





Dear Mr. Valdez:

I have been asked to reply to your letter of February 12 to the Vice President expressing your opposition to the government of Philippine President Ferdinand E. Marcos.

We appreciate having your views. We maintain relations with the Philippine government in order to promote U.S. interests. Those interests are principally military and economic. Our military facilities at Clark and Subic are essential to our military presence in the western Pacific and they provide a reassurance to friends and allies in the region including the Philippines. We also maintain extensive and mutually beneficial trade and economic ties with the Philippines. It is our belief that by working constructively and cooperatively with the Philippines to achieve common goals we can best serve the interests of the United States.

HE release of 52 Americans by their Iranian captors may have caused millions of Americans to forget the larger damage to US strategic interests that was involved in the revolution of religious leaders and the fall of the shah. But someone ought to be looking even beyond questions such as "Who lost Iran?" and "Why didn't our intelligence people see this coming?" We must face this question: "Can this kind of political calamity befall the United States again soon, and if so where?"

Answer is: "Yes, soon, in the Philippines."

This ought not shock Americans - not if they take a look at the ways in which the situation in the Philippines parallels that of Iran:

links in the US chain of defense against aggressive communism - with American military bases in the Philippines probably more important to the United States than the intelligence facilities and other military operations that we had in Iran. As in Iran at the time of the shah, most US leaders feel they must pretend not to see political oppression and human rights violations in the Philippines because "we need those bases."

The shah ruled ruthlessly, thus building up a vast network of people who hated him. President Ferdinand Marcos has ruled the Philippines through martial law, jailing or exiling his foes, with more than a few dying mysteriously - and he has created hordes

or enemies.

Marcos and wife Imelda, like the shah and his family, have avoided final censure by the United States and other Western democracies by hobnobbing and get-setting with the power elite who frequently are entertained lavishly on monies Marcos' foes claim was stolen from the people.

Marcos, perhaps even more than the shah, has pursued policies that have enriched only a small upper-crust band of his sympathizers. The shah could make legitimate claim to putting land in the hands of peasants, partially liberating women, lifting the level of literacy and building Iran up as a petroleum and military power. Marcos has left the masses incredibly

poor and helpless.

We face the classic dilemma about how to deal with

a tyrant who is "a friend." Note that Jimmy Carter, our most outspoken "human rights" president, did not denounce Marcos and draw a curtain between him and the United States. I don't expect Ronald Reagan to declare the Philippine dictator a pariah.

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What, then, does the United States do to avoid hastening a Philippines eruption that could leave us with no bases and new and hostile groups running that country? We should take special pains not to cozy up to Marcos or his wife in a way that guarantees that the Filipinos' hatred of them rubs off on the leaders of this country. That means, most obviously, that President Reagan ought not rush off to Manila or invite Marcos here on an official or state visit.

Deep trouble has been brewing in the Philippines for a long time. This is one column that I don't want to refer to two years, or 10, from now and say, "I told, you so!" Field Enterprises, Inc.

This memo asks for your decision on the means to be used to deal with a Filipino emissary of President Marcos.

Mr. Alfred Bloomingdale, a close friend of the President, has telephoned Mike Deaver to request the President meet with Roberto Benedicto. Mr. Bloomindale says that Benedicto has a message from President Marcos to deliver to the President.

According to State, Benedicto is a self-made Filipino millionaire, a classmate of President Marcos, and Chairman of the Philippine Sugar Commission. He is considered the sugar czar of the Philippines. He is President Marcos' man and is a political power broker in the Philippines.

This represents an effort by President Marcos to circumvent the Embassy and the State Department, and establish a direct link into the White House. As you know, the President dined with Mr. Marcos late last year and Mrs. Marcos and her husband undoubtedly want to use this means to make that contact. It is their style of business to do so.

We have basically three options:

- (1) Turn Mr. Benedicto over to the State Department at the Deputy Assistant Secretary level (Negroponte) and let them handle it.
- (2) We handle the initial meeting with Benedicto through the NSC staff and then decide what we want to do with
- (3) Let Mr. Deaver arrange a meeting with the President.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

That you designate options 1, 2 or 3, or any other on this matter and inform how you want me to act. Mr. Bloomingdale appears anxious for an answer and can be reached at 213/553-6350.

The State Department has strongly urged you to see Mrs.
Marcos while she is in the U.S. around the 25th of
August (Tab A). I support State's recommendation and
urge you to see her at your home in Maine or possibly in
New York. (C)

You made a strong impression during your visit to the Philippines for the inauguration of President Marcos. A special significance has been attached to you and the Filipinos, who tend to be sentimentalists even at the highest level of political contact, have fixed on this meeting as an important element in future U.S.-Philippines relations. (C)

Mrs. Marcos, we understand, was bruised somewhat when she was not named Prime Minister. The timing is good to give her a boost and a visit with you would do just that. State has spelled out the other important political and military reasons why we need to continue to nurture this special relationship. As long as the Marcos are in power, Ambassador Murphy has said, we need to deal with them in a very special way based on the historic relationship we have enjoyed with the Philippines. (C)

State has recommended (Tab A) that the Vice President see Mrs. Imelda Marcos while she is in the States around August 25. I support this recommendation and request that you forward the attached memorandum (Tab I) to the Vice President on an urgent basis.

I understand that the Vice President has already said that he would be unwilling to come to Washington to meet Mrs. Marcos. However, he did not receive a report on the full impact of her visit. It is therefore important that he become aware of the political implications of not seeing her. I know from my own experience in the Philippines how genuinely sensitive they are to U.S. actions. The Vice President has developed a special place in the Marcos' perceptions of the U.S. Ambassador Dick Murphy, who has just returned from the Philippines, said that the way things stand now, the U.S. has to get along with the Marcos and we have to go that extra step to lock them into our side.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

That you forward the attached memorandum (Tab I) to the Vice President, recommending he see Mrs. Marcos.

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

Subject: Request for Meeting With Mrs. Marcos

Mrs. Marcos has asked for an appointment with the Vice President and the Secretary of State during her current visit to the United States. Although she is probably coming to Washington on August 25 to sign two IBRD loans, we understand she would arrange her schedule so that she could meet with the Vice President on any day prior to her departure for the Philippines in early September.

We recommend that the Vice President see Mrs. Marcos. is important to U.S. national interests, in particular to the upcoming review of the Military Bases Agreement, that we maintain friendly relations with the Philippines, and a meeting with Mrs. Marcos would accomplish that goal. It would also provide an opportunity for the Vice President to reciprocate Philippine hospitality during his attendance at President Marcos' inauguration. Mrs. Marcos has generally been received by the Vice President during the last few years and we understand she attaches considerable importance to her first meeting with Vice President Bush in the United States since he entered into office.

The importance to good relations with Mrs. Marcos to U.S. interests is outlined in the attached valedictory message on U.S.-Philippine relations drafted by Ambassador Murphy.

During a meeting with Mrs. Marcos, the Vice President may wish to:

-- refer to his recent visit to the Philippines;

-- refer to the appointment of President Marcos' cabinet including Prime Minister Virata and note that the U.S. looks forward to working with the new cabinet including Mrs. Marcos:

#### CONFIDENTIAL 2 -

- -- commend the normalization trend begun with the lifting of martial law;
- -- compliment the Philippines on the strong role it played in the Kampuchea conference in New York.

So far as the Philippine Embassy is informed, Mrs. Marcos has no particular topics to raise with the Vice President. We expect her principal interest is in establishing a relationship with him.
