Dear Mr. Wiesel:

I have been asked to reply to your telegram to President Reagan of March 5, requesting that he discuss with Chancellor Kohl of the Federal Republic of Germany the issue of possible legal sanctions in the FRG against those who deny publicly that the Holocaust occurred. Unfortunately, your message was received after the President and the Chancellor met on March 5.

Claims that the Holocaust did not take place are of course breathtaking in their disregard for historical fact. I do not regard such claims as helpful to the understanding of contemporary history in either the United States or the Federal Republic, but as far as I am aware, there is no law in the Federal Republic which makes such claims a crime. Whether one should exist is a matter, of course, for the West Germans themselves to decide. I have asked our Embassy in Bonn, however, to follow developments in this regard.


I am enclosing a copy of a self-explanatory letter that I have received from a West German student, currently studying at Southern Connecticut State University which is located in my District.

Dear Mr. Morrison:

I am a student from West Germany, studying at Southern Connecticut State University for one year (fall 1983/spring 1984). I would like to ask you for your advice on an issue which fellow citizens from my home town in West Germany wanted me to help them with (since I'm closer to the Capitol of the U.S. than they are).

When I left Germany, a group in my home town called "Rosstaler Friedensaktion" ("Citizens of Rosstal for Peace") had just collected 1441 signatures (in a town of 7,000) for two letters. Both of those letters, addressed to the then General Secretary of the Communist Party in the Soviet Union Andropov and to President Reagan, contained an identical appeal to both leaders to stop deployment of new weapons and to start substantial arms reduction talks. The letters were sent on September 14, 1983, and as of now there has been no answer from the White House, not even a sign that the letter was received.

Far from assuming that a letter from a small town in West Germany is of any significance for the U.S., I think it would be a matter of friendliness to send at least a statement to West Germany stating that the letter was received at the White House.

The letter from the "Rosstaler Friedensaktion" showed the serious concerns of very many citizens in West Germany and was intended to express the public opinion of a small town to the outside as well as to get discussion going among as many citizens as possible within the town. The members of the "Rosstaler Friedensaktion" put considerable effort both into the letter and the collection of the signatures and are still hoping to get any kind of answer.

I would be very grateful if you could offer me some advice on how to get in touch with somebody in Washington who might be able and willing to send an answer to Rosstal, West Germany.

SUBJECT: Your Meeting with Hans-Jochen Vogel: Wednesday, February 8, 4:15 p.m.

You are scheduled to meet with SPD leader, Hans-Jochen Vogel, at 4:15 p.m. on Wednesday, February 8, in the Situation Room. Vogel will be accompanied by SPD Bundestag deputies Voigt and Stobbe, and SPD staffer Dettke. Vogel's bio is at Tab I.

You will recall that Vogel led the SPD in the March 6 elections in which Kohl was elected Chancellor. Following the election loss, Vogel became chairman of the SPD caucus in the Bundestag, i.e., leader of the Parliamentary party.

Vogel and his traveling party will be making the full rounds in Washington. His schedule includes meetings with the Vice President, Secretary Shultz, Eagleburger, Burt, Nitze, Adelman, Rowny, Perle, Senator Lugar, and an appearance on the "Today Show" and McNeil-Lehrer. He is also meeting with a number of American journalists.

Vogel's visit is part of his effort to maintain contact with the U.S. and other Allies during an intense SPD debate over security policy. With your blessing we have encouraged these contacts and hope your meeting will help demonstrate our determination to keep the lines of communication open. At the same time, it behooves us to express displeasure with certain SPD positions.

In particular, you should, I believe, emphasize U.S. concern about SPD attempts to define alternatives to NATO's deterrence strategy. A party working group has produced a paper, which reportedly is somewhat contradictory and vague. Like others, the SPD favors some undefined increase in NATO's conventional defense, without regard for how it would be funded. You may wish as well to ask Vogel about what appears to be an overall left-wing shift by the SPD. He will undoubtedly underline the SPD's commitment to NATO; you may wish to ask him how the party's posture squares with support for ~~in~~ NATO.

Differing views over the Soviet threat and how to deal with the Soviet Union over the longer term are at the heart of our disagreement with SPD and other Europeans. It would be useful to draw Vogel out on what he sees as the fundamental problems. This would also offer an opportunity for you to expound on the President's constructive and realistic approach to U.S.-Soviet relations.

Time permitting, it would be useful for you to outline U.S. policy in the Middle East and Central America; two areas, as you know, where European views often markedly differ from ours.

You may wish to cite the Vice President's attendance at Wehrkunde as a sign of the seriousness we attach to maintaining a constructive dialogue with Europe. Speaking of Wehrkunde, I will be off on the Vice President's trip and Jack Matlock will sit in on your meeting with Vogel.

Just a short note to let you know what a first-rate memo I thought you wrote on the question of the Greek-Turkish arms balance and its relationship to the legislation designed to lift the embargo.

I was very much influenced by your own analysis of the potential consequences of the language contained in the McGovern amendment and, as a result, suggested we utilize a formula making it clear that "nothing in this section shall prohibit the transfer of arms to Greece or Turkey for legitimate defensive purposes or to fulfill their NATO obligations," which I think should effectively take care of the problem about which you wrote.
