

Attached billing is for the airlift movement requested by Department of State of Ferdinand Marcos and party from Manila to Hawaii. Airlift from Malacanang Palace Park to Clark Air Base was by a task force consisting of H-3 helicopters and a C-130. Airlift from Clark to Guam was by C-9A aeromedical evacuation aircraft and MAC C-141 SAAMs (1352 and 1353). Airlift from Andersen Air Force Base, Guam, to Hickam Air Force Base, Hawaii, was by the continuation of MAC C-141 SAAMs (1352 and 1353). This bill includes a charge for the airlift return of selected non-crew member passengers from Hickam to Clark.

We have calculated these charges using the tariff rates for non-DOD U.S. Government Agencies. We have also annotated the bill to show the amount chargeable if these airlift costs are to be recovered from non-U.S. Government sources.

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

The State Department has requested, and the NSC has endorsed, that President Aquino receive Special Air Mission support for her official working visit to the United States. Under normal protocol recommendations, she would not be eligible for such support since her visit is not an official one, but rather an official working visit.

A case can be made, however, that her visit is of such importance to our national security interests that the protocol rule be waived. Accordingly, I recommend that we authorize Special Air Mission support for President Aquino during the duration of her stay in the United States in September. I note, however, for the record, that this recommendation should not be taken as precedent for future air missions in support of official working group visits.

For these reasons we believe that every effort should be made to ensure the success of the Aquino visit. In this connection, the Department of State has requested a special missions aircraft be made available on a non-reimbursable basis to provide transportation for President Aquino during her visit in this country -- current dates of her trip in the United States are September 15-23. The provision of such an aircraft would underscore the high importance we attach to the Aquino visit, would greatly facilitate security arrangements and is consistent with other exceptions in the past for high priority visits.

I recommend that you approve this request.



SUBJECT: PRESIDENT AQUINO'S VISIT TO THE U.S.

President Aquino's official working visit to the U.S. September 17-19 is an important step in our efforts to forge a close relationship with the new government in the Philippines. Her visit provides a unique opportunity to underscore U.S. support for her government and our desire that it succeed. presence here will also serve to highlight the special nature of our ties with the Philippines, an old friend and key Pacific ally. Finally, her appearance in the U.S. will be a vivid reminder of the Administration's impressive foreign policy success in helping to promote peaceful, democratic change in the Philippines.

For these reasons we believe that every effort should be made to ensure the success of the Aquino visit, including some extra measures beyond the standard procedures and courtesies associated with a regular official working visit. In this regard, we request that a special mission presidential aircraft be made available on a non-reimbursable basis to provide transportation for President Aquino throughout her visit in this country. The current dates of her trip in the U.S. are September 15-23. The provision of such an aircraft would underscore the high importance we attach to the Aquino visit, and would also greatly facilitate security arrangements.

In addition, we ask approval of an informal breakfast at the White House for President Aquino with President Reagan on the morning of September 18. This event would enable Aquino and the President to get to know each other better in a relaxed setting following their more formal discussions at the morning meeting and working lunch scheduled for September 17.

As you know the First Lady does not play a formal role in such visits except when she hosts a the social function. Because President Aquino is not accompanied by a spouse, there is no social component to her visit. We do not feel a private meeting between the First Lady and Mrs. Aquino is necessary, but if the First Lady could briefly greet Mrs. Aquino it would send a clear posture signal.



As you know, President Aquino will be the guest of the President at an Official Working Visit on September 17. Usually the only role the First Lady plays in an Official Working Visit is to host a coffee for the spouse of the guest. As there is no spouse we had envisioned no role for the First Lady in the Aquino visit. However in a hand-written letter to the President (Tab A), President Aquino specifically requested a private meeting with the First Lady.

We do not believe the First Lady would think it appropriate to play an official government role by holding a private meeting with a foreign Head of State, but we would like to be able to demonstrate that the President is giving Mrs. Aquino a warm welcome in the White House. Therefore we would like to suggest that the First Lady greet Mrs. Aquino just prior to the working luncheon in the Family Dining Room. At this point the Filipino and American delegations would be enjoying cocktails before they sit down to their luncheon. It would be an informal setting and would allow the First Lady to chat with Mrs. Aquino on a social basis. We envision a three to five minute chat.
