CHINSE PEOPLE IS CONCERNED TO ACCOMPLISH IT. HU REPLIED, " IN THE POLITBURG, THE STANDING COMMITTEE --ALL SEVEN MEMBERS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE." THE FORMER PRESIDENT SAID, "YOU MEAN ALL SEVEN -- EACH IS RESPONSIBLE FOR SENDING A CLEAR SIGNAL OF YOUR INTENTIONS TO TAIWAN?" THE CHAIRMAN RESPONDED, "ALL MAJOR POLITICAL DECISIONS ARE DISCUSSED BY THE STANDING COMMITEE." 32. OUR FRIENDSHIP DUGHT TO BE CONSTANTLY NURTURED AND TO DEEPEN IN THE YEARS TO COME. WE, FOR OUR PART, ARE FIRMLY SET ON A POLICY OF FRIENDLY RELATIONS AND COOPERATION WITH THE AMERICAN PEOPLE AND WITH OTHER PEOPLES THROUGHOUT THE WORLD." 40. COMMENT: THIS WAS THE EMBASSY'S FIRST ENCOUNTER WITH HU YADBANG, SO THERE MAY BE SOME INTEREST IN MY PERSONAL IMPRESSIONS OF A MAN AT THE PINNACLE OF POWER HERE BUT RELATIVELY UNKNOWN TO US DIRECTLY. - (S) The attached table summarizes the Defense positions on the US items of interest to the Chinese as they were presented to us in their latest list. The presentation used in the table is intended for US reviewers. In our presentation to the Chinese, we plan to omit the categorization and national security rationale in favor of a straightforward statement of our position on each item. Where appropriate, we will compare our positions with those of the previous Administration.
- (S) I believe that these positions represent the appropriate balance of responsiveness and restraint in implementation of the President's policies on export controls and military sales for China. Statistically, of the 51 listed items (including 24 munitions items), the Defense positions include 25 approvable items (8 munitions), most with some restrictions. They include 15 items (8 munitions) which would be denied but for which we can offer approvable alternatives. Finally, 11 items (8 munitions) would be denied completely. More significant, however, is the fact that on 19 items (12 munitions) our position is more forthcoming than that previously taken with the Chinese: 7 new approvals; 5 less restricted approvals; and 7 denials, but with new and higher technology alternatives.
- (S) We should present the Chinese with a Government position on these items when we meet with Liu Huaqing. Accordingly, I would appreciate your identification of any areas of disagreement with these positions by 2 September. For any technical questions, you may refer your staff to the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Research and Engineering, Office of Military Technology Sharing (697-9203) for munitions items or Office of Technology Trade (694-4777) for dual-use items.
