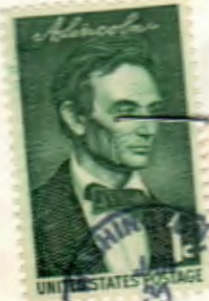

Ultimatum To Iran Is Overdue

President-elect Ronald Reagan had it exactly right several days ago when he spoke of the Iranian leaders as "barbarians." The word connotes the rudeness, arrogance and savagery of those who live beyond the pale of civilization. It is maddening to treat with these people according to the forms of diplomatic speech.

President Carter has gone as far as any responsible administration possibly could go in attempting to negotiate the release of our hostages. He may indeed have gone too far — so far as to leave an impression of guilt or weakness.

MY OWN THOUGHT is that the time has come to frame an ultimatum to Tehran: Release the hostages under the terms offered by Carter, or face the consequences.

What consequences? War.

Let us not flinch from the thought. Out of respect for the sensibilities of the families of the hostages, some of us have suppressed opinions and emotions that should have been voiced all along. There is a national interest that surpasses the immediate interests of the families. That national interest has not been well served by the excessive patience of the Carter administration or by the maudlin coverage of the press. The United States should have reacted a year ago in the only way that barbarians may understand — not with peace, but with the sword.

Clearly, barbarians do understand. "We have said repeatedly that we are at war with the United States," the Iranians' speaker, Raf-

sanjani, said less than two weeks ago. But this "war" has been a very one-sided war, in which all the offensive has been taken by the Iranians. As Reagan remarked, "They are the ones who have done the kidnapping." They are the ones who have violated every rule of international comity. They are the ones who have made demands that cannot possibly be met. They are the barbarians.

Nearly 200 years have passed since the infant United States, still governed by the Articles of Confederation, faced similar humiliations at the hands of the Barbary States.

IN 1785, **SERVING** as minister to France, Thomas Jefferson confessed his perplexity in a letter to Nathaniel Greene: "The Algerines, I fear, will ask such a tribute for the forbearance of their piracies as the United States would be unwilling to pay. When this idea comes across my mind my faculties are absolutely suspended between indignation and impotence.

But some months later, in 1786, Jefferson's resolve had firmed. "The motives pleading for war rather than tribute are numerous and honorable; those opposing them are mean and short-sighted." War with the Barbary States would be costly, Jefferson warned, both in men and in money, but "to obtain peace by purchasing it" would be more costly still.

Jefferson's advice did not prevail at the time. For 15 years we paid tribute. The acts of piracy continued. But as president in 1801, Jefferson plunged into war. Five years later Tripoli sued for peace, and the piracy stopped.

TO BE SURE, we live in a different world today. The analogy can be pursued too far. But human nature has not greatly changed in 200 years, nor have the uses of power greatly changed. Great nations, if they would retain greatness, must still abide by the counsel of Charles Cotesworth Pinckney: "Millions for defense, but not a damned penny for tribute."

Those who pronounce ultimatums must be prepared to carry them out. If Carter's reasonable proposition continues to meet merely scorn and arrogance, let us be explicit: The hostages alive, or holy cities dead. And if the hostages should be executed by their captors, let us be prepared to wreak such terrible retaliation that their deaths will not have been in vain.

The Iranians have toyed too long with the United States. This outrageous situation has to be resolved and it has to be resolved now.

Iran: All hostages may be executed

Iran for the first time Wednesday broadcast a warning of the possible execution of the 52 U.S. hostages — spending their second lonely New Year's Eve in captivity — should U.S. "procrastination" lead to their trial.

"The enemy should know that it has no other option but to give a positive response to Iranian demands and that procrastination might force Iran to adopt an uncompromising position, and consequently, the hostages might be tried," Tehran radio said in the Persian language broadcast.

A transcript of the broadcast which followed the latest U.S. reply to Iran's demands for release of the hostages was delivered to the State Department in Washington.

"According to Islamic laws, the trial of the hostages might, of course, not only lead to their execution, being guilty of spying, but, even more importantly, it will lay bare the unwarranted interference of imperialism in other countries," Tehran radio said in an un-attributed commentary.

State Department spokesman Jack Cannon repeated the formula which is generally used when such threats are raised by the Iranians: "We continue to hold the Iranian authorities responsible for the safety and well-being of all the hostages."

The Iranian broadcast came as negotiations to free the hostages before President Carter leaves office Jan. 20 appeared to slow with officials in Algiers saying they would have to study

the new U.S. proposals before deciding how to relay them to Iran.

U.S. officials said the Iranian broadcast was believed to be the first in which the Iranians have spoken of the execution of the Americans, although there have been frequent references to the possibilities of trials.

The broadcast, which denied that Iran was coming under any economic or military pressure because of the hostage crisis, said such reports are meant by the United States to put Iran "in a more conciliatory mood."

It scoffed at the idea that the Iranian government will get greater concessions from the Carter administration than from President-elect Ronald Reagan. It described such analysis as wrong and noted that Iranian crowds have called for the trial of the hostages if Iran's demands are not met.

The commentary concluded: "In brief, Iran is not ready for any softening of her position and will not deviate from its former positions."

One official in Algiers said it was still unclear how the new U.S. proposal for release of the hostages would be handled.

His remark appeared to reflect a new sense of caution resulting from Iran's request Tuesday that Algeria effectively upgrade its role in the negotiations from that of simple go-between to mediator.

Speaking to reporters in Tehran, Iran's chief hostage negotiator Behzad Nabavi said that, while Iran was still insisting on "financial guarantees" be-

fore freeing the hostages, it would accept any U.S. counter-proposal that Algeria recommended.

That put more of a burden on the Algerians, who indicated they wanted to study closely the American proposals, described as the Carter Administration's final offer to Iran.

In Washington, the State Department said it still expected the Iranians to receive the U.S. proposals in time for them to make a decision before the change of administrations.

U.S. officials already have cautioned that the proposals are not new ones but a "reformulation" of earlier American proposals already accepted by the Iranians in principle.

The remaining hitch, in the form of a demand not raised by Iran until late this month, concerned its insistence on receiving some \$24 billion in advance "financial guarantees" to cover its claims to the late shah's wealth and its frozen government assets in the United States.

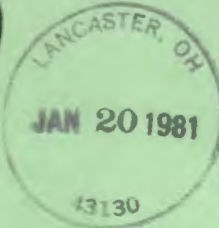
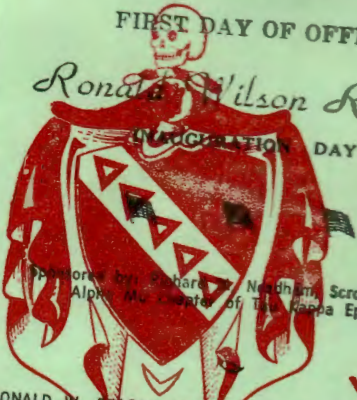
Cannon, the State Department spokesman, refused to detail the differences between the latest and the previous American proposals. However, he said a report that the United States had offered to set up a \$5 billion "escrow fund" with Algeria was "hypothetical and speculative."

Officials said the escrow fund, which had been raised as one of several options in the earlier American package, would only be required under special circumstances, such as an Iranian rejection of all the other proposals.

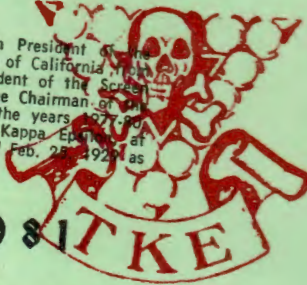
