## "MAN OF THE YEAR" AT ANNUAL LUNCHEON

President-elect Ronald Reagan, who will be installed as the 40th President of the United States on January 20, today was named the 1980 KNX NEWSRADIO Man of the Year by George Nicholaw, Vice President, CBS Radio Division, and General Manager of KNX, at a reception-luncheon at the Century Plaza Hotel.

This 10th annual event also honored the 1980 KNX NEWSRADIO Woman of the Year, Dorothea Morefield, and all of the 1980 "Citizens of the Week" winners.

Mr. Nicholaw presented Mr. Reagan with an engraved

Tiffany time piece and a leather-bound proclamation which read:

"KNX NEWSRADIO proudly salutes Ronald Reagan as Man of the Year for 1980. As a Southern Californian long concerned with public issues, he served the state through two terms as governor. For the last half decade he has worked on behalf of principles he believed to be in the best interest of this nation. His travels, writing and speaking — combined with two nationwide campaigns — have won him the opportunity to put his principles to the test at a crucial moment in American history. His election as President of the United States is a tribute to conviction and persistence meriting our highest honor."

Mr. Reagan was born in Tampico, Illinois in 1911 and graduated from Eureka College in Eureka, Illinois in 1932 with

a degree in economics and sociology. He was student body president, captain of the swimming team and a three-year letterman in football.

He has received the following honorary degrees:

Doctor of Humane Letters, Eureka College, 1957; Doctor of
Laws, Pepperdine University, 1970; and Doctor of Laws,

Azusa Pacific College, 1973.

Mr. Reagan was a second lieutenant in the U.S. Cavalry Reserve before World War II, and served four years in the Army Air Corps from 1942-1946 when he was discharged with the rank of Captain.

He began his show business career as a sports announcer and editor for the Central Broadcasting Company and became a film actor in 1937, appearing in 50 feature-length movies.

He was a star and production supervisor of TV's GENERAL ELECTRIC THEATER for eight years, and hosted and acted in the DEATH VALLEY DAYS TV series.

On November 8, 1966, Ronald Reagan was elected California's 33rd governor, and was reelected four years later.

He announced his candidacy for the 1976 Republication nomination for President in early 1975 and was narrowly defeated. Despite the setback, he mounted another campaign which ultimately resulted in his 1980 election.

The President-elect was president of the Screen Actors
Guild for six terms and on their Board of Directors for 14
years. He was president of the Motion Picture Industry Council

for two terms, and on the Board of Directors for 10 years.

He served on the Board of Trustees of Eureka College, was chairman of the Republican Governors' Association in 1969, a member of the Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations in 1970 and the Presidential Commission investigating the CIA, 1974-1975.

He and his wife, the former Nancy Davis, were married in 1952, and have two children, Patrician Ann and Ronald Prescott.

Mr. Reagan has two other children, Maureen and Michael, from a former marriage.

The Reagans live in Pacific Palisades and own and operate a horse breeding and cattle ranch in Santa Barbara.
