PURPOSE: To highlight the closeness and importance of US-German relations and to mark the opening of the German exhibit for the German-American Tricentennial.

BACKGROUND: FRG President Karl Carstens will be coming to the US for a ten-date State Visit beginning on October 3. Carstens will be traveling extensively throughout the US. Carsten's visit, and particularly his trip to Philadelphia to open the German exhibition, and intended to give positive and tangible expression to the German-American Tricentennial.

PREVIOUS PARTICIPATION: President met with Carstens in Bonn during the June 1982 Summit and extended the invitation to visit.

DATE AND TIME: Wednesday, October 5, photo opportunity to be followed by a working luncheon.

SUBJECT: Visit of President Carstens of FRG

President Carstens will be in Washington on October 5 and 6 during his State Visit this year. I believe it would be most inappropriate for the President not to receive him in some manner during the Washington portion of his visit. The attached Schedule Proposal to Bill Sadleir, therefore, suggests that the President invite President Carstens for a working luncheon -- which would require at most 1½ hours of the President's time. Although it would be referred to as a working luncheon, it would be non-substantive to a great extent and relatively non-demanding on the President. I feel this would be most appropriate and, frankly, easier than holding a 60-minute meeting in the Cabinet Room.

The remainder of the request is consistent with the invitation extended by the President during his June 1982 meeting with President Carstens in Bonn.






