This Administration's policy is to urge both parties to seek a peaceful solution based on UN Security Council Resolution 502 and the UN Charter. We remain ready to assist both parties to find an early settlement which is fair and consistent with the rule of law.

Dear Mr. Meese:

I have devoted many years to international negotiations (including the most difficult of these—the communists and orientals), so please forgive me if I have the effrontery to offer a plan for possible settlement of the Falkland Islands crisis, knowing full well that I am at an enormous disadvantage by reason of my ignorance of the intimate essential facts probably needed for a solution.

Also, I address this letter to you as, under a previous administration, when I proposed a rapprochment with Communist China, as a counterweight to the Soviets (long before this became our official policy), I received a brusque, cavalier-like response from the State Department bureaucracy.

Here are my thoughts:

- A. Britain recognizes the ultimate sovereignty of Argentina over the Falklands.
- B. Absolute sovereignty is to be delayed for a transition term of up to 50 years (or less, subject to negotiations).
- C. During the transition term a mandated commission is to take over general administration of the Islands. Commission membership: Argentina, Britain and the United States (or such other composition as may be agreed upon), but local self-government is to be retained as at present, subject to overall commission policy.

- Immigration policy is to be determined by the D. commission, except to the extent it may be circumscribed by the present treaty.
- E. Those present residents of the Islands who wish, of their own free will, to leave the Islands, may do so under a compensation arrangement with the Government of Argentina, the amount of compensation to be determined by a Claims Commission. The following formula is proposed as a guideline for the Claims Commission: Current year's earnings multiplied by 10 (years) or fair value of property (if any) plus 50%, whichever is the greater. Those figures can, of course, be negotiated by the treaty parties. it appears to the treaty parties that the potential number of departing families and their compensation would prove too great a financial burden for the Argentine government, some form of installment payout plan can be created.
- Troops are to evacuate the Islands forthwith. F.

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
