The President and Mrs. Reagan have asked me to convey their delight and pleasure that you are able to perform for His Excellency the President of the French Republic and Mrs. Mitterrand on Thursday, September 29.

The following points will hopefully clarify some of the details, and I will be happy to go into further detail with you at your convenience.

1. Air Transportation

The White House will reimburse you for your first-class domestic transportation to and from Washington, D.C., and for coach to and from Washington for your accompanying party.

2. Ground Transportation

As we get closer to the date, we would appreciate discussing your program. Also, I will need your biographic information for press and speech purposes. If this could be sent to me as soon as possible, I would very much appreciate it.
