SUBJECT: Request for White House Call by FRG Youth Exchange Group

HELMUT
FRG Chancellor Schmidt has requested that the President receive, for a few minutes, a group of fifteen young Germans--apprentices and workers--who are living this fall with American host families in Henrico County, Virginia. They will be in Washington from October 15-25 and November 11-15. The Chancellor places great importance on this call; if the President is not available, he hopes that the Vice President will see the group.

Ambassador Burns and the Department support the Chancellor's request. The sponsoring body is the Koerber Foundation of Hamburg, which earlier this year brought to Germany a group of young American workers. The highlight of their visit was a two-hour session with Schmidt. German press coverage was favorable.

In view of the value placed by the Administration on international youth exchanges and the effort to broaden such programs beyond traditional student exchanges, we think it highly desirable that the President see the group. In addition, the favorable publicity that would undoubtedly result from a White House visit would help heighten the level of awareness among Americans of the need to intensify youth exchanges between our two countries. The youth exchange campaign is one aspect of the U.S.-German contacts initiative, to which both the Chancellor and President Reagan have lent their explicit support.

The Koerber Foundation is also well known to USIA Director Wick. He is aware of the Chancellor's request and endorses it fully.

Summary

I am pleased to join forces with Chancellor Schmidt, Secretary Shultz, and Ambassador Burns in recommending that the President receive a group of 15 young German workers at the White House.

Chancellor Helmut Schmidt has requested that the President receive a group of fifteen young Germans who are here as participants in a cultural relations fellowship program.

The White House visit would reciprocate a meeting the Chancellor had with a group of 15 young American workers who spent two hours chatting with the Chancellor in his Bonn office earlier this year. The Chancellor does not recommend that the President spend the same amount of time with the visitors, but rather "a few minutes while they are in Washington."

Proposed times are between October 15 and 25 or between November 11 and November 15.

The Chancellor attaches great importance to this matter, and he hopes that the Vice President will meet with this group if the President cannot do so.

In view of the high importance given by the President to the International Youth Exchange Initiative, I have no hesitation in recommending that this request be given favorable consideration.

The Koerber Foundation, which is sponsoring the visit, was founded by Dr. Kurt A. Koerber, of Hamburg. A German industrialist-philanthropist, he has done much to promote international exchange activities involving young workers.

The Foundation sponsored the visit of the American workers to Germany and of the German workers here. Both groups pursued vocational training while living as guests of the host nation families and studying the language of the other.

FYI - - Philip Morris, Inc. and Reynolds Tobacco have made contributions to this exchange program as well as Koerber.

SUBJECT: Amb. Saltzman's Call

At your request I took Amb. Saltzman's call on the subject of his recent, private conversations with Helmut Schmidt. Saltzman - a Democrat, former U.S. ambassador, and Chairman of the Committee on American Foreign Policy - made the following points (not always distinguishing precisely between his views and Schmidt's):

- Kohl may underestimate the vigor and resistance of the movement opposed to INF deployment;
- Critical we go all out on campaign to convince Europe that we are negotiating seriously in Geneva;
- Important that early deployment of INF related equipment not be carried out in a way that provides new leverage for anti-nuclear groups.

As you can see, the message is not breathtaking in its novelty. I think the early deployment of associated equipment is an issue that can probably be finessed in the end. More worrisome to me is the possibility that continuing technical problems with our systems will give our opponents a new issue: i.e., missile reliability.

On a personal note, I must confess to you that I spent a sleepless night in anticipation of my first Oval Office meeting and my first participation in a working visit by another Head of State. It is a memory I will carry with me for a long time to come, and I am grateful to have had such an opportunity.

We had good staffing!
