President Carstens will be in Washington on October 5 and 6 during his State Visit this year. I believe it would be most inappropriate for the President not to receive him in some manner during the Washington portion of his visit. The attached Schedule Proposal to Bill Sadleir, therefore, suggests that the President invite President Carstens for a working luncheon -- which would require at most 12 hours of the President's time. Although it would be referred to as a working luncheon, it would be non-substantive to a great extent and relatively non-demanding on the President. I feel this would be most appropriate and, frankly, easier than holding a 60-minute meeting in the Cabinet Room.

The remainder of the request is consistent with the invitation extended by the President during his June 1982 meeting with President Carstens in Bonn.






